The Committee on License have had under consideration the various matters referred to them and beg to report as follows -

Report of
Committee of
License relative
to License

Your Committee are of opinion from the views expressed by the Council that it is not expedient to attempt any Legislation on the License question during the present session of the Legislature - The time now being in their judgment, too limited to give the subject that attention requisite in preparing a Bill to meet the difficulties with which it is surrounded. -

Your Committee feel that great weight should attach to so large and influential a petition as that presented to this Council, and the views and wishes of petitioners are entitled to and demand the earnest attention of the Council -

The Committee agree with the petitioners that the increase of places where intoxicating liquors are sold, is indeed a great evil - and they recommend that the whole subject of the License Law shall be taken up by the Council during the summer, or referred to such Committee as the Council may appoint, with instructions to so amend the Law as to remedy any existing defects, and have a bill prepared ready to be presented to the Legislature, at the next session. -

While your Committee are ready to admit that the present License Law is in some respects defective, and capable of being improved, they are of opinion that much of the evil existing under it is in consequence of the Law not having been properly carried out and enforced, and with the object of rendering the present law more effective they suggest several regulations which are embodied in a series of resolutions accompanying this report, and which if adopted by the Council, will the Committee believe lead to good results. -

Your Committee are strongly of the opinion that if the Clerks of License, and the Police Force were to exercise a little more vigilance, there would be more convictions of parties for the violation of the License Law, and the number of places where ^{any} liquor is sold contrary to law reduced.

The Committee recommend that the Fees on Licenses be considerably advanced and also ^{further} recommend that the License Law now in force and ordinances relating thereto.

During the past two or three years, as the Council and the Citizens are well aware, very much more attention has been bestowed upon the Common property than it had previously received, probably in great measure, owing to the fact that the value of City interests in these Lots became better known and appreciated, and it was considered that they should be carefully looked after and kept in good condition, the expense attending attending such improvements as have from time to time been suggested and carried out - mainly works of pure necessity - has made the annual income at the disposal of the Committee entirely inadequate to the labor comprised within their jurisdiction, and which is expected of them; as will appear from statement herewith submitted, and the following estimate of the amount of work requisite to be done, -

Nearly all the fences will have to be renewed next season, the posts and railings around the south Common, the fields on the North Common and elsewhere, are decayed and useless, and will require to be replaced in the interest of the citizens,

The whole revenue of the Common, including the rent of the grass fields, is only about \$900, a sum insufficient for the fencing and Gates alluded to, and the expenditure in this way would leave nothing for the work of improvements -

It is well known that the citizens generally take a strong interest in the operations which, during the past few years have been carried on in connection with the Public Gardens, the season has now arrived when it is necessary to decide how much or how little, shall be done in furtherance of this work; and the Committee of with confidence submit this statement of facts and finances to the consideration of the Council.
