## CHAIRMAN OF FIREWARDS REPORT.

*To the Board of Firewardens of the City of Halifax:*

GENTLEMEN,—I beg leave to submit to you for your information, my report as Chairman of your Board for the year ending April 30th, 1889, but in doing so I cannot refrain from referring to the sad circumstance which placed me in said position; that is the loss which the Fire Department has sustained by the death of our late Chairman, Ex-Alderman John Ead. I need not remind you gentlemen of the long and faithful services rendered to the Fire Department of this city by our late lamented Chairman; ever ready in the hour of danger, and always willing to give counsel and advice when needed. The great loss we have sustained will take a long time to repair.

In submitting this my first report, I can but place before you a detailed statement of the Department as I have found it upon my elevation to the position of Chairman, a short time ago.

I submit for your consideration the report of Mr. A. G. Macdonald, City Electrician, also that of Mr. John T. Murphy, Head Keeper of City Engine Houses.

I would call your attention to the recommendations of the former, and feeling that the same are of great importance to our alarm system, I would request that you give them your careful consideration.

The four Steam Fire Engines now in the Department I have to report three in first class order, and one under repair. I have to congratulate you, and the Department in general, upon the valuable addition to our apparatus during the last year, namely: our new Steam Fire Engine No. 4, which I hope will give the satisfaction looked for, and thereby repay the outlay incurred in her purchase.



In closing, gentlemen, I have to thank you sincerely for the confidence placed in me at your last meeting, in elevating me to the head of the Fire Department; a Department I have so long been attached to and so heartily interested in, and I can but hope that the pleasant feeling at present existing between me and yourselves may long continue.

*Chairman Board of Firewards:*

SIR,—It will be remembered by your Board that in my last year's report I recommended the purchase of three miles of insulated wire; in order the better to fortify our Alarm System against the unavoidable encroachments of two Electric Light Companies and a Telephone Company, operating within the city. This recommendation has, however, not been carried out.

I beg leave now earnestly to ask the attention of the Board to changes in the wiring of the city that have become essential, as well from the crowded state of the streets as from natural decay and other causes.

I find that a separate line of poles is impracticable, owing to the crowded state of matters already referred to; and with a view to the public safety, I went carefully over the work required to be done, with two practical and experienced men, and estimated the work required to be performed, including materials and extensions to Willow Park and Coburg Road, at five hundred and eighty-six dollars.

Advantageous arrangements are at our disposal, both with the Western Union and Telephone Companies, for positions of safety on their poles, the acceptance of which I would strongly recommend.

## CITY PRISON REPORT.

HALIFAX, April 30th, 1889.

*The Chairman and Members of City Prison Committee :*

GENTLEMEN,—

I have the honor to submit herewith, for the information of the City Council and the Public, the tables relating to the City Prison for the twelve months ending this day. The tables are of the customary kind, and show—

- 1.—The number of prisoners of both sexes, and offences for which imprisoned.
- 2.—The nature and estimated value of work performed.
- 3.—The daily and yearly cost of maintenance of each prisoner.
- 4.—The quantity and estimated value of materials in and about the prison.
- 5.—The number and estimated value of horses, carts, &c.
- 6.—The number and estimated value of farming implements, &c.
- 7.—The number and estimated value of stone shed implements, &c.
- 8.—The estimated value of tools and materials in workshops.
- 9.—The quantity and value of farm produce raised and consumed.

Table No. 1 shows that there were 201 prisoners admitted, being 20 more than the previous year. The increase in the number committed for drunkenness was 26.

Table No. 2 shows that the earnings were \$3972.08, being \$687.98 more than the previous year.

Table No. 3 remains the same, the cost of maintenance being about as low as is necessary.

Table No. 4 shows an increase in quantity and value, the difference being about \$160.00.

Table No. 5 also shows a slight increase, and there is a similar change in Table No. 6.

Table No. 7 shows a decrease of about \$360.00, the amount of broken stone on hand being considerably less, accounted for by increased sales and City consumption.

Table No. 8 shows a slight increase, by an addition of tools to the blacksmith's shop.

Table No. 9 shows a decrease, a smaller quantity of potatoes having been secured in good order.

These tables will, I trust, be found satisfactory, and furnish desired information.

My previous reports have made the Council acquainted with the requirements of the Prison, and I need not recapitulate at this time.

With my own and Mrs. Murray's thanks to the City Council and the Committee for past courtesies.

*To His Worship the Mayor and City Council:*

GENTLEMEN,—I have the honour to submit to the City Council a report of the number of cases, including writs issued and settled, which have been before the Police Court, from 1st May 1888, to 30th April 1889, together with a memorandum of Fines imposed and Fines or Fees received. Also the amount of Fees received in City Court during that period.

I would respectfully suggest that some amendment be made to the Bye-Laws in reference to Tax on Dogs, the sum collected from that source being exceedingly small.

I would also suggest that a Bye-Law in reference to Hawkers and Pedlers be passed, a very large revenue could be obtained from that source, more especially at the time of any "Public Exhibition."

The income from Fines and Fees has again fallen short of the estimate, owing in a large measure to the Fines imposed on Pedlers for violation of the License Law of 1886, going into the License Fund. Annexed hereto is the statement of Fines imposed and amount collected under "the License Law."

**HALIFAX POORS' ASYLUM.**

30TH APRIL, 1889.

*To the Chairman and Members of the Charities Committee:*

GENTLEMEN,—In accordance with former usage, I hereby submit for the information of His Worship the Mayor, and the City Council, the third annual report of the Halifax Poors' Asylum.

There were 272 in the Institution at the beginning of the year, 143 men, 121 women and 8 children. The largest number in the house at one time was 344, in February, the smallest number was 255 in August. The number supported during the whole or part of the year was 540.

The inmates have been employed at general house-work, and have made 1515 new articles, and repaired 8776. Among the improvements completed during the year, to add to the comfort, convenience and safekeeping of the insane, stairways have been built connecting each of the wards with the airing courts. There have been over 40 of these unfortunate people transferred from the Hospital for Insane, to this Institution, since this building was opened, beside a number that were here before. The maintenance of this class of people here is an annual saving to the city of a large amount. A. C. Page, M. D., of Truro, has visited this Asylum officially, without notice, at different times whose report no doubt you have read. The making of concrete blocks for Sewers is still continued, having earned some \$800.00 during the year, and preparations are being made for much larger turn-out than has been done heretofore.

The grounds in front of the building, have been improved by greenswards and set with evergreens and other trees. Farm Produce 290 bus. potatoes, 210 bus. turnips, 195 bus. mangels, 10 tons hay, 11800 quarts milk, 5397 lbs. Pork.

Enclosed is the name, age, religion, birth-place, and number of days of each inmate, from 1st May, 1888, to 30th April, 1889.

The Superintendent and Matron, take this opportunity to thank you for your council and hearty co-operation in the management of the Institution.

### REPORT OF DR. A. C. PAGE.

---

Throughout this extensive establishment on every hand is evidence of good management.

There are about a hundred insane, with about an equal number of each sex. Cleanliness and good order prevail.

During my visit the Matron was distributing apples and oranges among the old men, the gift of one of the many benevolent ladies of Halifax.

Some of the insane were "discharged cured" the last year, but to offset such good fortune, some of those admitted as paupers have become insane.

Excepting the Hospital at Dartmouth, the insane get no better care anywhere than at the Halifax City Asylum and Poor House.
