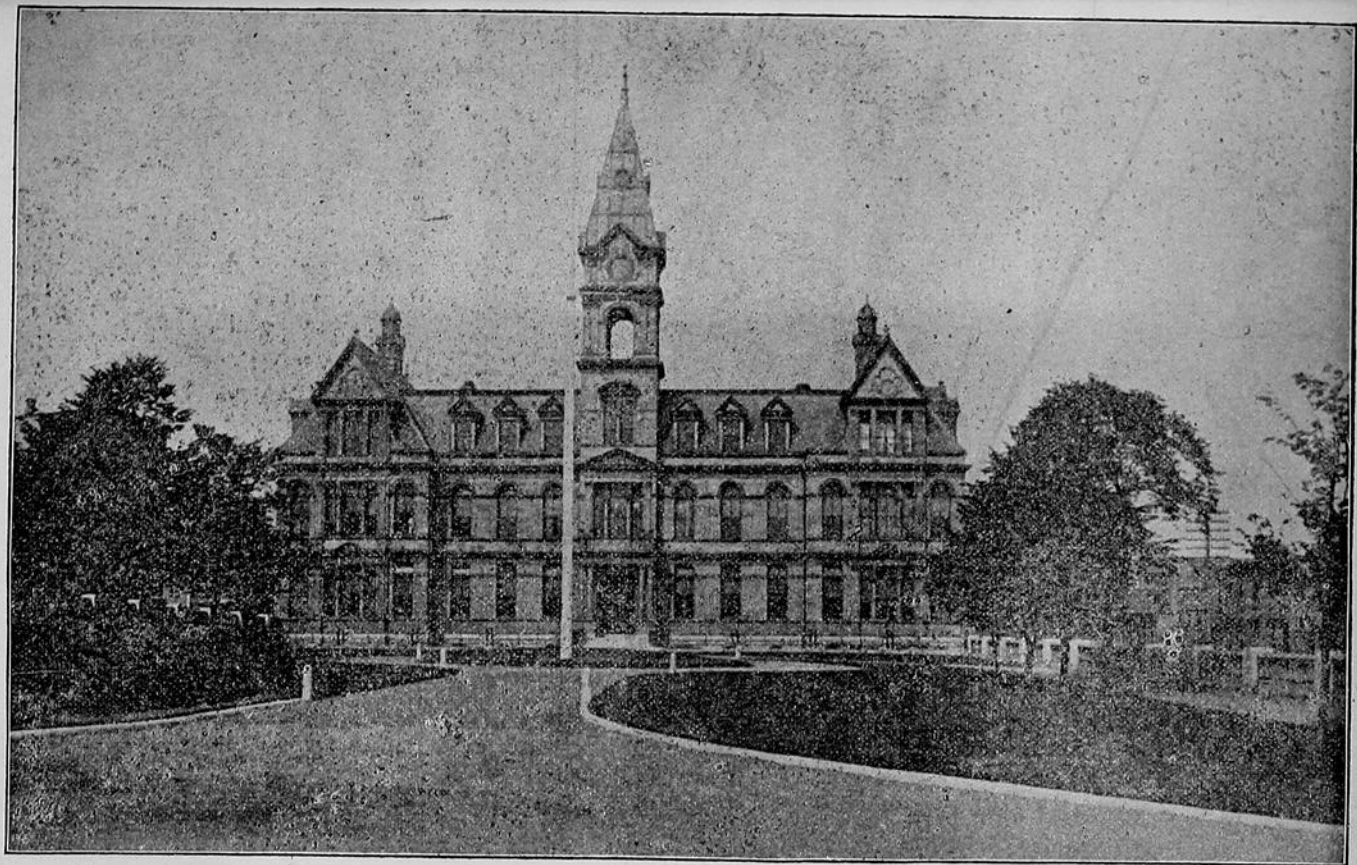

## CITY AUDITOR'S REPORT.

OFFICE OF CITY AUDITOR,

HALIFAX, 6th August, 1892.

*Sir:—*

I have the honor to present to your Worship and the City Council, a report upon the financial affairs of the city for the civic year ending 30th April, 1892.

At the date of my annual report for the year ending 30th April, 1891, the total funded debt of the city was \$2,153,478. This amount included, as was then stated, the whole of our funded liabilities, for general purposes, the water department and the public schools. During the civic year just closed additions were made to the extent of \$145,100, namely, for sewerage, under Act 15 April, 1890, \$80,000; paving and sidewalks, Act 15 April, 1890, \$35,000; water supply, \$15,000; half subsidy to dry dock, \$5000; land on Maynard and West streets, Act 19 May 1891, \$4500; the City Hall \$2500; purchase of horses and carts \$3100; schools, \$1556. The total amount of our civic debt on 30th April, 1892, was \$2,300,134, divided thus: for general purposes \$1,240,528, for the water department \$826,906, and for schools \$232,700.

