AGREEMENTS.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT made and entered into this twentieth day of November, A. D. 1897, between the City of Halifax, hereinafter called the "City," of the first part; the Provincial Exhibition Commission, a body incorporated by Chapter 3 of the Acts of the Legislature of the Province of Nova Scotia for the year 1896, hereinafter called the "Commission," of the second part; and Her Majesty the Queen, represented in this behalf by the Minister of Railways and Canals for Canada, hereinafter called the "Minister," of the third part. Witnesseth,—

Whereas, the commission has, by virtue of certain Acts of the said legislature, acquired the title to certain lands near Kempt Road, in the City of Halifax, for Exhibition grounds;

And whereas, it is deemed advisable by the said commission that there should be further and better railway facilities leading to the said grounds;

And whereas, the commission, in order to obtain such facilities, has applied to the minister for a branch siding to be put in to connect said grounds with the present Cotton Factory siding (so-called) and the branch of the Intercolonial Railway on Kempt Road aforesaid;

And whereas, the minister, duly authorized in that behalf has agreed to construct, at the cost of Her Majesty, a railway siding for freight traffic on the conditions hereinafter contained, and provided the right-of-way for the said siding is furnished to him free of any charge whatsoever, and provided he is fully indemnified against all claims and demands of every nature and kind arising out of the construction, existence, or operation of the said railway siding;

And whereas, the city, by a resolution of the City Council of the City of Halifax, dated the tenth day of August, A. D. 1897, has authorized the execution of these presents on behalf of the city;

And whereas, the commission has agreed to procure the right-of-way for the said siding, and to furnish to the minister the said right-of-way free of any charge whatsoever against the said minister, and also to fully indemnify the minister against all claims and demands of every nature and kind arising out of the construction, existence, or operation of the said siding;

And whereas, the city and the commission propose to furnish as the right-of-way for the said siding a portion of the public street called "Young Street," along and upon which street they desire the said siding to be laid ;

And whereas, the city has agreed that the said railway siding may, free of all charges, cross and run along and upon the streets of the City of Halifax as hereinafter described ;

And whereas, the city and the commission have agreed that they will procure, at the next ensuing session of the legislature of the Province of Nova Scotia, the necessary legislation to enable the city to give permission for the construction and operation of the said railway siding across, along and upon the streets of the City of Halifax, free of all charges ;

Now therefore this agreement witnesseth, that the said minister, in consideration of the premises and of the covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, hereby undertakes and agrees to construct a railway siding for freight traffic as nearly as possible in accordance with the line shown colored red on the plan hereto annexed, and which line may be described as follows :—

Beginning at a point on the city siding on the east side of Kempt Road ; thence by a curve southerly and westwardly, across Kempt Road to the Cotton Factory siding (so-called), continuing across the south-east corner of property owned by Henderson and Potts ; thence diagonally across Young Street to the south side of said Young Street ; thence westwardly along the south side of said Young Street to a point near Windsor Street.

And the minister further agrees :—

That he will lay the said siding as nearly as possible to the grade of the said streets.

That whenever the said siding is in use he will keep the rails, fastenings and ties in serviceable condition for railway freight traffic.

That the said freight siding shall be operated only in connection with exhibitions held on the aforesaid grounds, and for no other purpose whatsoever, and shall be taken up when required by the said commission, when the use of that portion of the said streets or lands shall cease and determine.

That he will use every endeavor to cause the operating of the said siding to be done by skillful and careful men.

That when this agreement is terminated in either of the ways herein provided, and he has taken up the said siding and removed and carried away all the property of Her Majesty, that he will surrender the right-of-way to the city and the commission.

And the commission hereby undertakes and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the minister and Her Majesty the Queen, her successors, servants, agents and assigns, from and against any and all claims, costs, damages, charges and demands of every kind and nature which any and all persons may recover for or by reason of or arising from or consequential upon or affected by the construction, existence, maintenance or operation of the said railway siding, all of which claims, costs, charges, damages and demands the said commission hereby undertakes to fully discharge and satisfy.

And the commission further agrees to procure the right-of-way for the said siding, and to furnish to the minister the said right-of-way free of any charge whatsoever against the said minister.

And the commission further agrees that if at any time or times the Railway Committee of the Privy Council, or other competent authority, shall order that a guardian or guardians shall be employed, or shall order any other protection of any kind or sort whatsoever to be made, given, constructed or supplied for or in connection with the said siding, that the said commission will employ the said guardian or guardians, and provide such other protection, and all necessary work and material for the purpose of the same, all at its own expense, cost and charges, free from any expense, cost or charges to the minister.

