# CHARITIES COMMITTEE REPORT.

HALIFAX, N. S., May 8th, 1894.

*To His Worship the Mayor and Members City Council:*

GENTLEMEN,—There is no civic institution in which citizens generally ought to be more interested than the home for the Poor; and there is probably none about the management and inmates of which so little is known. The people seem to be perfectly content to know that the poor of Halifax are well cared for by the corporation, and, beyond contributing the amount required to support the inmates there, their interest apparently ends. But as it costs \$30,000 a year in round figures to maintain the poor of the city, some facts about the expenditure of that money and the general condition of the institution during the past year will perhaps be appreciated.

On the 1st May, 1893, when your committee assumed their duties, there were 307 inmates. During the year 256 were admitted, 28 children were born, 238 were discharged, and 46 died, leaving the number of inmates on the 30th April, 1894, 307—the exact number as at the beginning of the year. The sexes were divided as follows:—

Of these 307 ninety-seven were patients in the insane wards. Deduct these 97 harmless insane leaves the number of paupers at 210. But, in addition to the 97 harmless insane in the Poor House, there are 41 inmates of Mount Hope chargeable to and supported by the city of Halifax. The total number of insane supported by the city is thus:—

Add the 210 paupers and we have a total of 348 inmates of the city institution, or supported by the city at Mount Hope.

While the average cost of each inmate in the Poor House is \$81.03 per annum, the cost of patients in Mount Hope is \$130 for men and \$104 for women. For the support of its violent insane in Mount Hope the city pays out \$4,000 per annum.

Your committee have exercised every possible economy consistent with efficiency, and the deficit is no fault of theirs. The appropriation was \$2,000 less than ever before made by the Council; and, besides this, the superior quality of food furnished the inmates (by resolution of the previous committee) involved an additional expenditure last year of nearly \$1,000. The inmates of the poor house are supplied with all they can eat of as good food as is enjoyed by the ordinary family in Nova Scotia. Had it not been for these two reasons, your committee would have been able to report a substantial surplus.

#### ASSETS OF THE INSTITUTION.

Your committee found from the books that a large amount was due the city from relatives of inmates of the poor house and Mount Hope legally liable for their support, and judicious efforts have been made to collect these amounts. Still there is over \$4,000 yet owing the city. It is doubtful if all of this sum can be collected, as some of it has been owing for more than six years, and no practical effort appears to have been made to collect it, but every dollar of it ought to be paid to the city. The citizens of Halifax have no right to be called upon to support the aged, infirm, insane or worthless members of families who are able to support them themselves, or at least, contribute to their support; and it is grossly unfair to collect money for the maintenance of inmates from struggling citizens, while others owning property assessed for many thousand dollars are allowed to escape any contribution at all for members of their



families for whom they are liable. Besides these assets of debts due the institution there is house furniture, horses, wagons, grocery and dry goods supplies in hand to the estimated value of over \$3,500.

## CHANGES AND IMPROVEMENTS.

Owing to the lack of system hitherto in keeping the books, etc., we are unable to compare the details of the expenditure of previous years with the expenditure of the year just closed.

Among the changes and improvements effected by your committee are the following:—

\$500 a year has been saved by supplying clothing to city patients in Mount Hope by the officials of the Charities Committee instead of purchasing it from the Mount Hope officials.

Hitherto, city patients were sent to Mount Hope on the order of the Stipendiary and Auditor; now they are all sent upon the order of the Superintendent and Chairman after full particulars of and guarantees for payment have been obtained from relatives able to pay.

The poor house is no place for children, and the committee have exercised the power vested in them by statute, by binding out or apprenticing children who were inmates. Two were apprenticed to Rev. Dyson Hague and one to Rev. E. F. Murphy.

One of the greatest improvements made during the year was the construction of the verandas on the south side of the building, one for the male patients in the hospital and the other for the female patients in the hospital, in all fifty persons, mostly old, infirm and helpless. Heretofore those people, not being able to walk down stairs, were unable to enjoy the benefits of the fresh air and the sun.

The ventilation has also been greatly improved by making openings in the brick walls in all the wards, thus allowing a current of air to pass through from one side of the building to the other.

The military tables in the insane wards have been replaced by a much more suitable and substantial table. Each patient in the hospital wards may have a small table for his or her own use.

All the window jambs have been cased, and all the woodwork throughout the buildings has been painted.

