## MAYOR'S REPORT FOR 1920

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To the Ratepayers and Citizens of the Town of Dartmouth  
Ladies and Gentlemen :

I have the honor and pleasure in submitting to you the work of your council for the year ended Dec. 31, 1920.

The various departments have done their duties well and faithfully.

I may say here that the Mayor and Councillors serves the Town without pay.

The building of permanent streets must be taken under serious consideration and advisement.

The town is growing rapidly in population and an increasing supply of water will be required.

Our new Fire Engine is giving good satisfaction. By a vote of the ratepayers in the majority, a motor driven ladder truck will be purchased by the Town, and in the day of a big conflagration you will I hope not regret this expenditure of the Town's money.

The Council during 1920 has given great attention to the extensions of water and sewerage.

The North End Extension supplying 40 or 50 new houses, and opening up new sites for occupation, is worthy of commendation.

By petition from the ratepayers of Rodney Road, this extension was carried out. Other important thoroughfares are being supplied with water and sewerage. All this work is necessary in order to bring in a permanent population.

You may thank the Mayor and Councillors for using their best endeavors with the Government in giving Dartmouth new and up-to-date railway terminals.

The health of the Town has been very good. Dr. Payzant the Health Officer gives his time and best advice in this matter.

The Council in their wisdom thought it wise to appoint a town engineer. Mr. H. E. R. Barnes was appointed and he is unremitting in his toils for the betterment of the Town. The appointment of a Town Engineer lightens the work of our Mr. Nichols, the Superintendent of Streets. Mr. Nichols, during my tenure of office as Mayor, has had the interest of the Town at heart, and has saved the town a good many dollars.

Town Clerk Elliot and his staff have worked faithfully and well and deserves a word of praise.

The Town is growing rapidly and I see honest and effective work on part of the staff.

In closing I thank your Town Council and Officials for their faithful performance of their duties.

During the year a loan to the Dartmouth Amateur Athletic Association was passed for \$3500.00 of which \$2000.00 has been paid over. The balance of \$1500.00 will have to be paid over by the incoming Council. The terms and conditions of the loan are as follows:—

This Indenture made this 28th day of December in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty, Between the Town of Dartmouth, a body corporate, of the one part, and the Dartmouth Amateur Athletic Association, of the other part.

Whereas at a meeting of the Council of the Town of Dartmouth held on Tuesday, the 12th, day of October, A. D., 1920, the following resolution was adopted:—

“Resolved, that the sum of \$3500. be expended on grading and otherwise preparing the Athletic Field and Race Track of the Dartmouth Amateur Athletic Association, and that a rental of one fifth of the principle (\$700.00) plus interest at Bank rate be charged the Dartmouth Amatenr Athletic Association for a period of Five Years.

“And that a Committee consisting of members of the Street Committee co-operate with members of the Club in supervising the work ;

“Further Resolved, that the Town Solicitor be instructed to immediately draw up a Lease incorporating the above arrangement for a Five (5) Year period, and balance of term of Twenty-one (21) Years at a rental of \$1.00 per annum, as verbally agreed by the Council.”

Now this Indenture Witnesseth that the said Town of Dartmouth doth hereby demise and lease unto the said Dartmouth Amateur Athletic Association, all those certain pieces and parcels of land situate in Dartmouth aforesaid bounded and described as follows :



Beginning at a point on the southern side line of Best St. as shown on plan made by J. G. W. Campbell, Provincial Land Surveyor, dated May the first, 1918, said point being situated 37 feet westerly from the centre line of the beaten driveway on Wyse Road; thence westerly along the said southern side line of Best Street 530 feet; thence southerly in a straight line 201 feet more or less to the north western corner of Lot No. 18, as shown on said plan; thence continuing southerly in a straight line 517 feet more or less, passing thru the north eastern corner of Lot No. 1, and continuing to a point 15 feet southerly from the old fence (measured at right angles thereto) dividing the Park School Property from the Park property; thence easterly 320 feet more or less along a line parallel to said old fence to a point 43 feet westerly from the centre line of the beaten driveway on Wyse Road, and thence northerly 660 feet more or less to the place of beginning, together with the appurtenances to the same belonging or appertaining;

To hold for the term of Twenty-one Years from the date hereto; and in accordance with the foregoing Resolution of the Council it is agreed that the sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars shall be expended in grading and otherwise preparing the Athletic Field and Race Track of the Dartmouth Amateur Athletic Association as soon as conveniently may be.

