Copies of written objection to the proposed % ning By-Law amendment, as submitted by G.R.A. Brushett had been circulated to each member of Council. It was moved by Aldermen Wise and Hollis and carried that the proposed Zoning By-Law amendment as annexed be adopted and submitted to the Minister of Municipal Affairs for his approval. Voting for: Aldermen King, Zatzman, Gurholt, Hollis, Dares, MacNeil, Stubbs, Wise, and Moore. Voting against: Aldermen Thornhill, Crook, Beazley, Sanford, and Harris. Mayor Akerley declared the motion carried.

Consideration was given to proposed amendment to City of Dartmouth Zoning By-Law No. 74 which would rezone an area of approximately 770 acres in the Burnside area to "General Industrial" Zone I-1-B Zone. Copies of petition signed by fortyeight residents of the Burnside area objecting to

proposed rezoning of this area were circulated to each member of City Council for information. It was moved by Aldermen Sanford and Beazley and carried that a spokesman for the group, Mr. O'Brien, be heard. Mr. O'Brien addressed the Council briefly on this matter. After some discussion, it was moved by Aldermen Hollis and Harris and carried that the proposed Zoning By-Law amendment be adopted and submitted to the Minister of Municipal Affairs for his approval. Alderman Sanford voting against. It was moved by Aldermen Hollis and Wise and carried that Minutes of the April 27th, 39th; May 1st, 8th, and 23rd meetings of City Council, copies of which had been circulated to members of Council, be approved.

LAND FOR SCHOOL, BRULE STREET AREA.

Leaman Limited at a price of \$7,500. per acre; this land being required for the constructition of a school in the Brule Street area. It was moved by Aldermen MacNeil and Wise that the recommendation of the Finance and Executive Committee be adopted. Aldermen Zatzman and Beazley moved in amendment that the recommendation of the Finance and Executive Committee be deferred and that the CLirk-administrator be instructed to ascertain as to the availability of a portion of the Department

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of National Defence property in the area which could be used for School construction. After some debate, the amendment was put. Plan of the land in question was examined by members of Council.

Industrial. The land to be rezoned is shown on an attached plan.







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WHEREAS by Section 5 of Chapter 186 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia 1954, the Municipal Affairs Act, it is enacted among other things, in effect, that subject to the provisions of Section 8 of said Act every City other than the City of Halifax shall have full power and authority to borrow or raise byway of loan from time to time on the credit of the City such sum or sums as the Council thereof deems necessary for the purpose of erecting, acquiring, purchasing, altering, adding to, improving, furnishing or equipping buildings for schools, garages and other buildings for school purposes and acquiring or purchasing or improving land for such buildings;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> by Section 8 of said the Minisipal Affairs Act, it is enacted among other things, in effect, that no money shall be borrowed under the provisions of the said Act until such proposed borrowing has been approved by the Minister of Municipal Affairs;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> the City Council of the City of Dartmouth deems it necessary to borrow a sum not exceeding Five Hundred and Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$575,000) for the purpose of erecting, furnishing and equipping buildings for a twenty-room school at Brule Street in the said City, and acquiring or purchasing or improving land for such buildings;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> by the Municipal Affairs Act such sum shall in the discretion of the City Council be borrowed or raised in one sum at one time or in instalments at different times and the sum required shall be borrowed or raised by the issue and sale of debentures of the City to such an amount as the Council thereof deems necessary to raise such sum;