While the progress of needed improvements has been attended with the inevitable enlargement of our funded debt, it is some satisfaction to know that during the past few years some considerable saving has been effected in the item of annual interest. Immediately after the passing of the Act for consolidation (1880) steps were taken to con-

vert all city bonds that contained a clause permitting such action into consolidated stock, and, if possible, at a lower rate of interest. Up to the present date debentures to the amount of \$428,100 of old funded debt, nearly all paying six per cent. interest, have been replaced, either by permanent stock or debentures paying five per cent., the annual amount of interest thus saved to the city being nearly \$4000. In the water department the changes have been still more satisfactory. Since 1887, when old six per cent. debentures falling due in that year to the amount of \$110,000 were replaced by stock paying five per cent., other debentures of the original water debt have matured to the amount of \$467,550. These latter, nearly all paying six per cent., have been replaced by stock or debentures, a small part at four and the remainder at four and half per cent.

The net annual saving to the water department by these transactions is \$7,539. The commissioners of schools have also, during the past year, renewed a large part of the old six per cent. school bonds by others paying four and four and a half per cent. There will still remain of old city bonds—not replaced because they contain no provision for that purpose—\$168,360 of the general civic debt, nearly all paying six per cent., and \$176,530 of old water debentures, also in great part at six per cent. Of these bonds or debentures \$63,360 of the first mentioned will fall due, part in October 1893, part in July 1894, and \$56,000 of the water debentures also in July 1894.

The following statement will show how our civic debt, including water supply and schools, stood in the matter of liability for interest on 30th April, 1892.

This gives an average rate of interest on our whole funded debt of a trifle over four and three quarters per cent.

The city and water rates during the civic year under consideration have been paid up upon the whole with reasonable promptitude. On 30th April of this year there remained uncollected of the assessment for 1891-2, \$60,860 and for 1890-91, \$27,105. Both of these balances have since been largely reduced and will eventually be collected nearly in full. As sufficient time has now elapsed to test the working of the lien law, it may not be out of place to give some figures relating thereto. It will be remembered that previous to the passing of the lien law the loss from the collection of taxes was so heavy as to cause serious embarrassment and at last to render it necessary to borrow largely to make up deficiencies. It is right, however, to mention in passing, that of the two sums taken up under Act March, 1882, \$100,000 and \$60,000, the first is in course of extinction by a sinking fund which now amounts to about \$40,000, and the second was paid off as it was intended it should be, by collection of old taxes. Before the passing of the law the loss in collection of taxes was often ten, sometimes twelve per cent of the assessment. Taking the five years 1884, 5, 6, 7, 8—the years since 1888 not being completely closed—the average loss of collection under the lien law is less than one per cent. Nor has the operation of the law been attended with the hardship predicted. Since 1886 the total number of properties advertised—always after due notice—by the city collector is 162, but of these it was only necessary to sell 19, an average of less than four in each year, and most of these were sold with the consent of the owners or agents, mainly for the purpose of settling old encumbered estates and perfecting titles.

During the past year an account of long standing between the city and county of Halifax has been satisfactorily settled by a payment from the city to the county of fifteen thousand dollars. This settlement disposes of the last of several disputed accounts, one with the provincial hospital, another with the poor's asylum, a third with the county; all of which were for a long time a source of annoyance. The

amount borrowed for the county claim will be paid off in yearly instalments running over fifteen years.

I must take the opportunity to explain once more what is meant by the unexpended balance account.

The unexpended balances are not, as some suppose, the balances remaining over in the appropriations for the ordinary services. As a usual thing there are no such balances remaining over, or none worth mention. By the city charter, clause 294, it is allowed in the preparation of the annual estimates to include five per cent. for cost of collection, and the unexpended balance is simply the difference between the proceeds of this five per cent. and the actual cost of such collection. So long as five per cent. was included, the difference was considerable, but for the past two years only two and a half per cent. has been placed in the estimate; consequently the amount available from this source will be much less than in former years. Your worship and the city council are, of course, aware that the surplus arising from the larger percentage has been mainly applied hitherto to the reduction of the estimates.

The assessment for the present civic year is \$325,507. This is a considerable advance upon the last and previous years. The law since 1890 allows an extra ten thousand to be assessed for general purposes to which must be added the constantly accruing interest from new loans, and quite a number of instalments upon short loans, as will be seen by reference to the appropriations. It is much less difficult to account for the annual increase in the civic estimates, than to suggest means by which the increase can be met or avoided.

The City Council cannot do otherwise than yield to persistent demands for improvements required for health or convenience, but the citizens should remember that complete sanitary arrangements, cut stone pavements, concrete sidewalks, the newest and best appliances for the fire department are all matters which involve large outlay, and it unfortunately so happens that the property upon which the taxes are levied does not always grow in value in a ratio correspond-

ing with the annual assessment. The returns of the assessors for 1892-3 shew an increase over the valuations of 1891-2 of about \$293,000, a sum no doubt appreciable in itself, but not sufficient to prevent a considerable rise in the rate per centum. The rate for the present year is \$1.49. The returns made by the assessors are as follows:
