## LEASE OF BOAT LANDING NORTH WEST ARM AT SOUTH STREET.

Permission is hereby granted to William Robinson, so far as the City has power to grant the same, to place a float with a shed thereon at the landing at the Western end of South Street, and maintain and operate the same and keep boats for hire, subject to the following conditions:—

1. Before the delivery of this permit the said William Robinson shall pay to the City Clerk of Works the sum of one (\$1.00) dollar.

2. Unless previously cancelled, as herein provided, this permit shall expire on April 30th, 1904.

3. The said float or floats and boats shall be placed in such a position that they will not interfere with the rights of the public of the City of Halifax to egress and ingress to and from the landing at the foot of South Street and over the waters of the North-West Arm.

4. The said float or floats shall be located, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the City Engineer; and the said William Robinson shall carry on his operations under the supervision and subject to the direction of the Chief of Police.

5. The said William Robinson shall take all responsibility in connection with the construction and maintenance of the said float and be liable for all expense or damages to persons or property caused by his occupation of the said landing or his operations under this permit and shall hold the City harmless from all claims in connection therewith.

6. This permit is given with the express understanding that His Worship the Mayor of the City of Halifax, for the time being, shall have the right to cancel the same at any time he thinks proper, and thereupon the said William Robinson shall remove all floats, boats or any obstructions or erections of any kind or description within a time to be named in the notice cancelling this permit



and in case the said William Robinson fails to remove the same the City shall be at liberty to do so at the cost, charges and expense of the said William Robinson; and this permit is specially given and accepted by the said William Robinson on the foregoing conditions.

### CHARLES STREET DEDICATION.

EXTRACT FROM MINUTES OF COUNCIL—JULY 16TH, 1902.

WHEREAS, Charles Street in the City of Halifax, running from Robie Street to Windsor Street, has now been open for many years to the public and dedicated to them as a street, and it is desirable that the City of Halifax should take over said street;

THEREFORE RESOLVED, That the City Council of the City of Halifax hereby accept the dedication of said street for public purposes, and hereafter the said street shall be known as Charles Street and as one of the accepted streets of said City as a public street, which said street is described as follows:—

All that lot, piece or parcel of land between Robie Street and Windsor Street, lying between the two red lines representing the north and south side lines of Charles Street, as shewn on the plan of Charles Street filed as plan number 1462 in the City Engineer's office at Halifax, N. S., and signed by F. W. W. Doane, City Engineer.

## CHARLES STREET LEASE OF ENCROACHMENTS.

This agreement, made this fifteenth day of July in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Two between the City of Halifax hereinafter called the "City," of the One Part; and Thomas Ritchie, of the City of Halifax, Barrister, and John Johnson, Senior, Esquire of the City of Halifax, of the Other Part;

WHEREAS, the street in the City of Halifax known as "Charles Street Extension" has been opened and dedicated to and used by the public for many years and the City Council of the City of Halifax have been desirous of accepting said Extension as one of the streets of the City of Halifax but in consequence of the said Thomas Ritchie having steps leading to his house projecting on said street and the said John Johnson, Senior, having a porch and steps projecting out to and on said street the said City is prevented from accepting said street as that part would not be of the legal width;

AND WHEREAS, the said Thomas Ritchie, and John Johnston, Senior, are desirous that the City Council should accept said street and have agreed that as soon as the said street is accepted they will either remove said encroachments or pay a nominal rent therefor;

NOW THEREFORE THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH, that the said Thomas Ritchie, his heirs and assigns, hereby undertake and agree that the lot of land upon which are situate the said steps leading to the house and premises situate on the South-West corner of Hunter and Charles Streets in said City shall become and be considered the property of the said City of Halifax from the date hereof, and that after the said resolution of Council shall have passed accepting said street the said Thomas Ritchie will either remove said steps or pay to the said City the nominal sum of twenty-five cents (\$0.25) per years so long as said steps shall be permitted and allowed to remain on said street by said City, but that said City shall have the right at any time to remove said steps projecting beyond the line of the street by giving one month's notice to the owner or occupier of the premises.

AND the said John Johnston, his heirs and assigns, hereby undertake and agree that the lot of land upon which are situate the porch and steps leading to the house and premises Number 97 on the north side of said Charles Street Extension in said City shall become and be considered the property of the said City of Halifax from the date hereof, and that after the said resolution of Council shall have passed accepting said street the said John Johnston shall either remove said porch and steps or pay to the said City the nominal sum of twenty-five cents (\$0.25) per year so long as said porch and steps shall be permitted and allowed to remain on said street by said City, but that said City shall have the right at any time to remove said porch and steps projecting beyond the line of the street by giving one month's notice to the owner or occupier of the premises.