In consideration whereof the said Dartmouth Amateur Athletic Association agrees to pay the Town of Dartmouth a yearly rental of Seven Hundred Dollars, with interest for the same at the same rate as paid by the Town of Dartmouth, for a period of five years from the date hereof, and also to pay a yearly rental of One Dollar per year for the balance of the term of Twenty-one Years.

It is further agreed and understood between the parties hereto that the said Grounds shall be open to the use of the Public School pupils, under supervision satisfactory to the Dartmouth Amateur Athletic Association, on two afternoons per week until six o'clock p. m. and on Saturdays until one o'clock p. m. of each week the particular afternoons of the week to be agreed upon by the Supervisor of Schools and the Executive of the Dartmouth Amateur Athletic Association. This provision is at all times subject to the Grounds being in condition for such use.

In event of a breach of the foregoing terms of this agreement with the Dartmouth Amateur Athletic Association, the same shall then become null and void, and all payments made hereunder shall be forfeited to the Town of Dartmouth.

This Indenture shall be binding on the parties hereto and their heirs, executors, successors and administrators.

Legislation was obtained during the year for the borrowing of \$100,000 for Water and Sewer extensions in the Town. This amount was voted for by the rate-payers, but your Council did not think it wise to issue the Debentures until after the end of the year, when the market would be much better. In the meantime, arrangements were made with the Royal Bank of Canada to carry over-draft for the work done, and this will have to be paid off early next year from the sale of Debentures of the Town of Dartmouth.

Your Committee on Streets and Public Property beg to report as follows:—

Estimated expenditure for the year,.....\$15,400.00

Amount actually expended..... 18,195.03

Amount over expended.... 2,795.03

There has been, I think, more work done on the Streets this year than for the last four or five years and the Steam Roller was in evidence. Considerable attention was paid to the north-end of the Town. Your Council placed the matter of Permanent Streets before the Rate-payers but it was voted down, so with the heavy traffic we have had on our streets the last few years, it is necess-

ary to be continually working on them and during the season it runs into considerable money.

I would refer you to the report of Supt. Nichols hereunder, for the actual work performed.

I beg to report to you the work for the past year 1920.

The force consists of two paid permanent firemen and three voluntary Companies: The Dartmouth Engine Company, Dartmouth Axe & Ladder Company and the Union Protection Company.

The following fire hose was contracted for and paid for during the year:—

A new Motor Driven Ladder Truck with Chemical attachment has been purchased from American La-France Fire Engine Company for the Dartmouth Axe & Ladder Company and will be delivered at Dartmouth about the first of June. The purchase of this machine was approved by a vote of the ratepayers and debentures of the Town will have to be issued to pay for same. The present engine, "Premier" is in first class condition and with the addition of the new ladder truck, the Town will be amply equipped with fire fighting machines. The Union Protection Company's truck is also in good condition.

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### ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CHARITIES COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR 1920.

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#### Poor

The amount estimated for this service was \$4810 and the amount expended is \$3860.42. At the beginning of the year, there were at the County Home, thirteen (13) patients, seven (7) were admitted during the year and three (3) died and five (5) were discharged leaving at the end of the year twelve (12) patients, five (5) males and seven (7) females.

Assistance by paying their board to residents of the Town has been given regularly in the cases of dependent persons. During the year, two (2) new persons were added to the Charities List and one (1) dropped, making a total number at the end of the year of nine (9) persons, an increase of one (1) over last year. The usual assistance has been given to a number of families, in the nature of coal and provisions.

While submitting our report, the Charities Committee wish to express their thanks and appreciation to the Clergy and the organized Charitable Societies of the Town,

for their assistance in investigating conditions and alleviating deserving cases. Their co-operation is largely responsible for this Committee being able to keep well within its estimates.

