The humble petition of Donald Soaser

Respectfully sheweth that your petitioner was sued at the last term of the Supreme Court for alleged false imprisonment by one John Beadly, and a verdict of \$40 damages given against him and four watchmen

Your petitioner would respectfully state that the act for which the said action was brought against him was done by him in the execution of his duty which he conscientiously believed required the said John Beadly to be arrested and taken to the station

that on the night in question your petitioner was informed and verily believed that Water Street was in a very disorderly and excited state and as he did not know who the party arrested was he feared he might be in some way connected with the disorderly parties spoken of and thought that his duty would not allow him to pass him unnoticed your petitioner would further state that he had not in the slightest degree any personal feeling or enmity against the said John Brady never having been acquainted with him or spoken to him and that he has not any such feeling now, and that nothing was further from his wishes and intentions that to inflict unnecessary pain or annoyance on him.

Your petitioner therefore humbly prays that as the act complained of was committed by him in the discharge of his duty under a feeling (however erroneous) that he was imperatively bound to do so and without any malice or hostility to Mr. Brady your worship will not allow him to be punished for an error of judgement in the discharge of his public duty and that you will be pleased to direct the amount of such verdict and costs to be paid out of the City funds and as in duty bound will ever pray.

The petition of the undersigned Citizens of Halifax humbly sheweth, that they owners of real estate in that portion of the City known as Richmond and that in common with their fellow Citizens in other portions thereof they have been deeply interested in the efforts which the Council for some years past have been making to quare and protect the health of the City by removing outside its limits the Slaughter houses which have been so long tolerable. They desire to bring to the notice of the Council that while they are thus endeavoring to abate the nuisance by doing away with those already in existence another is about being at Chamberly door to their very great injury and annoyance as well as detriment to the surrounding property and they are of opinion that if said Slaughter Houses are detrimental to Public Health where they are now located (which they fully admit) the evil will be increased one hundred fold by allowing them to be placed upon this the greatest thorough fare of the City they therefore trust that the Council will take prompt and effective measures to prevent the erection of any building for said purposes in said locality
