WHEREAS by Section 2 of Chapter 56 of the Acts of 1956, an Act relating to the Town of Dartmouth as said Act is amended by Chapter 73 of the Acts of Nova Scotia, 1960, it is enacted among other things, in effect, that the Town of Dartmouth shall have full power and authority to borrow or raise by way of loan from time to time on the credit of the Town each sum or sums as the Council deems necessary provided that the aggregate amount of all borrowings for all such purposes in any one year does not exceed One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) for the purpose of constructing, altering, extending and improving public sewers or drains and water works or water system in the Town, and acquiring or purchasing materials, implements and plant deemed requisite or advisable therefor, or for maintaining such sewers or drains and water works or water system;

"The nature of these construction works is such (mainly alterations and extensions of commercial premises) that I am unable to give assurance to the Town Council that this particular project would be carried out to their and my own satisfaction."

CAPITAL WORKS PROGRAM Report of the Finance and Public Works Committees was read advising that the Committees had considered a program of capital street projects, as requested by Town Council, advising that the original program involved an expenditure of some Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000). Both Committees agreed that this program could only be

carried out by the expenditure of capital monies, which would necessitate the holding of a plebiscite. ### AMALGAMATION

The meeting was called to permit Mayor Akerley to advise Town Council of a discussion held October 3rd with Premier Stanfield regarding amalgamation. Mayor Akerley advised Council of his actual conversation with Premier Stanfield in which the Premier pointed out that the Hayman Report showed that if amalgamation was implemented it would cost the Province of Nova Scotia an additional \$375,000 in order that the County would not suffer any financial loss. The Premier had held a meeting with Warden Leverman on Saturday, October 1st; the Warden advising the Premier that if amalgamation was implemented and County taxes had to be increased, he would be forced to advise his ratepayers that the sole responsibility for this increase was with the Province of Nova Scotia because they permitted amalgamation of a vast area of the County of Halifax with the Town of Dartmouth.

Premier Stanfield did not want this adverse publicity. His government was therefore prepared to make substantial grants to the County of Halifax in order to alleviate this financial loss. He asked that the Town Council consider (1) making a grant to the Municipality of the County of Halifax; (2) that the Town of Dartmouth forego the highways grant offered to the Town by the Minister of Highways in the amount of \$125,000. The Province of Nova Scotia would then make a substantial grant, to the County of Halifax.

After considerable discussion, with all members present taking an active part in the discussion and questions raised being answered by Mayor Akerley and others, it was moved by Councillors Hart and Payzant, and carried unanimously, that Mayor Akerley inform Premier Stanfield that the Town makes no claim for the transitional grant as offered by the Minister of Highways.

Harl Parment WHEREAS by Section 4 of Chapter 66 of the Acts of 1957, an Act relating to the Town of Dartmouth, it is enacted among other things in effect, that the Town of Dartmouth shall have full power and authority to borrow or raise by way of loan from time to time on the credit of the Town such sum or sums not exceeding Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$900,000) as the Council deems necessary, for the purpose of the construction of a transmission water main from Lake Major to connect with the Town water supply system and the buildings and equipment necessary for the operation of the same and also for the purpose of the acquisition of lands, rights and ways necessary for the same;

> AND WHEREAS by said Section 4 it is also enacted in effect that money shall be borrowed under theprovisions of said Section until such proposed borrowing has been approved by the Minister of Municipal Affairs;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of Section 137 of the Towns' Incorporation Act and of a resolution passed by the Town Council on the 5th day of January A.D. 1960, the said Council postponed the issue of debentures and did, with the approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs borrow from the Canadian Bank of Commerce a sum not exceeding One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) for the purpose aforesaid leaving a balance of Seven Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000) of the sum authorized to be borrowed;

AND WHEREAS the Town Council of the Town of Dartmouth deems it-necessary to borrow a sum not exceeding Seven Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000) for the purpose aforesaid;

