To His Worship the Mayor and the City Council of Halifax
my opinion having been required as to whether
under the present laws, it is competent for your Honorable Body to appoint
an assistant to the City Treasurer. I have now the honor to submit a reply

As I read the Charter the power of appointing
an assistant cannot be exercised, without the danger of releasing the Treasurer
of that responsibility which it was the obvious Policy of the Act. should be
Created and exist.

The 4th Section of the Charter directs that "the City Treasurer
shall receive and collect all rates and taxes payable by the Inhabitants of the
City, and shall also receive all other monies of the City that are paid over
to him and be responsible for the same

It is clear that this is a responsibility which is personal
and cannot neither be legally delegated nor interfered with. The Treasurer
is sworn to the faithful discharge of his duty, and is to Execute a Bond
with two Sureties in the sum of Two Thousand Pounds - if another
Person was placed in his office, his Power and responsibility would cease
to be individual and his liability and that of his Sureties, being altered, by
a divided responsibility the object of the act would be wholly defeated

I have not lost sight of the 59th Section of the Charter which
Enacts that the Council "may appoint such additional Officers of any kind
as they may deem necessary or Expedient to carry out the Power vested in
the Corporation by Law"

This of course means such appointments as would not
be incompatible with the Charter and according to my judgement, to appoint
an assistant to the Treasurer would be inconsistent with those Sections of the
Charter which define the duties and responsibility of the Treasurer

A Committee of the Halifax Cricket Club beg leave to

Enclosed document, which they intend likewise to bring before the notice of
the Mayor General in command of the Troop

Pending the decision of the suit at law which arose between
the Civic authorities and the Major General lately in command in consequence
of the granting of leave by the former of the portion of the West side of the Common
to be used by the Club as a Cricket Ground, the Club endeavored to obtain
a lease of a private field, and succeeded after much difficulty in obtaining
one of the Ground which they now occupy - They have received notice

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from the Proprietor that the lease will terminate at the end of the present season, and they are induced in consequence to try to ascertain whether the Ground on the Common may not be placed at their disposal as originally intended, on the terms herewith submitted. It will be recollecte that the lease of the Ground on the Common, was only granted after the Military had appropriated to their own use the whole of the neighbouring portion - which they required for an exercising Ground, and moreover that the Inauguration of the Pond, was enclosed with the express sanction and approval of Sir Caspara Le Marchant, who also urged the Council to enclose in like manner the Ground afterwards leased to the Cricket Club

The Club have ascertained through a member of the Committee that the authorities in England have no objection to their obtaining the use of the Ground as desired - but leave the whole matter to be settled between the Civil and Military Authorities in the and further that they regard the Council as having manifested a "want of pluck" in consenting to the terms of the recent compromise, as will appear by a letter which they are ready to submit to your Worship

The Committee trust that by the course they are pursuing an amicable arrangement may be made brought about between the Civil and Military Authorities which will be favourable to their wishes. See list of Propositions on File for August 1862

The petition of the undersigned Residents in the City
Respectfully sheweth

That your Worshippful Body has the power vested
in it by law, to make such regulations, as from time to time may seem
necessary, with regard to the Slaughtering of Animals for food, and that with
a view to promote health, and cleanliness, the Slaughter Houses of the City
were some years since, removed from the Wharves to the back Streets & Suburbs

Your petitioners submit that the same circumstances
which caused their removal from the Wharves, now require that all Slaughter
Houses, should be prohibited within the limits of the City

In the neighbourhood, of several of these Establishments
a large population has grown up and is increasing, to whom the Effluvia
arising from the offal is an intolerable nuisance, greatly affecting their comfort
and very injurious to their health; and depreciating the value of their property
while the constant pollution the surface drains running into the Sewers is
calculated to operate most injuriously upon the Sanitary arrangements of the
whole City

Your petitioners therefore respectfully request that your Worshippful
Body will take the matter into early consideration and adopt such means of
remedy as the case may require

Sir

I regret to be obliged to report
to the Board of Health that the situation of the building now used as a City
Hospital is very prejudicial to the recovery of the sick, in consequence of the
proximity of a neighbouring Slaughter House

I need not state the well known fact that leaving
animal matter produces an Effluvia in the highest degree prejudicial to health
but I could not have supposed, had I not experienced it, that the air could
become so contaminated from this cause, during the recent Warm Weather

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Fortunately there have not been many cases requiring treatment at the Hospital and as the hot weather is now past and the building has been rented but for one year there will be an opportunity to provide a Building for that purpose in a suitable locality before next summer. but I feel it my duty to inform the Board of Health thus early that the removal of the Hospital is imperatively demanded from the cause before mentioned

The Committee of City Property have to report for the information of the City Council. that from an inspection made by the Chairman and the City Architect. they find the flooring and joists in the basement of the Engine House at the Grand Parade are in a state of decay, and some portions of it in a complete state of rottenness. they also found that the decay in the flooring is beginning to affect the Ladders belonging to the Fire Department. this decay is caused for want of proper ventilation

It is proposed by the Committee to replace such of the joists and flooring as is actually necessary. and also to place Iron Gratings in the doors, and cut air Holes through the Foundation Wall. South end of the Building

In accordance with this view the City Architect has prepared a Specification which is annexed. "See Specification on file"

The Committee refer this subject to the favourable consideration of the Council, and ask their permission to have the work done with as little delay as possible otherwise a large number of valuable Ladders will be rendered useless when the following Resolution is introduced
