The Solicitor advised that although the final occupancy of premises differs from the intended occupancy as expressed verbally to the Building Inspector it does not differ from the application for permit. He therefore advises that no action can be taken in this case. In order to prevent a repetition the Solicitor recommended the following:

(a) Question 6 on the application for permit for alteration should be changed to read:

Building
Permits

"How will building be occupied when alterations are completed? No. of families"

(b) The Building By-laws provide for occupancy permits. It has not been necessary in the past to invoke this Article of the Building Code. With the growth of the Town I suggest that the time has come when such permits should be required before a new or reconstructed building can be occupied.

(c) No fees are charged at the present time for building permits. This matter has been discussed by the Town Planning Board, but I suggest that it is more a matter for the Finance Committee of the Town and might well be referred to that Committee with a view to establishing a scale of fees.

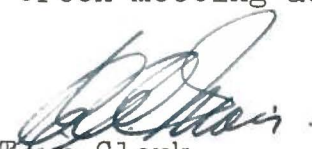
