1st That first seven sections of the proposed Act are unobjectionable so far as the interests of the City are concerned.

2nd Section 8 is objectionable from two points of view (a) it repeals section 14 of the Charter which provides for its destruction in case of failure to build within three years (the three years expiring 19th April 1887) and for forfeiture of material to the City in the event of cessation of operations for twelve months, and (b) it extends the time of completion of the work until about April 1889.

It is submitted that in any event months cessation of operation should remain as it is. It is further submitted that it is in the interests of the City to insist on completion of the Railway within the time limited by the Charter. If this Company are not prepared to do this another Company may be found to do so.

Should the City agree to the extension it should do so only upon the Company abandoning its monopoly and consenting to the repeal of so much of Section 4 of the Charter as gives it exclusive rights.

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3rd Section 9 of the proposed Act should not be assented to Section 17 of the charter was inserted in the interests of the city and is almost as necessary for that purpose with the amended as with the original charter.

4th Section 10 is unobjectionable. It is submitted that the Committee or Officials whose duty it is to watch City Legislation be instructed to insist in the Legislature upon the foregoing amendments being made before the Bill in question becomes law.