AND WHEREAS by the Municipal Affairs Act such sum shall in the discretion of the Town Council be borrowed or raised in one sum at one time or in instalments at different times and the sum required shall be borrowed or raised by the issue and sale of debentures of the Town to such an amunt as the Council deems necessary to raise such sum;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to postpone the issue of debentures and to borrow such sum for the purpose aforesaid from the Canadian Bank of Commerce the sum so borrowed to be repaid to said Bank from the proceeds of the debentures when sold;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that under and by virtue of the said the Municipal Affairs Act the Town of Dartmouth do, subject to the approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs, borrow or raise by way of loan on the credit of the Town a sum not exceeding Seven Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000) for the purpose aforesaid;

THAT under and in accordance with said the Municipal Affairs Act such sum be borrowed or raised by the issue and sale of debentures of the Town to such an amount as the Councildeems necessary to raise such sum;

THAT the issue of such debentures be postponed and that the said Town do, under and by virtue of the provisions of Section 137 of the Towns' Incorporation Act and subject to the approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs, borrow a sum of money not exceeding Seven Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000) from the Canadian Bank of Commerce

### SUBMISSION TO THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF DARTMOUTH

Your Worship, Members of Council:

My name is Harold Jackson. I am a lawyer by profession but I am appearing here tonight without retainer in my personal capacity as a resident of the Brightwood area, and I also speak for a large number of residents of Brightwood. In addition I have been asked to make representations on behalf of the Officers of St. Andrews Presbyterian Church. You have previously heard representations from the people living on Albro Lake Road and from Woodland Avenue. You have referred the matter to experts, and you now have certain recommendations. Before those recommendations are acted upon I suggest to you that the people living in the Brightwood area should be heard, even though their voice may be the proverbial voice in the wilderness.

We in the Brightwood area-believe that some of you have made up your minds on this issue. Many of us believe, you had already made up your minds before this report was received. It is with the knowledge that some of you have probably made up your minds in favour of such a highway that we come to you tonight to make a last ditch stand against this highway splitting destroying and disrupting the Brightwood area.

With your permission, Your Worship, I wish to deal with the reasons put forth by various people, and including your experts, for the erection of this super highway through the Brightwood Arca.

But before dealing with these various matters I wish to record tonight one of the immediate effects of such a highway. I would point out to Your Worship that the Brightwood area and the area immediately concerned with this new highway is peopled, to a very large extent, by veterans of the Second World War. I would point out to Your Worship that these veterans established themselves, and their homes, in your midst, converting what was a rough and almost virgin area into what is now one of the best residential districts of the Town of Dartmouth. I would point out to Your Worship that this conversion was the result of years of work and toil and sweat, the result of great expense and of great sacrifice on the part of these veterans. I realize that many of you may be well aware of this fact, but I also wish to point out that the area to be disrupted was the first area. in this Town to be zoned R/1 and that these veterans, acting on the principal that the area would remain a residential zone, continued to expend money and sweat and for years have improved and build up this area in the belief, and in the faith, of the Town of Dartmouth, and of the Mayor and of the Councillors of the Town of Dartmouth, and in the belief that they would not be let down. I need not point out to Your Worship that these veterans are now too old to purchase properties in new subdivisions and devote another ten years to landscaping, gardening and moving boulders by the sweat of their brows. May I point out to Your Worship that there are those of us, and I

g disabilities recursed repeat, there are those of us who bear wounds, in the battlefields of Europe and in the skies over Europe, and these disabilities will follow us to our graves, and we, with these disabilities, and at our ages, cannot easily pick up our roots and start elsewhere. , And I would point out that we will have little alternative but to go elsewhere if massed traffic is directed past our door at the rate of several hundred vehicles per hour. I would point out that in the present situation we have had our difficulties with traffic and with our children being andangered by such traffic. Therefore, your Worship, and members of Council, I submit to you at the risk of your wrath, that you are breaking faith with these veterans who established them selves in your Town at the end of the Second World War when you build a highway through their midst or allow such a highway to be built when there is an alternative method at your disposal.

