Halifax July 10th 1847

Your Worship
Sir

As you have desired to be informed about the complaints sent in against the Surveyors I here state the particulars

Last week all the western Vessels were detained more than a week, having been detained by the Eastern wind. Several arrived from the Eastward on Saturday, and wanted Surveyors on Monday; and the whole of the western fleet came in on Sunday, in consequence of which there was a large number of applicants, who could not be supplied in one day, but I endeavoured to give them their turn. Many are ready to complain if they are not immediately attended to

This would not be doing justice to those who have been patiently waiting

We can one of the Surveyors has been sick all this week which has been rather unfortunate. They have been well supplied hitherto and the work was done last week in two days. I think if we had another active man added to the number it would

prevent the inconvenience of last week

We have worked from sunrise to sunset in the busy season and are willing to do so when numbers are waiting. But to put in too many would not give a living to those in Office, and an active young man would be unwilling to give up a certainty for an uncertainty. I have spoken to Mr David Hankin on the subject who would be willing to take office, I would therefore recommend him as a suitable person: awaiting your worship's approval and appointment

To His Worship the Mayor, the

the City of Halifax -

The memorial of the undersigned

Respectfully sheweth,

That the slaughter house on
one of the Spring Garden Lots, at present in the
occupation of the Messrs Rodgers, where the cattle
required for the fulfillment of the Army Contract
and for other purposes, are killed, and where also
Messrs Rodgers are in the habit of keeping a large
number of pigs, has long been felt by your
Memorialists inhabitants or owners of Property
in that vicinity to be an intolerable nuisance, and
that now when the surrounding population is rapidly
increasing, while at the same time the City is
threatened, at this sultry season too, with the visitation
of Typhus Fever, and other contagious and dangerous
diseases they feel satisfied that it cannot be
suffered to remain in that locality without serious
deterioration to the value of the adjoining property
and manifest danger to the health of the community;

Your Memorialists therefore respectfully
solicit that you will be pleased to take these
facts into your serious consideration and direct
the removal of the said Slaughter House to some
other situation, where such objections would not
apply to it

duty bound will ever pray. &c &c

Halifax 26th July 1847

Johns Worship the Mayor and City Council
"Gentlemen"

The Committee to whom was referred the petition of Stephen Studley and others in reference to obstructions on the South of Common Lots Spring Garden Road, do report that they visited the Premises, and that they found as stated by the Petitioners Ground to a large extent being part and parcel of the Common in possession of the Commissioners of the Poor's Asylum, used by them for growing hay and Potatoes, and a very extensive Lot in the occupation of Mr. Steagers used by him as a pasture for sheep the Ground so occupied extends along the entire South part of the Common or Spring Garden Lots well and securely fenced, blocking up one of the two Roads running through the said Lots North & South

Your Committee view the closing up of the Road alluded to, as an unwarrantable measure, seriously affecting the rights of the Citizens

Your Committee beg to recommend that measures be forthwith adopted for having the said Road opened, the charge attending which should in the opinion of Your Committee be sustained by the Commissioners of the Poor's Asylum

Your Committee on application to John Liddle Esquire, under whose Superintendance the letting of the Lots took place, were given to understand that at the original or first letting it was distinctly understood or implied, that the Common on the South of the Lots was to remain open, so that the parties occupying might have access to their premises on the South

Your Committee also state for the information of the Council that they cannot find any Memorandum in reference to the letting, the terms or conditions thereof, of the Grounds occupied by the Commissioners of the Poor's Asylum and all Stages.

Your Committee therefore recommend that an inquiry be immediately instituted to ascertain when and by whom said parcels of Grounds were let and Your Committee feel called upon to suggest that the most energetic and prompt measures be forthwith taken, to place, if at all practicable, the City in possession of the said Grounds.