Nearly all the labor in connection with these improvements has been done by the inmates, and the only expense to the city has been the material.

## SOLDIERS MUST SUPPORT THEIR WIVES.

Of the new admissions of females during the year a large number seek admission for the benefit of the lying-in wards, many of whom owe their trouble to military men. Hitherto the city has been com-

pelled to support these women and their offspring without being able to collect anything toward their support; and their offspring are liable to be a life-long charge upon the city, from the fact that birth in the city gives them a settlement. Recently the wives of two soldiers applied for admission to the lying-in ward. Though married they were not on the strength of the regiment; and under ordinary circumstances the people of Halifax would have the privilege of supporting these women. Correspondence was opened with His Excellency General Moore and the injustice of this matter to the people of Halifax pointed out. His Excellency corresponded with the War Department and obtained an order to withhold six pence a day from the pay of these soldiers, which amount will be paid to the city toward the support of their wives and children. Hereafter all soldiers will have to contribute half their pay to the support of their wives when in the Poor House.

#### A GREAT INJUSTICE TO THE CITY.

But one of the worst examples of injustice from which the city suffers is from the law which gives a settlement to children born in the city to women belonging elsewhere. For years past Halifax has been the dumping ground for girls from Newfoundland and the outlying counties of Nova Scotia, who come here to hide their shame. While in the Poor House these women, if having a settlement in Nova Scotia, are charged to the counties to which they belong, and if they are Newfoundlanders, or belong anywhere out of the Province, they become chargeable to the Provincial Government; but in every case their offspring become chargeable to the city of Halifax. Here is a case in point:—A girl recently obtained an order for admission. She only arrived from Newfoundland two months ago. She ought not to have been allowed to land; but we have no pauper alien law in Canada, as they have in the United States, and consequently could do nothing to compel her to return to her native land. At the last moment she applies for admission. The city is bound to admit and care for her; and thus her offspring obtains a legal settlement in Halifax. Should the child be born demented, deformed, blind, or deaf and dumb, it is liable to become a life-long burden to the citizens.

Each inmate of the Poor House costs the city \$81 a year. Some people spend a life time in the Poor House. There is one man there to-day who has been an inmate for 54 years. His mother lived there for 40 years and his father died there; so that the father, mother,

and child, have been supported by the tax-payers of this unfortunate city for over a century, at a total cost of \$10,574.52. In this case, these people were natives of the city; but it is outrageous that the city should be burdened with the life-long support of the offspring of the refuse of other countries. The case I have mentioned of a man being an inmate of the Poor House for over half a century is not an overdrawn one. Most of the old stock have died off. Still we have some who have been inmates for 40, 35, 30 and 25 years, and fully fifty of the inmates to-day have been there over 20 years.

THE PERMANENT OFFICIALS.

Your committee desire to bear testimony to the efficiency and urbanity of the officials. In the Superintendent, Matron, Secretary, and other assistants, the city has thoroughly capable officials who know their duty and do it faithfully. Hence, the institution has been managed to the perfect satisfaction of the committee, to the comfort of the inmates, and, we believe, to the approval of the public.

*To the Chairman and Members of Charities Committee :*

GENTLEMEN,—I hereby submit for the information of His Worship the Mayor and City Council the eighth annual report of the Halifax Poor's Asylum.

At the beginning of the year there were 307 inmates in the institution : 160 men, 133 women, and 14 children.

During the year there were 256 admitted, 28 born, 238 discharged, and 46 died. The smallest number in the institution at one time was 277 on July 7th, 1893, and the largest number was 343 on February 27th, 1894.

The inmates have been employed at general housework, and have made and repaired all the shoes and clothing for the institution. They have also made all the shoes and clothing for the inmates of Mount Hope Asylum, chargeable to the city, whereby a saving of about five hundred dollars per year has been effected.

A number of improvements have been made during the year, which have added greatly to the comfort and convenience of the inmates. Two verandahs have been constructed on the south side of the buildings for the use of the patients in the hospital wards. The ventilation in all the wards has been greatly improved by making openings in the walls which divide the wards, and all the woodwork throughout the building has been painted.

Appended you will find the name, age, birthplace, and religious persuasion, with the total number of days of each inmate from May 1st, 1893, to April 30th, 1894.

On behalf of myself, the matron, and other officials, I wish to return thanks for past counsel and courtesies.
