

there also, that a large number of other brave fire-fighters met with more or less serious injuries. The disastrous consequences to life and limb of firemen at the Nova Scotia Furnishing Co.'s fire emphasizes the danger to which the members of the Fire Department are continually exposed, and in my opinion, it is the simple and bounden duty of this City to furnish this Department with every possible appliance that will in any way assist in minimizing the danger of accident to our men.

In the case of the Fuller fire, it has gone down into history as being the subject of many contentions and much heart-burning. I, however, feel safe in saying, that whilst the financial loss was heavy, and some of the outcroppings of that conflagration unpleasant for the time being, yet it was productive of good results. It revealed some weaknesses in both the Fire and Water Department. As a result, several changes and improvements have been made, and in leaving the subject of the Fuller fire, I think I can safely say, that "out of evil has come good."

Among the more important improvements in the houses and equipment of the Department during the year are included the installation of new plumbing and heating systems at Quinpool Road; a new furnace at Grafton Street; alterations to stables at Central; painting and renovating the main floor at Isleville; new tubes in the Alexandra Steamer; converting No. 2 Steamer from a double to a triple hitch; the appointment of a harness-maker to the Department, who, in addition to doing all harness repairing for the Department, has been trained and now acts as an assistant chemical operator. Provision has also been made for the purchase of a new two-horse ladder truck and ladders. A new system of book-keeping has been installed in the Department store rooms. Each engine house has been furnished with a daily record book, and both the new system of keeping track of the stock and the daily record book in the houses, have proven of service during the time they have been in use, and will be of greater service when the men become more familiar with their uses.

The Horton Ladder, as you know, has been approved by the Board of Underwriters, and all that now remains to secure the promised reduction in insurance rates is to place the ladder in commission.

Two of the features of the year's work were the divisional sports and the hitching contests between the different houses and drivers of apparatus. Both these contests created a spirit of healthy, friendly rivalry between the men. I believe they were productive of much good, and I would express the hope that whoever may have the honor of heading the Board of Fire Wards for the incoming year, will see to it that these competitions are again arranged and carried out.

For the officers and men of the Department I have nothing but good words. From the Chief down to the latest recruit they have vied with each other in their efforts to meet and comply with the expressed wishes of myself and this Board, and the requirements of the rules of the Department. In their general conduct and the observance of discipline, they have been above reproach, and I point with pride to the fact, that with the exception of three or four called to give reasons for failure to attend the annual inspection, it has not been necessary to summon even one man before this Board to answer to a charge of violating the rules. This is a splendid record for a Department in which nearly 125 men are called upon to observe the provisions of a code of discipline by no means a lax one.

The officers and men of our Fire Department do credit to themselves, the Department and the city, and are deserving of the very best this city can afford to give them.

In conclusion I would say, that whilst there is, of course, always room for improvement in various ways, and there are a number of improvements I would like to see made, still with the completion of the proposed repairs to the Bedford Row house; new underpinning at Quinpool Road; a new floor at West Street, and a few other minor repairs in different places, the houses of the Department, with the exception of Isleville, will be in very good condition; and with the arrival of the 3000 feet of new hose now on the way from the factories; the commissioning of the Horton Ladder and the new service ladder truck; the converting of No. 5 steamer from a double to a tripple hitch, and the supplying of some lighter but very useful pieces of equipment, the Department, in the matters of apparatus and general equipment, will be in good order.

I would, however, impress upon this Board my belief that better fire protection should, at the earliest possible date, be provided for

the extreme north end of the city. Among the members of this Board and in the Council there are conflicting opinions as to how this protection can best be furnished, but I trust that at an early date, these different views will be merged into a plan that will bring about the desired results.

Again thanking you for the honor conferred on me at the beginning of the year, and for the whole-hearted manner in which you have assisted me in the discharge of my duties throughout the year, and expressing the hope that my comments and suggestions as above, and this very brief review of the year's work will meet with your approval and endorsement, I am,

REPORT OF CITY HEALTH BOARD.

