Batavia 23rd June 1856

The Superintendent in submitting his first
Quarterly Report begs leave to state for the information
of His Worship the Mayor and City Council that
during the first two weeks after taking office his
operations were principally confined to scraping
the streets and carting off the mud, which has
tended in a great measure to lessen the quantity
of dust in the lower parts of the City, and he
intends in a future work on the Streets to confine
himself to the use of good street material which
he considers the only means of relieving the City
from the dust nuisance, an expenditure of \$2000
a year for Surface improvements and \$1000 for Sewage
in a few years would if properly expended, add
much to the comfort of the Citizens, and rectify
many nuisances which now exist, from the increase
of the Road Tax under the New Law the Superin-
tendant believes such improvements to be reasonably
practicable.

In Ward 5 Grays Lane, leading from West
Wharf to Lockman Streets has been levelled, the
gutters opened and side walks improved, Lockman
Street has had the gutters and drain opened,
in City Street the gutters have been opened and the
surface drain and Street improved Cornwallis St.
between Brunswick & Gottingen Street has been raised
in the centre & the rocks removed, Brunswick Street
has been paved on both sides from Cunards North
to Cornwallis Street the side Walks raised and
gravelled the centre of the Street will require about 6
inches of Gravel to make it a good Street.

Proctors Lane has been raised in the centre from
Brunswick to Water Street and the rock at the South
side removed. The side Walks will be improved

and the gutters paved.

The Rock has been removed and the centre of the Street raised leading past the Ball Court to the Common an extensive flow of water being diverted from its natural outlet at Bourne's dock, causes the sewer which is not of sufficient capacity to contain so large a quantity to overflow the Street and the consequence is that £60 will hardly make the street equal to what it was in 1853

Water Street from the Centre of Ward 3 to the Spit Row in No 2 Ward is undergoing repair and will be finished in such a manner to suit so good a thoroughfare. The side walks will be finished in conformity.

Blowers Street Ward 2 has been raised in the centre from Grafton to Argyle St. the gutter on the east side of Grafton Street south to Spring Garden Road and on the North side of Spring Garden Road to Bannington Street has been paved. Bannington Street has been raised in the centre from Sackville to Prince Street. The east side of Bedford Row has been paved and the side walk raised.

Granville Street has also been paved on the east side and the side walks raised.

The expenditure up to Friday the 20th June is as follows

There is now due for Stone and Gravel about £75 which will nearly absorb the credit granted by the Council for the Street service, and as it will be the middle of July before the return of the Road Tax will be made and allowing for the time of serving the notices for payment and the time allowed by Law for the payment it is not probable any monies of consequence will be paid in before the 1st September it would therefore be advisable to extend the credit already granted to meet the emergencies of the Street Service, all of which is respectfully submitted.
