Letter from City Treasurer rel. to Common Funds

Sir
The Committee of the Common Property having expressed a desire that \$400 of the sum lately borrowed for that department should be deposited in the Banks on interest until required. I beg leave to report for the information of the City Council that the sum of \$2000 obtained from Mr. Penny having proved insufficient to meet the payment of Warrants presented to me. I had expended about \$200 of the Common fund to satisfy pressing demands on the City, I would further state for consideration that the balance now in my hands about \$300 will be required towards meeting the current expenses of the City including the payment of the Constables and night Watch and a quarters Salary which will become due next month to the City Officers. It cannot be expected that any considerable amount will be collected from the Assessment of the Current Year within

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within three months from this date. I would therefore respectfully suggest for your consideration, if it would not be prudent to pay the interest for that period to the Commissioners of the Common rather than incur the inconvenience which will arise if the claims of the parties mentioned were not met with punctuality.

The Committee have reason to believe that among the names of those who appear to be in arrears, it will be found that several hold receipts from Mr Scott, which payments have not been credited in the return books, when these amounts are ascertained they will have to be added to the deficiency already reported. The Committee recommend that the Commissioners of Streets should employ a competent person to call on all those whose names remain upon the Books for 1850. 1851. 1852 as not having paid or written

Mr Scott has paid for summons &c in some cases where the amounts have not been received or recovered from the parties sued, whatever sums have been thus disbursed by him must be passed to his credit whenever he hands in a statement of the account

Supplementary Report. Since the preceding report was drawn up an account current has been furnished by Mr Scott which the Committee have examined, after giving him credit for some items and debiting him with others of which they were not previously aware. They find that a balance of eighty pounds seven shillings and eight pence (£80.7s.8) is due to the City instead of (£80.1s.6), as stated in the preceding report. Besides this Mr Scott surcharges himself with £20.8.0 received for 1851, but has not returned the names of the parties from whom the surplus was obtained. The Committee have not included this amount in the balance which they report to be due, as they are of opinion that it will be the better plan to wait until all those persons who appear to be in arrears are called on. The report to be handed in by the collector will then show the additional amount with which Mr Scott will have to be charged. The Committee have however charged Mr Scott with five pounds thirteen shillings (£5.13.0) which he admits has been collected by him in advance for 1852. Of these five pounds thirteen shillings Mr Scott is entitled to his commission on a part but the Committee