OFFICE OF THE CITY HEALTH BOARD,
HALLIAX, N. S., May 3rd, 1910.

To the Chairman and other Members of the City Health Board :

GENTLEMEN :—I respectfully submit for your information the following summary of work performed in this Department for Civic year ending April 30th, 1910.

The Board during the past year held 31 meetings at which a large number of sanitary improvements were ordered and subsequently carried out.

During the year 183 notices were served for defective plumbing and drainage in houses, all of which have been attended to as recommended by the Inspector of Plumbing.

540 notices were served for the removal of outside privy vaults and 465 were thus removed and proper water closets constructed in the houses, the remainder given an extension of time to comply with the order.

The correspondence for the year consisted of 273 letters received and 2127 sent out. Of the latter number 1907 were notices served ordering sanitary improvements and removal of nuisance.

Complaints respecting the unsanitary condition of 197 houses were received at this office, all of which were carefully investigated and dealt with as the circumstances in each case required.

Three dwelling houses, Nos. 215r. Lower Water Street, 65 George Street, 12 Sullivan Street, were declared to be unfit for that purpose and were vacated and closed by order of the Board, also Nos. 2 and 4 Brussels Street, which were removed and destroyed as the public health was endangered thereby.

The total number of contagious diseases reported for the past year was 261 cases of Diphtheria, 74 Scarlet Fever, 75 Small Pox, 50 Consumption and 3 Typhoid Fever, with 19 deaths due to Diphtheria and 1 Scarlet Fever.

99 cases were admitted to the Hospital for Infectious Diseases, viz:—71 Diphtheria, 22 Scarlet Fever, 3 Measles and 3 Erysipelas, with 4 deaths from Diphtheria, 1 Measles and 1 Erysipelas.

629 permits were issued for the removal of night soil and 1232 loads were thus removed.

During the year there has been condemned and destroyed as unfit for human food 112 carcasses and 40 quarters of mutton 17 carcasses veal, 15 carcasses and 5 quarters lamb, 5 carcasses and 2917 pounds of beef, 40 bbls. corned beef, 2½ bbls. and 325 lbs. pork, 13½ prs. chickens, 13 boxes smelts, 24 prs. rabbits and 2 quarters of moose meat.

When the City was first incorporated, and until April 12th 1849, the Corporation consisted of Mayor, six Aldermen and twelve Common Councillors, the Mayor being elected by the Aldermen and Common Councillors from among the Aldermen. In 1849 the office of Common Councilman was abolished. From 1850 to 1853 the Mayors were elected by the citizens from the members of the City Council, or from gentlemen who had previously served as Alderman or Common Councilman Wm. Caldwell was the first Mayor elected by the citizens under this system. In 1854 the Act in relation to the election of Mayor was further amended by providing that the people should not be restricted to persons who had served in the City Council in their choice for Mayor. The only occasion on which this privilege was availed of was in 1870, in the election of Hon. W. A. Henry. From 1841 to 1882 the general civic elections were held in October of each year. From April, 1883, to date, the general elections have been held annually in April. The civic year extends from 1st May in any one year to 30th April in the year following.

CITY COUNCIL.

The Act of Incorporation of the City of Halifax passed the House of Assembly April 10th, 1841. On May 12th, 1841, an election was held in each of the wards of the City for three Common Councilmen for each ward. The first meeting of the City Council was held in the County Court House May 13th, 1841. The Council from 1841 to 1849 consisted of six Aldermen and twelve Common Councilors. The following table shows the dates of election and the names of the gentlemen composing the City Council between those years, designating the Aldermen and Common Councilmen respectively and the wards they represented. The first Common Councilors were elected by the citizens. Subsequently the Common Councilors were elected by the ratepayers. The Common Councilors from among themselves chose the Aldermen; and the Aldermen and Common Councilmen from out of the Aldermen elected the Mayors. Each year six senior Common Councilmen and three senior Aldermen retired, the order of seniority being fixed by the Council. The following lists do not contain the names of gentlemen who were elected but did not serve in the City Council because of unwillingness to serve, disqualification, irregularity of election, or other reasons.
