— An Ordinance —

Relative to lighting the City by Gas.

Be it Ordained by the Mayor Aldermen and Common Councilmen of the City of Halifax in City Council duly convened.

1st That whenever this Ordinance shall come in force agreeably to the 51st Section of an Act passed in the fourth year of Her present Majesty's Reign entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Town of Halifax;" and whenever a Majority of the Owners of Property from one corner to another inclusive of such corners in any Street of the City shall make application agreeably to the Act passed in the eighth year of the reign of her present Majesty, entitled "An Act in further addition to the Act to Incorporate the Town of Halifax;" the City Council shall by Committee or otherwise proceed to ascertain the number of lamps and the expense of lighting the portion of the City designated in any application so to be made as aforesaid, and also to contract with any Gas Company for the setting up and fixing of lamp posts and lamps and the supply of Gas at such places within the limits of such application as they may determine to be convenient and necessary, and the said Council shall annually assess for the same under the provisions of the said last mentioned Act.

2^{ndly} That three fit and disinterested persons shall be nominated and appointed by the City Council to appraise the property and to be Assessors of Gas Light rates within the limits for which such application is made and the persons so nominated shall within ten days thereafter, be notified by the said Mayor to attend at the Mayor's Office in the said City to take upon themselves respectively the Oath of Office hereafter prescribed, and upon their appearance to take such Oath the Mayor shall administer the same and cause a Record thereof to be made in the City Books.

3^{dly} That it shall be the duty of the Assessors without loss of time to examine and value all the several properties of the Street or portion of the City proposed to be lighted and to put a fair and proportional rate upon the respective proprietors of the houses and buildings comprehended within the limits for which the application shall be made as aforesaid; and the said Assessors shall make a return of such their appraisement and Assessment to the Mayor at his Office within twenty days after their qualification by the Oath aforesaid to be submitted to the City Council for their approval.