The respective parties shall be liable for any accident of whatever nature which shall or may occur to any person, property or thing by reason of the construction, use or maintenance of the said encroachments, and the said respective parties shall save harmless the said City or any of its officials from all suits, damages, costs or expenses which may be incurred by reason of the existence of the said encroachments.

The respective parties shall pay to the said City the sum of twenty-five cents (\$0.25) each per annum during the continuance of the encroachments, the first payment to be made on or before the first of May, 1903, and in the succeeding years of this agreement the rental to be paid on or before the first day of May in each and every year.

This agreement may be terminated at any time by the said City by a notice in writing signed by the City Engineer for the time being for the City of Halifax and left on the premises herein referred to, and immediately upon such notice being so given the permission hereinbefore granted shall be deemed to be withdrawn without payment of any compensation to the said respective parties, who shall thereupon forthwith proceed at their own cost and to the satisfaction of the City Engineer to remove the said encroachments and make the street good to the satisfaction of the said City Engineer. And in case the said respective parties shall fail or neglect within one calendar month from the giving of such notice to remove the said encroachments and to make good the surface of the street as aforesaid the said City Engineer may at the expense

in all respects of the said respective parties remove the said encroachments and make good the street, and all costs and expenses incurred in such removal and work shall on demand be paid by the said respective parties.

# REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH.

OFFICE OF CITY HEALTH BOARD,

HALIFAX, N. S., May 8th, 1903.

*To the Chairman and Members of the City Board of Health :*

GENTLEMEN,—I respectfully submit for your information the following summary of work performed by this Department for the civic year ending April 30th. 1903:—

The Board during the past year held twenty-six meetings, at which a large number of sanitary improvements were ordered and subsequently carried out.

During the year thirty-five notices were served for defective plumbing and drainage in houses, all of which have been attended to, as recommended by the Inspector of Plumbing.

Notices were served for the removal of nineteen outside privy vaults, and fourteen were thus removed and proper w. c.'s constructed in the houses.

The correspondence for this year consists of fifty-two letters received and seven hundred and ninety-seven sent out. Of the latter number six hundred and eighty-one were notices served ordering sanitary improvements and the removal of nuisances.

Complaints respecting the unsanitary condition of two hundred and fifty-eight premises were received at this office, all of which were carefully investigated and dealt with as the circumstances in each case required.

During the year seven hundred and eight-five permits were issued for the removal of night-soil, and one thousand five hundred and forty-two loads were thus removed.

The number of cases of contagious diseases reported for the past year was one hundred and eleven cases of diphtheria, nine of scarlet fever and six of smallpox; with twenty-six deaths from diphtheria, one from scarlet fever and one from smallpox.

Twenty-two patients were admitted to the Hospital for Infectious Diseases, viz., ten for diphtheria, six for scarlet fever, two for measles, one for erysipelas and two for trachoma, all of whom recovered.

When the City was first incorporated, and until April 12th 1849, the Corporation consisted of the Mayor, six Alderman and twelve Common Councillors, the Mayor being elected by the Alderman and Common Councillors from among the Alderman. In 1849 the office of Common Councilman was abolished. From 1850 to 1853 the Mayors were elected by the citizens from the members of the City Council, or from gentlemen who had previously served as Alderman or Common Councilman. Wm. Caldwell was the first Mayor elected by the citizens under this system. In 1854 the Act in relation to the election of Mayor was further amended by providing that the people should not be restricted to persons who had served in the City Council in their choice for Mayor. The only occasion on which this privilege was availed of was in 1870, in the election of Hon. W. A. Henry. From 1841 to 1882 the general civic election were held in October of each year. From April, 1883, to date, the general election have been held annually in April. The civic year extends from 1st May in any one year to 30th April in the year following.

## CITY COUNCIL.

The Act of Incorporation of the City of Halifax passed the House of Assembly April 10th, 1841. On May 12th, 1841, an election was held in each of the wards of the City for three Common Councilmen for each ward. The first meeting of the City Council was held in the County Court House May 13th, 1841. The Council from 1841 to 1849 consisted of six Aldermen and twelve Common Councilors. The following table shows the dates of election and the names of the gentlemen composing the City Council between those years, designating the Aldermen and Common Councilmen respectively and the wards they represented. The first Common Councilors were elected by the citizens. Subsequently the Common Councilors were elected by the ratepayers. The Common Councilors from among themselves chose the Aldermen; and the Aldermen and Common Councilmen from out of the Aldermen elected the Mayors. Each year six senior Common Councilmen and three senior Aldermen retired, the order of seniority being fixed by the Council. The following lists do not contain the names of gentlemen who were elected but did not serve in the City Council because of unwillingness to serve, disqualification, irregularity of election, or other reasons.
