Report of Inspectors Rockhead Prison.

We the undersigned Committee appointed to inspect the City Prison, beg to report that we found everything in a satisfactory condition.

There are at this date 23 males and 12 female prisoners. Our attention was called to some small repairs needed, viz:—new treads on the stairs in main hall, new floors for stalls in stable and new stall for horse at present kept in Coach house, which could be built in present stable. The work could be done by the Governor of the Prison, with the assistance of some of the people about him, if he was supplied with the necessary lumber. In addition to these repairs we found some of the sashes in the main building, facing north, had rotted and needed renewing; we also noticed some portions of the floor in main building in bad order and needing repairs.

We find in the records kept by Governor Murray, taking the first two months and the last two months of the present year that the City Medical Officer visited the Prison as follows:—During the month of January, seven times; in February, ten times; in November, seven times, and in December, to date, six times.

REPORT SUPERINTENDENT POORS' ASYLUM.

HALIFAX POORS' ASYLUM,

30th April, 1891.

GENTLEMEN,—I hereby submit for the information of His Worship the Mayor and City Council, the fifth Annual Report of the Halifax Pools' Asylum.

There were 286 inmates in the institution at the beginning of the year, 155 men and 124 women and 7 children.

The smallest number in the house at one time during the year, was 278 on the 7th of September, and the largest number was 344 on the 18th February,

There were 314 persons admitted during the year, and 31 born in the house.

The number supported during the whole or part of the year was 631.

The inmates have been employed as usual at the general house work, and have made and repaired all the shoes and clothing for the institution.

The institution has also earned \$1200.90 in making Concrete for the City Board of Works.

Enclosed is the name, age, religion, birth-place, and number of days of each inmate from 1st May, 1890, to April 30th, 1891.

With the Superintendent and Matrons thanks for past counsel and courtesies.

SANITARY INSPECTOR'S REPORT.

OFFICE OF SANITARY INSPECTOR,

The Chairman and Members of the City Health Board :

GENTLEMEN,—I beg respectfully to submit for the information of your Board the following condensed summary of the work performed in this department during the civic year ending 30th April, 1891.

The house to house inspection began on Monday the 4th of May last and was continued by Wards till the entire City was covered.

A systematic inspection has been kept up subsequently to the regular house to house inspection in the various streets, parts of streets and lanes which frequently lapse into an insanitary condition.

The number of such inspections were 3,572, of which 766 were found to be in a bad sanitary condition, and written notices were served on the respective owners or their agents. Of course in every case where notices were served the premises had to be revisited to see that orders were obeyed.

Besides the above work it was necessary to make frequent visits to all the slaughter-houses (7) to see that they and the premises attached to them were kept in a fairly decent condition. The same remark applies to the various fish, meat and country markets.

Meat condemned as unfit for human food 42 carcasses of mutton, 2 barrels of beef and one barrel of pork.

The number of persons reported to the City Health Board for neglect to comply with written notices served upon them was 103.

The number of persons summoned before the Police Court for violation of the General Health Act was 28. With very few exceptions the persons summoned were either convicted and paid fines or paid costs and arranged with the Court to have the defects remedied immediately, which arrangements were duly carried out.

The number of permits issued from this office to remove the contents of privy vaults and cesspools during the year were 1,535.

The number of loads of night soil removed were 2,678.

The number of inspections made of the drainage and plumbing work of infected houses, as directed by the resolution of your Board, bearing date of August 10th, were 109. In nearly every case defects were found in the plumbing or the drainage. The defects were pointed out in the written notices served, and in almost every instance they were promptly remedied.

The number of houses, the drainage and plumbing of which were examined by request of the occupants was ten. Where defects were discovered the responsible parties were notified, and the proper remedies were applied.

Certainly the above summary does not fully show all the work that was done by the officers of this department during the year, as the serving of notices, and in all cases which were found bad, repeated reinspections consumed much time.
