Gentlemen — Herewith I beg to submit my annual report for year ending April 30th, 1916.

Condition.

All the engines have been tested by me and found to be in the following condition.

Motor Engine Patricia La France, 3 years in commission, 90 H. P., 600 gals. wine capacity, carrying 1000 ft. 2½ in. hose, 200 ft. 1 in. chem. hose, 1-35 gal. chem. tank, weight 10,000 lbs., stationed at West St. Built in United States, in first class condition.

Fire Engine Halifax, Amoskeag, 28 years in service, cap. 600 gals. wine, weight 7,800 lbs. stationed at Quinpool Road Station. Three horse hitch, in good condition.

Fire Engine Columbia, Amoskeag, 24 years in service, cap. 600 gals. wine, weight, 7,900 lbs. stationed at Morris Street. Three horse hitch, built in United States, in good condition.

Fire Engine King Edward, Waterous, 10 years in service, cap. 1000 gals. wine, weight 9,900 lbs., stationed at Central Engine House, Brunswick St., 3 horse hitch, built in Canada, Brantford, Ont., in good condition.

Fire Engine Alexandra, Shand & Mason, 9 years in service, cap. 1000 gals Imp. weight 11,400 stationed at Bedford Row Station, 3 horse hitch, built in England, in good condition.

Fire Engine "Devonshire" Shand & Mason, 20 years in service, cap. 300 gals Imp. weight 3500 lbs, 2 horse in reserve, stationed at Isleville, Gottingen St., built in England, in fair condition.

Fire Engine, Chebucto, Cole Bros., 42 years in service, cap. 500 gals. wine, weight 6500 lbs, stationed at West St, 2 horse hitch, built in United States.

Both of these Reserve Engines working parts have been overhauled and engines have been painted and are now in fairly good condition.

Gentlemen—I beg to submit herewith my Twentieth Annual Report.

Fire Alarm Telegraph.—Two new boxes have been installed during the year, No. 123 at the corner of Tower Road and South St., and No. 95 at the corner of Livingstone and Agricola Streets, making a total of 61 boxes, the situation of which is appended. The Fire Alarm Telegraph service has been satisfactory during the period covered by this report. The service rendered is remarkably reliable when it is considered that a large part of the apparatus has been in use for 40 years. As I intimated in a previous report, expenditure for apparatus to take the place of old and badly worn equipment will be necessary before many years; and it should be given attention before too large an amount will be needed at one time.

Wire Inspection.—The Board of Wiring Examiners held seven meetings during the year. Nine Wiring Contractor's licenses were applied for, seven of which were granted, but one afterwards cancelled for cause. Nine candidates were examined for proficiency in wiring, three of which were granted the usual certificates. During the year 766 Wiring were issued, 1587 inspections and tests of wiring work Permits were made, and 677 permits for services were granted. This represents an increase of work in this department of more than 20% over previous years, and as noted in previous reports, this work which has increased nearly every year is now entirely too great to be efficiently done with the present staff. Owing to the mildness of the winter, electric pipe thawing apparatus was not required.

When the City was first incorporated, and until April 12th, 1849, the Corporation consisted of a Mayor, six Aldermen and twelve Common Councillors, the Mayor being elected by the Aldermen and Common Councillors from among the Aldermen. In 1849 the office of Common Councilman was abolished. From 1850 to 1853 the Mayors were elected by the citizens from the members of the City Council, or from gentlemen who had previously served as Aldermen or Common Councillors. Wm. Caldwell was the first Mayor elected by the citizens under this system. In 1854 the Act in relation to the election of Mayor was further amended by providing that the people should not be restricted to persons who had served in the City Council in their choice for Mayor. The only occasion on which this privilege was availed of was in 1870, in the election of Hon. W. A. Henry. From 1841 to 1882 the general civic elections were held in October of each year. From April, 1883 to April 1912 the general elections for a Mayor and six Aldermen were held annually in April. The Board of Control system which came into effect in 1913 made no change in the election or term of office of the Mayor. The civic year extends from 1st May in any one year to 30th April in the year following.

CITY COUNCIL.

The Act of Incorporation of the City of Halifax passed the House of Assembly April 10th, 1841. On May 12th, 1841, an election was held in each of the wards of the City for three Common Councilmen for each ward. The first meeting of the City Council was held in the County Court House May 13th, 1841. The Council from 1841 to 1849 consisted of six Aldermen and twelve Common Councillors. The following table shows the dates of election and the names of the gentlemen composing the City Council between those years, designating the Aldermen and Common Councilmen respectively and the wards they represented. The first Common Councillors were elected by the citizens. Subsequently the Common Councillors were elected by the ratepayers. The Common Councillors from among themselves chose the Aldermen; and the Aldermen and Common Councilmen from out of the Aldermen elected the Mayors. Each year six senior Common Councilmen and three senior Aldermen retired, the order of seniority being fixed by the Council. The following lists do not contain the names of gentlemen who were elected but did not serve in the City Council because of unwillingness to serve, disqualification, irregularity of election, or other reasons.