And the commission further agrees that when the said siding is taken up at the request of the said commission, that the minister shall not be required to relay the siding in the same or in any other position.

And the city and the commission hereby agree that if at any time either of them fails, or both of them fail, to observe and perform all the terms and stipulations herein contained to be by them, or either of them observed and performed, then all rights and privileges which either or both of them may have under this agreement shall at once cease and determine, and the minister may take up and remove the said siding without giving any notice to either the city or the commission; such termination of the agreement, however, shall not relieve the city or the commission from any liabilities incurred by them hereunder towards the minister.

And the city and the commission further agree that when this agreement is terminated by mutual consent as hereinafter provided, or when it is terminated by the request of the commission to the minister, that the siding shall be taken up, or when it is terminated by the failure of the parties of the first and of the second part, or either of them, to observe and perform all its terms and stipulations, the minister shall have free access and permission for his workmen and servants to take up, remove, and carry away all the property belonging to Her Majesty.

All the parties to this agreement hereby agree that it may be terminated by either of the parties giving to the others at any time one year's notice in writing of such proposed termination, and at the expiration of such notice it shall terminate accordingly.

In witness whereof, the Mayor of the said City of Halifax, duly authorized thereunto by a resolution of the City Council, hath hereunto set his hand and seal of the said city, and the President of the Provincial Exhibition Commission, duly authorized thereunto by a resolution of the said commission, hath hereunto set his hand and the seal of the said commission, the day and year first above written.

PLUMBING LAW AMENDMENTS.

Resolved, that Rule 3 of the Rules and Regulations for the guidance of architects, plumbers, householders and others using the water supply be and is hereby amended, by adding thereto the following:—

“In buildings of not more than four storeys, 5 inch iron pipe weighing 12 pounds per foot, and 6 inch iron pipe weighing 15 pounds per foot, may be used above the cellar floor.”

Resolved, that Rule 39 of the Rules and Regulations for the Guidance of architects, plumbers, householders and others using the water supply be amended by substituting “Board of Plumbing Examiners” for “City Engineer.”

And further, that Rule 41 of the said Rules and Regulations be and is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:—

“The said license shall expire on the 31st day of December, in the year in which it is issued, and may be renewed on the recommendation of the Board of Plumbing Examiners, for which renewal the applicant shall pay the sum of \$1.00.”

And further resolved, that Rule 42 of the said Rules and Regulations be and is hereby amended by adding the following:—

“Any member of such firm possessing the qualifications specified by Rule 39, may make application as a representative of the firm, pass examination, and receive a license for the firm. The bond required shall be jointly executed by all the members of said firm.”

Resolved, that Rule 50 of the Rules and Regulations for the guidance of architects, plumbers, householders, and others using the water supply be and are hereby amended, by inserting the following Rules and Regulations:—

RULE 50A. “Every person who shall desire to work at the practice of plumbing in the City of Halifax as a journeyman plumber, and who does not practice the business of plumbing as a master plumber, shall apply to the Board of Plumbing Examiners, and shall present himself for examination at the time designated

"by such board. If declared competent by the Board of Plumbing Examiners, he shall register his name in the office of the City Engineer, and shall receive a certificate for competency to do work as a journeyman plumber."

RULE 50B. "Any master plumber or journeyman plumber who will furnish satisfactory evidence to the Board of Plumbing Examiners that he has practiced the business as a master or journeyman plumber in the City of Halifax for four (4) years previous to the passing of the Rules and Regulations for the guidance of architects, plumbers, householders, and others using the water supply, shall be entitled to receive a license or registration without examination."

CHARITIES COMMITTEE REPORT.

HALIFAX, May 1, 1898.

To His Worship the Mayor and City Council :

GENTLEMEN,—In submitting herewith the Annual Report of the Charities Committee for the year ending April 30th, 1898, it is gratifying to note that, although a larger number of persons were supported in the Poor's Asylum during that period than in any other year since the City assumed control of the Institution, yet the expenditure has been kept within the income, and a small balance remains to the credit of the Committee.

On May 1st, 1897, there were 347 inmates in the Poor's Asylum. During the year there were 372 admitted, 27 born, 350 discharged, and 41 died, leaving 355 in the Institution at the end of the year. The sexes were divided as follows:—

The number of inmates has greatly increased in the past year. From December to March the daily average number of inmates was 410. The daily average for the year was 367.