We realize that alternate plans are-suggested. We realize that one will take rather a large number of homes and that the other, the modified plan, will ruin them. We say ruin because they will no longer be the homes which we have known. It is with this foremost in our minds that we come before you tonight to lay squarely before you the effects of s uper highway running from the Bridge through the Brightwood residential area into the County of Halifax.

Now the report is, in essence, little more than a study to analize the connections of the Circumfrential Highway for

the purpose of determining the most economical and advantageous route from a traffic engineering and planning point of view. The report admits that human values are at stake, but it is clear that these human values have come out second best. I wish to point out that the human values at stake, if this new super highway crosses the Brightwood area, may well include human life. The new proposed highway will, in effect, split the Town or the future City of Dartmouth, in two. The new High School just completed is so situated that a large number of the students in the Town of Dartmouth will have to cross this super highway to get access to it. Similarly, the Bicentennial high school is so situated that a large number of students attending it will also have to cross this highway. And there is the Park School situated in the same way as the two schools just mentioned. There will be five year old children who will have to cross this superway if they are to reach that school.

Now I propose to deal briefly with certain of the recommendations found in this report. It is explained that such routes as Albro Lake and Woodland Avenue had been bypassed as suitable exits from the Bridge as both streets had only 36 feet of clearance and would have to be widened considerably. It is stated that due to construction costs the modified plan although utilizing existing streets could be adopted, and that/School Street and Gladstone Avenue are lined with residences the 60 foot right-of-way found on these streets is sufficient for a directional roadway 44 feet in widht. For the information of

of all concered Gladstone Avenue has a width of 50 feet only and not 60 feet. One would expect that experts charging \$6,000.00 for their report, would have correct the width of the streets over which they would route 1200 cars per hour. Reference is made to a 44 foot roadway. If we add to this 7 inches on either side for a curb we are using and utilizing between 45 and 46 feet of the 50 foot right-of-way. In other words there would be less than  $2\frac{1}{2}$  feet on either side of Gladstone Avenue for a sidewalk, a large part of which would be overhung by large trucks and transports. I ask where in this scheme of thingshuman values have been placed.

Carrying this matter further, the pavement on Gladstone Avenue is approximately 29 feet 6 inches in width. The curbs and gutters have been erected, the sidewalks have been placed and the area between the curb and the sidewalk has been grassed, largely at the expense of the individual owners. The situation is similar on School Street. Let us for a moment refer to Woodland Avenue. Woodland Avenue has no curb and gutter, no sidewalk, and there is nothing to prevent the making of a street much greater in width than can ever be made through Gladstone Avenue, and indeed Woodland Avenue can be made just as wide, if not wider than School Street. Woodland Avenue has a width of 60 feet which is 10 feet wider than Gladstone Avenue, and Albro Lake Road has a statutory width of 66 feet.

Now let us for a moment recall that the report visualizes 44 feet of traffic flowing up Gladstone Avenue and down School

Street. In other words, the report visualizes two lanes of traffic each way. Have not every one of you at some time used a funnel. Have you not found that you could pour a liquid in large quantities into the mouth of the funnel. But\_did you not also find that the funnel had a spout, and the rate at which you could pour your liquid through the funnel depended upon the diameter of the spout. I suggest, Your Worship, that that is the situation which our experts are creating. I suggest that the two lane highways are the mouth of the funnel, and the Bridge is the spout, and the spout has but one lane of traffic each way. I suggest that the answer is not to carry greater numbers of cars to the end of the Bridge as that Bridge has already reached 87% of its practical capacity even after the street capacities equal or axceed the Bridge capacity. I ask you, Your Worship, what is to be gained by carrying greater and greater numbers of vehicles to a Bridge which is already loaded almost to its present practical capacity. I suggest, Your Worship, that you are enlarging the mouth of the funnel but you are not enlarging the spout.

