The last Report which we had the honor to submit for the information of the City Council embraced a detailed statement of the operations completed Report with Lockman Street Extension from the date of our appointment as Commissioners of Lockman down to the period when further progress was impeded by the adverse judgment of His Honor the Judge in equity, reserving us from remaining certain property then remaining on the line of Street.

Legislature authorizing the settlement by arbitration of the claims on the existing dissatisfied owners, we were early placed in possession of a clear right of way for the entire Street, subsequently in direction of your honorable body. The awards of the appraisers in the first place in these particular instances, and the additional sums granted by the Arbitrators, were in every case but one that of Mr. J. H. Johnson paid over to the parties legally entitled to receive them without estimating the law costs, which, it is confidently expected by us, will be taxed by the Court, as provided by the statute, in a few days hence. The sum of fifteen thousand seven hundred and thirty three dollars has been paid out in additional awards, thus making the whole cost of the right of way Sixty Eight thousand Three hundred and seventy three dollars. This refers, however, merely to the value of the property taken for the laying out of the road as originally contemplated, the widening of the next or land at the north-end, of section No 1 opening into Cornwallis Street, to the same width, as that determined on by the whole extension of Dockman Street, which was subsequently authorized by your Council, has, of course, materially increased the expenditure for the right of way as well as proportionately augmented the estimated cost for construction purposes. No special provision having been made to meet the outlay thus occasioned, your Commissioners, as instructed, paid the various amounts, including arbitrator fees, out of the funds provided for the original work. This unexpected and somewhat heavy drain on the limited fund placed at our disposal necessitates, at the time, a call upon the Council, for a further instalment to complete the work of the extension, it may perhaps be as well to mention here that the amount paid to the owners of land in the narrow section referred to, was Six thousand One hundred and Sixty Eight Dollars.

Having thus briefly referred to the satisfactory manner in which the difficulties which beset us, at the time we last reported to the Council, were overcome, and presented generally the financial aspect of the undertaking - the full details

will

will be found in the appendix - we desire to  
make a remark or two respecting the present  
condition of the road itself.

It is no less a subject  
to regret to the Commissioners, as it is, certainly  
one of disappointments to the citizens, that  
the street is not much further advanced to-  
wards completion than it is. During the whole  
period that the making of the street has been  
under contract the weather has been most favorable  
for the prosecution of work. The past season  
has been particularly so, and yet the rate of progress  
has not been, we are sorry to say, by any means  
commensurate with the opportunities afforded.  
Repeatedly, have your Commissioners urged  
the contractor to make vigorous work, but despite  
their entreaties the undertaking has continued  
to drag its slow length along. It is true the  
provisions of the specification provided a mode  
whereby the work can be forced to a more  
speedy completion, but your Commissioners  
throughout the whole of their doings in connection  
with the Extension, have been careful to act in  
the most liberal spirit, and afford every possible  
facility to the contractor in the carrying out  
of his contract.

While obliged thus to speak  
of the past, we are pleased to be in a position  
to inform the Council, that there are cheering  
indications now that henceforth the work  
will be accelerated. A stone crusher has  
been imported at a heavy expense of \$4000  
Damon, and erected on the ground, which  
your Commissioners are assured of the contractor  
will break up the quantity of rock required  
for macadamizing, supposing at a less expense  
and in a far shorter time than if done by  
hand labor. During the summer the Gas  
Company and the Commissioners of Water  
Supply laid down their pipes through both  
sections of the Extension. The sewer is  
finished, as are likewise all the catch pipes  
and cross sewers necessary to complete the  
surface drainage of the roadway, of course  
at the present time the new street is very  
rugged and uneven, but the future  
outlay will be expended entirely on surface  
work, and will more fully define the form  
and completion of the whole.

Report the portion of the Extension already referred to on the continued ground that the awards in their particulars were inadequate compensation for the damages sustained. The petitions by which the grievances were set forth were sometimes sent submitted to the Council and were, by resolution, handed over to us. Now we beg respectfully to suggest that the consideration of this subject rest altogether with the Council!

Your Commissioners are not even in a position to give any information on the relationships of the different cases, other than the Council itself is in possession of already.

The other matters referred to us from time to time, by the Council, have been carefully & punctually attended to. The matter complained of by the Admiralty authorities has been so arranged that no further difficulty from this quarter need be apprehended, & the suit threatened against the City by the man Millet, who, it was alleged, fell into an excavation on the line which, it was stated, had not been properly protected, has been averted. On the receipt of the papers from your Council, the contractor was at once notified of the fact, and we are assured the matter has been arranged satisfactorily to all parties. At any rate the City will be exempt from any loss in the matter.

As previously mentioned a detailed financial statement accompanied this Report. The total amount that has been placed to our credit by your Council up to the present time is \$100,000. The paper, in question, shows that the sum of \$100,803.95 was drawn from the City Treasurer up to the 1<sup>st</sup> of December. The monthly certificates appended will very approximately explain the different quantities of work completed and also those remaining unfinished as well as amount of expenditure for each description of work and the amount yet to be paid on the contract. It will be perceived therefore, that your Commissioners will require to be placed in funds in order to meet the next monthly statement.