There were 746 persons supported during the whole or part of the year. The largest number present at one time was 426 on February 23rd, 1898, and the smallest number was 327 on June 12th, 1897. The number of harmless insane patients in the Institution is 115, 20 of whom are chargeable to the Provincial Government. There is an average of 28 patients in the Hospital for Insane chargeable to the City, at a cost of \$2.50 per week for male and \$2.00 per week for female patients.

HOSPITAL ENDOWMENT.

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The receipts for the making of concrete show a slight increase over last year, and the sales of kindling and hardwood are steadily improving. In my report of a year ago I referred to the fact that the amount paid the Hospital for Insane for the Insane Poor chargeable to the City of Halifax, was some \$1200.00 less than the previous year. During the past year the expenditure on this

account has been still further reduced over \$500.00. The amount paid for the several years are as follows:—

ASSETS.

The assets of the institution consist of household furniture, grocery and dry goods supplies, kindling and hardwood; the estimated value of which is \$3,600.

Coffins to the number of 28, and from which no revenue is derived, have been supplied to persons in the city who are unable to pay, as well as to the Home of the Guardian Angel, and the Infants' Home, Tower Road.

A domestic and two steam boilers have been purchased and put in position, to replace those condemned by the Boiler Inspection and Insurance Company.

In concluding my report of a year ago, I spoke of the necessity of having some industry in connection with the Poor's Asylum, so that more employment could be given the inmates. That fact has been more apparent this year than ever before, owing to the large increase in the number of inmates. Many times during the past winter men who were able to work were forced to live in idleness, at the expense of the city, because the Superintendent could not find anything for them to do. This state of affairs is detrimental to the best interests of the institution, and, as has been pointed out before in previous reports, makes it much harder for the management to enforce discipline.

During the past winter that portion of the building set apart for the male inmates was overcrowded to such an extent that it was found necessary to place 42, and in some cases 43 men in the wards, which can only accommodate 36 persons comfortably.

From the foregoing it is plainly seen that your Committee will have to deal in the near future with the very important matter of providing more accommodation for the poor and sufficient land to keep them employed.

This is a matter over which no time should be lost, and the citizens at once made aware not only of its necessity, but also of the expenditure to be incurred in the carrying out of the same.

HALIFAX POOR'S ASYLUM,

April 30th, 1898.

To the Chairman and Members of the Charities Committee :

GENTLEMEN,—I herewith submit for your consideration, as well as for the information of His Worship the Mayor and City Council, the Twelfth Annual Report of the Halifax Poor's Asylum.

On May 1st, 1897, there were 347 inmates in the institution—196 men, 141 women and 10 children. There were 372 admitted during the year, 27 born, 350 discharged, and 41 died. The total number of inmates at this date is 355—made up of 210 men, 136 women, 9 children.

As many as possible of the male inmates have been employed in making concrete, kindling, whitewashing, house cleaning, etc. ; but I find it impossible to find work for a great many, owing to the large increase in the number admitted during the past year. The females do all the house-work, and also make the clothing for the inmates of this institution, as well as for those patients in Mount Hope Asylum who are chargeable to the City of Halifax.

The number of harmless insane patients is 115—an increase over last year of 14. This class of patients is getting larger every year. During January, February and March, the number of inmates was the largest in the history of the institution since it was taken over by the city, and I consider it my duty to call to your attention, that if we have many more applications for relief next winter than we had last, I will not have sufficient accommodation for them. This is a serious matter and should be dealt with as soon as possible. In a large institution where the wards are overcrowded, there is always a possibility of an epidemic occurring, and for that reason I would respectfully request that something be done in the matter of increased accommodation, so that we may be able to house all our poor comfortably, and without the fear of the possibility mentioned above.

The revenue from the making of concrete and kindling-wood shows a slight increase over last year.

My thanks are due to Alderman Geldert, chairman of the library committee, for the large number of interesting books

donated by him to the institution. They have been the means of making an otherwise dull hour pleasant, and are greatly appreciated by the inmates.

To the many ladies and gentlemen who have sent books, papers, fruits, etc., for the use of the sick, as well as those who have so kindly assisted at the various concerts held during the past year, I am deeply indebted, and extend to them my sincere thanks.

Appended you will find the name, age, birth-place and religious persuasion, with the total number of days of each inmate, from May 1st, 1897 to April 30th, 1898.

In conclusion, on behalf of myself, the Matron and other officials, I wish to return thanks for past counsel and courtesies.