Now I believe it is relevant, Your Worship, to mentioned the fact that 7% of the traffic from the Bridge goes to the Tufts Cover Albro Lake area. 13% goes to the Eastern suburbs. Another 13% goes to the Southern suburbs. 7% goes to Bedford and 12% goes beyond Westphal and Cole Harbour with the remaining 3% going to Imperoyal. Now if we note that 45% of the traffic will not utilize the new highway as it isheaded to the North

and south of Nantucket Avenue, we have left to analize the 55% which could use the new highway. And I would point out that the report seems to assume that this 55% will travel from some point in Halifax direct to a destination. When I was questioned by the men conducting the survey at the Bridge Plaza I was asked my destination. But I did not go direct home. I went down town to attend to some shopping. We have no information as to what percentage of this 55% will continue to go down town to do shopping before going to this destination, in which event many will reach their destination via existing streets. I venture to suggest that from the down town merchants point of view they are hoping there will be a large percentage who will go down town shopping before reaching their destinations. But if we assume, as the report seems to, that everybody goes straight home from work, we find in effect that the Town of Dartmouth has for consideration the fact that 55% of the traffic utilizing the Bridge could use the new highway. Now the report states that if this traffic was routed out the Albro Lake Road, that it would take care of 25% of this traffic. If, on the other hand, a highway is built through Brightwood, at great expense, and with all the human values which I have mentioned completely disregarded, we find that the Town is faced with a traffic problem 15% greater, that is 40% rather than 25%.

Now speaking of this 15%, Your Worship, it is, as already noted, subject to this that everyone goes direct from Halifax to his home. For every car which goes down town shopping this percentage of 15% is reduced. I submit, Your Worship, that the Brightwood residential area, the Brightwood Golf Course and the hopes and homes of all those living in the Brightwood area should not be sacrificed for the sake of a mere 15% of the traffic which crosses the Halifax to Dartmouth Bridge. And Your Worship knows and the report recognizes that it is the Westphal and Cole Harbour area which is developing more quickly than any other area, and that as time goes by the percentages referred to above will become even more favourable to the Albro Lake Road.

If the suggested route through Brightwood was the ultimate and the complete solution to our traffic problems the proposal would be worthy of greater consideration. On the contrary the report shows that any solution at this time is nothing more or less than a stopgap. The report states at page 30:

"Even with the approach improvements recommended for Halifax and the recommended connection between the bridge plaza and the Dartmouth Circumferential Highway recommended in this report, bridge users will be subject to increasing delay because practical peak hour capacity will be exceeded on weekdays during the three summer months in the year 1962 or 1963, assuming the present traffic growth rate on the bridge is continued for three more years. In subsequent years, traffic congestion will be common during longer periods of the day in the summer months and will extend into the fall and winter."

It is clear that a second bridge is required. It is equally clear that the present bridge should be nothing more than a Town Bridge, and that the new bridge should be the bridge

to carry the bulk of the traffic passing from the City of Halifax beyond the Town of Dartmouth. Are we then, Your Worship, to sacrifice the Brightwood residential area, and the Brightwood Golf Course, merely as a stopgap measure, or are we to preserve what an editorial in the Mail-Star of Thursday, October 27th, 1960, calls "A Magnificant Recreational Asset". And for the benefit of any of those who may have been mislead by talk of adding to the Golf Course the property lying immediately to the northeast, I would point out that this property is not for sale. I repeat, I am the custodian of this property, and it is not for sale.

