Taxes is read.

To His Worship the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen
and City Council.

Humbly Sheweth

That your Petitioner has held for several
Years past the Office of Collector of Road Taxes for the Town of Halifax,
and is now enjoying the same office under the City regulations.

That under the Incorporation, the Citizens are notified for Road
Work, or rather the Road Taxes are collected by Wards, which
throws on your Petitioner a labour which he thinks he is
justified in asporting is equal to double or nearly so of what
he was obliged to perform before the town was Incorporated,
because every Method is adopted to evade the calls of your
Petitioner for Road money by removals from Ward to Ward and in
other ways. That without your petitioner's exertions, by which
he thinks that more money has been collected and more work
performed than used to be formerly, in consequence of your
petitioner's Commission being reduced from seven and a half to
five per cent. he has not been able to realize an average more
than fifty three or fifty four pounds a Year, and when it is
considered that he has a wife and a large family dependant
on him for support, he would most respectfully submit, that such
a sum is not adequate to the purpose.

That your Petitioner in order to aid him in his living, opened
a small Shop, but has found he cannot succeed in it, owing
to his holding the office of Collector of Road Taxes, many who

would deal with him being afraid to call at his Shop lest he should know their residence and demand of them their Taxes.

That your petitioner would most respectfully throw himself upon the clemency of your Worship, the Aldermen and City Council, praying that they would be pleased to take the circumstances into your most favorable consideration and allow that his commission may be increased to seven and a half per Cent as allowed to former Collectors or such other relief in the premises as to your Worship, Aldermen and Council may seem meet.

And your petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray &c.

Read the following Communication from A. Eliot Esquire Naval Storekeeper addressed to James Freeman Esquire Chairman of Commissioners of Streets:

Halifax Yard
6th August 1842

Sir,
I have the honor to acquaint you that the immunity from the impost of Road Money which has for several years past been conceded to the people employed in H.M. Naval Yard, on account

August 9th

of their services as firemen, having been withdrawn at the present time on the ground that they do not constitute a regular Fire Company recognised by Law; I have felt it my duty to represent the same to Vice Admiral Sir Charles Adam, who on a consideration of the circumstances has been pleased to express his opinion that it would be unreasonable that the people should be compelled to rise from their beds, as has frequently been the case in winter and to assist in extinguishing fires in Town for a service which they have always performed with zeal and alacrity and, as there is reason to believe, at times with considerable advantage in the preservation of property, without their possessing the privileges enjoyed by other persons similarly situated, as well as that the business of the Yard should be interrupted in the day time for the same purpose, as has occasionally happened, and has accordingly desired me to communicate with you on the subject, and to express his hope that the Commissioners of Roads may, on mature consideration, be induced to waive their claim against the Yard people and to extend to them the same immunity as is allowed to the firemen of the Town.

Resolved, That the Commissioners of Streets be directed to inform the Naval Storekeeper that the City Council cannot grant the prayer of the Memorial as the Law does not exempt the persons alluded to.

It having been brought to the notice of the City Council that an Establishment for the manufacture of Articles of a combustible nature is now carried on in premises in Water Street, occupied by one W. Fisher. The Firewards of Ward No 3 are hereby authorized and required to have the same removed immediately, and if not done to take such measures as the Law points out, to have the danger remedied.

An Ordinance

To prevent disorderly Riding and to regulate the driving of Carriages on the Streets of the City of Halifax.

1. Be it Ordained by the Mayor, Aldermen and Common Council of the City of Halifax now in Council convened, That from and after due approval and publication of this Ordinance, or immediately after it shall otherwise legally come into force and operation, it shall not be lawful for any person to ride at full speed, or gallop, or a fast trot, any Horse, Mare, Gelding or Steed, on any Public Street, Lane or Highway, in this City.
2. Be it further Ordained, That all and every person or persons who shall hereafter drive any Truck, sled or wheel Carriage, used for the carriage of Goods, or otherwise, within the City of Halifax, shall not, on any pretence whatever, drive swifter than a slow and easy trot; and shall at all times take care to lead his, her, or their Horse or Horses with a Halter, or guide it or them with proper reins

3. Be it further Ordained, That each and every and all person or persons who shall hereafter drive any Chaise, Sleigh, or other Carriage whatsoever within the City of Halifax, shall drive the same in a moderate and careful manner, and no faster than a trot.

5. Be it further Ordained, That hereafter when the driver of any Carriage, Sleigh or Sled, on any of the Streets, Lanes or Highways, within the City of Halifax, passes or attempts to pass another Carriage, Sleigh or Sled, having its head in the same direction, such driver shall take care to pass on the right side of such Carriage, Sleigh or Sled so as to leave a sufficient way open on his left hand for the safety of the Carriage, Sleigh or Sled, which he is passing or about to pass, and that all drivers of Carriages, Sleighs or Sleds meeting other such vehicles shall, as they face each other in their respective routes, pass on each others right hand side, leaving sufficient room and way open as aforesaid; and all Carriages, Sleighs and Sleds, at all times both in the night and the day, shall hereafter be obliged to keep on the side of the Street, Lane or Highway, herein appointed.

4. Be it further Ordained, That every and all person or persons who, in summer or winter, shall drive any Gig, Chaise, Carriage, Waggon, Cart, Truck, Sleigh or Sled, on any Street, Lane or Highway, within the City of Halifax, every such person or persons shall always hereafter leave the centre of such Street, Lane or Highway, on his right hand side.

6. Be it further Ordained, That whenever any Carriage, Waggon, Cart, Truck, Sleigh or Sled, shall at any time hereafter intentionally stop or be suffered to stand, loaded or unloaded on any of the said Streets, Lanes or Highways, within the City aforesaid, every such carriage, Waggon, Cart, Truck, Sleigh or Sled shall not be placed nearer to the centre of such Street, Lane or Highway, than eighteen inches.

7. Be it further Ordained, That every and all person or persons offending against any of the regulations of this Ordinance shall upon Conviction, on the oath of one credible witness, before the Mayor, or any Alderman of the said City, or any one of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace within the said City, forfeit and pay for each and every offence the sum of Ten Shillings, and in case of refusal or neglect to pay such fine, judgment shall upon such conviction be entered up and levied by Warrant of distress on the Goods and Chattels of such offender, and for the want thereof, he, the said offender, shall
