Memorial to Governor and Council re: to Water Lot near Fresh Water Bridge

Province of Nova Scotia
To His Excellency Sir J. Gaspard Le Marchant Knight Lieutenant Governor &c &c and to Her Majesty's Honorable Executive Council

Respectfully Sheweth
The Memorial of the City of Halifax
That in the year 1833 Mr John Therman obtained possession of a certain Water Lot near Fresh Water Bridge in Halifax under a promise from the Government of a Crown Grant for the same in his favour on certain conditions to be by him fulfilled,

That one of the conditions was that he should bear the expense of making the road along the Shore as far as his lot extended,

That Mr Therman having failed to make the road as stipulated the Government instructed the Commissioners of Streets for Halifax to make the same and ordered that he should repay them the expense before his Grant should pass
That

That the Commissioners of Streets accordingly expended the sum of \$41.12.7 in making that portion of the road and the promise of a Grant was reserved to Mr Tremain subject to his refunding them that sum and otherwise complying with the original terms of allotment.

That Mr Tremain not having paid the above amount the Commissioners of Streets purchased from him for the sum of Thirty pounds all his right and interest in the Water lot as well under his promise from Government of a Grant as for his expenses in improving the same and the deed by which he conveyed his interest having been submitted to the Governor in Council in December 1833 the Council was pleased to advise that the said lot be granted to the Commissioners of Town property, as soon as they should be incorporated on condition of their paying to the Commissioners of the Streets the sum of \$43 being the expense incurred by them in making the road and in purchasing Mr Tremains claim to the lot.

That there does not appear to have been any subsequent proceeding respecting said Water lot, and the facts above stated have very recently come to the knowledge of the City Council

That under the Act of Incorporation (first passed as a temporary law in 1841 and finally a perpetual Act in 1851) the rights and functions of the trustees and Commissioners of Town property and receipt and management of the funds applicable to Streets as well as the appointment and control of the Commissioners of Streets, are wholly vested in the City Council. The City authorities suppose the delay in claiming this Grant to which the City appears entitled has been accidentally and probably owing to the change in the mode of administering the affairs of the City which was consequent on its incorporation in 1841.

Considering therefore that the City is fully entitled to receive of the Government a Grant of the Water lot in question, the omission to ask for which earlier has been caused by the facts not being previously known to any of their Officers, and annexing hereto Copies of the several minutes of the Hon^{ble} Provincial Executive Council relative thereto in proof of the above statement

The Mayor and Council of the said City of Halifax respectfully pray Your Excellency and Honors will be pleased to take the foregoing matters into consideration and to direct a Grant of said Water lot to be issued in favour of