I submit, Your Worship, that it is time for us to show foresight and not hindsight. I submit that the traffic should be routed north on Wyse Road, not necessarily up Woodland Avenue as I am adverse to sacrificing any modern residential area for the sake of a little traffic - but I suggest that Woodland Avenue is much more appropriate for mass traffic than Gladstone Avenue -I suggest the traffic should be routed north on Wyse Road. From Wyse Road it could proceed to Chappell Street and along Chappell Street (which has only three blocks of temporary houses) and along an undeveloped area to the Circumferential Highway. Or alternatively it could continue along Wyse Road to Albro Lake Road which has a 66 foot right-of-way, or even beyond Albro Lake Road into the scantily developed area lying to the north of Albro Lake Road, and continue through the woods to the Circumferential Highway. There is ample space in the wooded area beyond Albro Lake Road to avoid a right angle turn. It is true that any of these suggestions may be stopgap measures only, but so also is the recommendation put forth by Whitman-Benn & Associates who state that even if their recommendations are carried out Bridge users will be subject to increasing delay, and within two or three years traffic congestion will be common during longer periods of the day, and will extend into the fall and winter. We therefore suggest that since any measure is a stopgap measure only, the one which will ruin the Brightwood Golf Course and the Brightwood residential area should not be the one you select. We submit you should preserve our Golf Course and our residential area rather than sacrifice them for not more than 15% of the Bridge traffic, a large percentage of which is proceeding out of Town.

Now, Your Worship, I do not purport to be any authority on traffic. In making my statements I have accepted the report at face value. The report is a recommendation to the Town on the highway which will carry the greatest number of vehicles from the Bridge to the Town limits in the shortest space of time. I submit that there are greater considerations, greater values, than the number of vehicles which can be carried by the most direct route from the Bridge to the Circumferential Highway. I submit that the majority of these vehicles will in no way benefit the Town of Dartmouth. I submit that a highway from the Town boundary to the Bridge will funnel a large percentage of that 55% of traffic which goes beyond the old Town boundary directly into the City of Halifax, and that the City of Halifax will reap any benefits to be derived in the way of purchases of goods and commodi-It is no secret, Your Worship, that certain people in ties. Halifax are delighted with the proposal whereby a large percentage of the people who might otherwise shop in Dartmouth are to be

speeded into the heart of the City of Halifax.

We are told that if the modified plan is accepted, in addition to the traffic which would cross Brightwood to the Bridge, some 4,000 vehicles per day, and many of them would be trucks, would disburse at Slayter Street and Victoria Road. I ask you all to picture a residential area, with 50 and 60 foot streets, accomodating, not only the 7500 vehicles which it is anticipated will travel to the Bridge, but an additional 4,000 vehicles which will go north and south from Slayter Street and Victoria Road.

Your Worship will recall that two months ago the residents of Brightwood, some 225 in number, filed a petition with the Town Clerk of Dartmouth requesting that this road not cross the Brightwood area. It is submitted that the wishes of these 225 people are worthy of your consideration. Your Worship and Council cannot be unmindful of the other groups and organizations who have formally requested that this road bypass the Brightwood residential area and the Brightwood Golf Course.

In conclusion Your Worship the people of the Brightwood area represented by me tonight and the officers and congregation of St. Andrews Presbyterian Church appeals to you and to Council to locate or, alternatively, to recommend to the Province that the new highway be located, outside the Brightwood area, perhaps in one of the areas already suggested. We include in our reasons the following:

1. Brightwood was the original R/l area of Dartmouth and was built up and developed to its present state largely on the strength of its R/l residential zoning. A super highway through its midst will alter all this.

2. The Brightwood Golf Course will be saved.

3. The future City of Dartmouth will not be cut in two.

4. There is only a 13% increase in traffic available on the present bridge. 25% of the present traffic will flow out the Albro Lake Road, or some other road in that area. Consequently, with maximum traffic, the present situation can be substantially improved by the suggested route, even when, and if, maximum bridge capacity is reached.

5. The High School, Bicentennial Junior High School and the Park School will not be directly affected.

-6. The expense will be greatly lessened.

7. It is not practical to route traffic by the modified plan over a 50 foot street.

8. The wishes of 225 people in the Brightwood area are worthy of your consideration and the human values in issue far outweigh the advantages from a traffic engineering and planning point of view.