#### Lunatics.

The amount estimated for this service was \$1700. The amount expended was \$1377.51. On Jan. 1st., 1920, there were at the Nova Scotia Hospital, chargeable to the Town, four (4) patients, all males. During the year, three (3) females were admitted. Four males were admitted, two (2) were discharged and one (1) died, leaving at the close of the year, five (5) male patients and three (3) females patients, an increase of four (4) during the year. The rate of board at the Nova Scotia Hospital is now \$26.00 per patient per month.

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### ANNUAL REPORT OF POLICE AND LICENSE COMMITTEE.

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The amount placed in the estimate for Police service was \$5460.00 and the amount expended was \$5009.00.

The amount estimated for License was \$900.00 and the amount collected \$721.00.

During the year officer Geo. Mayes resigned and R. McDonnell was appointed in his place.

The Chief of police and three officers constituted the force for the year.

That a force of four men is totally inadequate for a Town the size of Dartmouth must be apparent to every thinking person.



It should be borne in mind that the collection of rates and taxes, the distribution of all assessment and tax notices and water and sewer notices, as well as sanitary duty is imposed on your Policemen.

The town has doubled in size within recent years. Another Town has sprung up to the south of us adding greatly to the worth of your Officers.

The net result is that Sanitary inspection, collecting of taxes and other civil duties which is not Police duty at all is crowding out real Police duties.

It seems to your Committee that the time has arrived when your Police Officers should be relieved of all other duties than legitimate Police work.

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**ANNUAL REPORT OF WATER COMMITTEE, 1920**

Your Committee beg to report that the last year has seen considerable activity in the Water and Sewer Department. A large amount of work was completed by the Town workmen in addition to the extensions on Windmill Road, Elmwood Avenue and Hester Street, which was let out by contract to Thomas Lahey; this extension means the supplying of a number of families with Water and Sewerage, which had been earnestly petitioned for. The extension of the Water Main on Rodney Road will also supply a number of houses. Arrangements were made for the laying of a sewer through private property from the foot of Erskine Street to Portland Street in order to relieve the sewer congestion at the lower end of Pleasant Street. Owing to the lateness of the season this work had to be put off until next spring.

The question of a new out-fall Sewer through the property of Messrs. J. P. Mott & Co. to take care of the south end of the Town, was looked into and on account of money market conditions, was deferred. Your Committee recommend that the property owners of Cameron and Harvey Streets, be next year supplied with Water and Sewerage.

Legislation was obtained during the year for the borrowing of One hundred thousand dollars for extension of the Water and Sewer Mains within the Town. Of this amount about Fifty thousand dollars has been expended, which will leave Fifty thousand dollars available for extensions to be made during 1921.

A detailed report of the work actually done will be found on Supt. Nichols report hereunder.

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## REPORT OF HEALTH OFFICER

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Mayor Vidito.

Your Worship:—

The town of Dartmouth during the past year has enjoyed practically a freedom from all infectious diseases.

Every year we have more or less sickness amongst children of early age when milk forms the bulk of their feeding. Great care should be taken to ensure them a pure milk supply. This can be accomplished to a certain extent by inspection of milk. This means the services of someone who will see that the milk is produced under clean conditions by healthy animals marketed in clean containers and tested from time to time for germ and fat contents.

Keeping the individual premises clean is very important. Flies which are very industrious distributors of disease germs have their breeding places in garbage and manure accumulation. A systematic removal of these would tend to reduce largely the fly nuisance.

In order to ensure this the town must institute a twice a week removal as done in other cities. Public dumps should be kept clean of all garbage and confined to ashes and earth devoid of offence. They should be placarded and inspected by a sanitary officer and fines imposed for those guilty of offending (filth being placed there) Cleanliness should be the watchword of 1921.

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**REPORT OF SCHOOL COMMISSIONERS.**

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To the Ratepayers Town of Dartmouth.  
Ladies and Gentlemen:—

I herein submit my report of the Board of School Commissioners for the year 1920.

