REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH.

OFFICE OF THE CITY HEALTH BOARD,
HALIFAX, N. S., MAY 1ST, 1901.

*To the Chairman and other Members
of the City Health Board :—*

GENTLEMEN,—I respectfully submit for your information the following summary of work performed in this Department for the civic year ending 30th April, 1901 :

The Board, during the past year, held 34 meetings.

A large number of sanitary improvements were ordered and attended to.

During the year the Board ordered the removal of 97 outside privy vaults ; 43 were thus removed and proper W. C.'s constructed in the houses, the remainder being given an extension of time to comply with the order.

The correspondence for the year consists of 107 letters received and 1019 sent out. Of the latter number 801 were notices served ordering sanitary improvements and the removal of nuisances.

The total number of cases of contagious diseases reported for last year was much below that of the year before, 31 cases and 7 deaths against 112 cases and 20 deaths. Last year there were 12 cases of diptheria and 4 deaths against 25 cases and 5 deaths the

year before ; scarlet fever, 19 cases and 3 deaths last year against 87 cases with 15 deaths the year before.

Fourteen patients were admitted to the Hospital for Infectious Diseases, 8 for scarlet fever, 5 for diphtheria, and 1 for erysipelas, all of which recovered, except the latter.

During the year 1007 permits were issued for the removal of night soil, and 2342 loads were thus removed.

Complaints respecting the unsanitary condition of 191 premises were received at this office, all of which were carefully investigated and dealt with as the circumstances in each case required.

CITIZEN'S FREE LIBRARY.

HALIFAX, N. S., *April 30th, 1902.*

His Worship the Mayor and Members of the City Council :

GENTLEMEN,—During the year just ended 629 new books, including 260 volumes of bound magazines were added to the library.

The number of periodicals on the subscription list has been increased and now embraces most of the best publications in England and America.

The Librarian's report shows that 2325 new readers' cards were issued during the year.

The number of books issued for home use was 78,172, and for reference and other purposes 1085, making a total of 89,682.

From a careful record kept of the books issued it appears that the proportion of fiction to other books continues to be about the same as in similar libraries elsewhere. The library committee are endeavoring to lessen the proportion of fiction used by providing new and attractive books in other classes of literature.

The reference department of the library is constantly growing in importance, and in usefulness as the most expensive and valuable books purchased can be used only in the library. The want of suitable space for this purpose is much felt.

During the year some portions of the library have been revised and much improved. A portion of the special grant made to the

library for this purpose was expended in rebinding books, and a much larger portion in purchasing new books to take the place of those worn out, and in completing broken sets.

The employment of an additional Assistant in the library has enabled the Committee to make a re-arrangement of the hours by which the library has been thrown open to the public during several hours of each morning and evening. This change while involving little if any additional work to the staff will be of great convenience to the public.

When the City was first incorporated, and until April 12th, 1849, the Corporation consisted of the Mayor, six Aldermen and twelve Common Councillors, the Mayor being elected by the Aldermen and Common Councillors from among the Aldermen. In 1849 the office of Common Councilman was abolished. From 1850 to 1853 the Mayors were elected by the citizens from the members of the City Council, or from gentlemen who had previously served as Aldermen or Common Councilmen. Wm. Caldwell was the first Mayor elected by the citizens under this system. In 1854 the Act in relation to the election of Mayor was further amended by providing that the people should not be restricted to persons who had served in the City Council in their choice for Mayor. The only occasion on which this privilege was availed of was in 1870, in the election of Hon. W. A. Henry. From 1841 to 1882 the general civic elections were held in October of each year. From April, 1883, to date, the general elections have been held annually in April. The civic year extends from 1st May in any one year to 30th April in the year following.

CITY COUNCIL.

The Act of Incorporation of the City of Halifax passed the House of Assembly April 10th, 1841. On May 12th, 1841, an election was held in each of the wards of the City for three Common Councilmen for each ward. The first meeting of the City Council was held in the County Court House May 13th, 1841. The Council from 1841 to 1849 consisted of six Aldermen and twelve Common Councillors. The following table shows the dates of election and the names of the gentlemen composing the City Council between those years, designating the Aldermen and Common Councilmen respectively and the wards they represented. The first Common Councillors were elected by the citizens. Subsequently the Common Councillors were elected by the ratepayers. The Common Councillors from among themselves chose the Aldermen; and the Aldermen and Common Councilmen from out of the Aldermen elected the Mayors. Each year six senior Common Councilmen and three senior Aldermen retired, the order of seniority being fixed by the Council. The following lists do not contain the names of gentlemen who were elected but did not serve in the City Council because of unwillingness to serve, disqualification, irregularity of election, or other reasons.