9. The adoption of the present report in all its phases is a measure giving temporary relief only, and almost the same relief can be gained by less drastic measures.

10. The congregation of St. Andrews Presbyterian Church recently built a modern church on School Street. If the modified plan is adopted, which will send massed traffic along School Street, a traffic hazard of the highest order will be created. Approximately 225 children attend Sunday-School. These children are in the majority between 3 and 12 years of age. I would also point out that Church activities throughout the week require a large percentage of these children to attend the Church during the afternoon and evening of at least one day each week. There is Mission Band from 3:30 to 4:30 on Munday afternoon. There are the Cubs, who go during the evening, and there is the Junior Choir in addition to all the other activities of the Church. It is submitted that if traffic at the rate of many thousands of cars a day is routed down School Street that, in addition to the traffic hazard, normal Church activities will be seriously interfered with, and we have here human values which know no higher order.

11. The Town will lose large revenues the result of depreciation in values\_of the Brightwood properties, and will lose substantially all the potential revenue from the Ives Subdivision which has 73 potential lots, and a probable future assessment when developed of one million dollars.

12. Most houses on Albro Lake Road have been built since 1954. The By-Laws of the County of Halifax as published in 1954 require houses to be 63 feet from the centre line of any public way. This makes a distance of 126 feet between houses. Houses on Gladstone Avenue are built 20 feet from the street line (excepting those only 15 feet back on the corners) and there is therefore only 90 feet between houses as compared to 126 feet. On the corners the houses are 80 feet apart as compared with 126 feet.

REPORTS RE IMMEDIATE REQUIREMENTS Several reports, as prepared by Mr. Plunkett, dealing with immediate requirements for amalgamation, were submitted to each member of Council and were reviewed in detail. Copies of these reports are on file in the Clerk's office.

PLRSONNEL RECRUITMENT PROGRAM Report No. 1 outlines the personnel recruitment program and first pointed out that some consideration must be given to the adequacy of existing personnel policies, particularly in the matter of fringe benefits. It was recommended that the Town give immediate consideration to the instituting, as soon as possible, of a contributory pension plan and medical and welfare plan. Mayor Akerley reviewed the present position of the Town regarding these matters and informed the Council that the Clerk is presently obtaining information on these matters and that the matter has been under consideration by the Civic Workers Union and Town officials over the past year.

Each department, as reported on by Mr. Plunkett, was dealt with.

TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE. First to be considered was the report on the Town Clerk's office. Mr. Plunkett recommended that the following personnel be employed immediately (1) an accountant (2) purchasing agent and personnel officer (3) one machine operator and (4) one stenographer. It was unanimously agreed that Mr. Plunkett's report on this department be approved. POLICE & FIRE DEPARTMENTS

Police and Fire Departments. The following recommendations regarding these departments were approved: (1) extension of the present Fire Hall to provide adequate quarters for the Police Department; (2) hiring 8 additional police constables; in addition the post of Staff Sergeant be created; (3) the post of Captain of the Fire Department be established and 4 additional firemen be engaged immediately. The possible integration of these two departments was introduced. The Chairman and members of the Safety Committee advised that thought was presently being given to this matter by the members of that Committee. Mr. . Plunkett and Council members discussed this matter at length with various areas of integration being reviewed. There was no definite action taken on integration except that recommended in the report. It was suggested that this item replace Item 2, as reported by Mr. Plunkett. -4- November 18, 1960 Mr. Plunkett's report re aerial survey was considered. He pointed out that this report is urgently required if proper planning of municipal services is to be undertaken. He further pointed out that this plan would be beneficial to the Engineering Department, Planning Engineer and the Assessor. He recommended that consideration be given to obtaining an aerial plan at an early date. This recommendation was approved and it was suggested that specifications be prepared for calling tenders on an aerial survey and that this aerial survey be conducted in co-operation with other government bodies or by the Town itself.