During the year the grounds of Park, Victoria and Hawthorne Schools were graded at a cost of 3400. Blinds were obtained for Park School. The main halls of Greenvale were sheathed with burlap to replace the paper which had fallen off, and weather strips were attached to the more exposed windows of Hawthorne and Victoria. As the slates were faling off the roof of Park School, the Board dcided an expenditure toward improving the same would be wise so it was attended to. These and other expenses which were unseen at the beginning of the year together with the cost of grading the grounds amounted to \$5623. As the estimates only provided for \$3350 there is a deficit of \$2273.

As Mr. I. W. Moland, who had filled the position of Manuel Training teacher since 1912 resigned at the end of the school year in June the Board thought it wise to close that department at least for the present.

The following teachers Misses Margaret McKenzie, Margaret Dickson, Vera Lownds, Lenora Schurman and Edith Creighton having resigned from the teaching staff their positions were filled by the appointment of Misses Margaret Auld, Effie Silver, Tina McCarthy, Eva Siteman and Mr. G. C. Beazley. While the board deeply regrets the loss of these capable teachers it is glad to have found such efficient successors to take their places.

Although 16 class rooms were added to the schools in 1919 there is need at the present time for much more room. It will be necessary for the incoming Board to consider immediately the building of a new school of about four departments.

In closing I wish to thank my fellow Commissions, the Supervisor, Teachers and other officials connected with the schools, for their hearty co-operation with me at all times.

Sir:—I herein submit my report of the Dartmouth Schools for the year ended July 1920.

The schools were handicapped at the beginning of the year, due to lack of seats. For three months after the opening in August, Classes were held in the Park school for half time only each day. But since the first of December 1919, the work has been carried on in regular time.

Work was also resumed regularly in all the other schools about the same time with the exception of the primaries of Hawthorne and Grenvale. These grades are still working on half time, due to insufficient room.

The work of the year in the several department was quite highly successful, that of the High School department especially so, 34 candidates were successful in obtaining the grade IX certificate. The marks were exceptionally high, one candidate leading the province, while

a second was higher than any other in the County of Halifax.

A very great interest has been taken of late by the pupils of the different schools in all matters pertaining to school life. Already three of the schools Park, Greenvale and Hawthorne have a piano, football and basket-ball outfits. The beginnings of libraries have also been established and all by the efforts of teachers and pupils. These have not cost the Board anything. During the present year Mr. Beazley has organized a cadet corps. The Manual Training room has been converted into a shooting gallery, where all the boys of 14 years or older meet for shooting once each week. Mr. Beazley also takes a very active interest in the physical exercises and sports of all the pupils both boys and girls, with the result that an "Esprit de Corps," unknown previously has been established.

## REPORT OF HOUSING COMMISSION

---

His Worship the Mayor and Town Council.

Gentlemen:—I beg to report on work of the Dartmouth Housing Commission for year ending Dec. 31st. 1920 as follows.

The Town authorised the borrowing of \$100,000.00 from the Government under the Nova Scotia Housing Act. This amount has been loaned with the exception of \$365.00 to twenty eight borrower's on plans and specifications which have been duly approved by our Commission and also by Mr. W. B. McCoy Director of Housing for the province of Nova Scotia.

The amounts of these loans varied from \$2125.00 to \$4500.00 which is the maximum amount as indicated by the Act. About twenty of these houses are completed, the other eight are in various stages of construction, and will no doubt be finished by the first of May 1921.

By the action of the past Council in making the Nova Scotia Housing Act operative in Dartmouth, it has caused modern houses to be built upon 28 vacant lots. It has made an abundance of employment for our building tradesmen and has to a very great extent relieved the Housing conditions in our Town. Judging from the large number of applicants who are contemplating building under this Act should any more funds be granted by the Town Council I feel that a further grant could be loaned in accordance with the Act, and believe it is in the common interest of all the taxpayers that the



Town of Dartmouth make full use of the Nova Scotia Housing Act.

The Commission consisting of Mr. Jas. Redmond, George Mitchell, Albion B. Smith and Mr. R. W. Elliot have given generously of their time.

And to our Secretary Mr. A. Elliot, (Town Clerk) who took such an active interest in our work is due a great deal of the credit for our first years success.

In closing I wish to thank my fellow Commissioners, the Secretary and all the Town Officials who assisted in any way with the work of our Commission.
