Dear Mr Mayor

Now that we have made provision for a settlement of Hospital matters between the Province and the City with a view to removing some of the City's grounds of complaint, it is important that there be no misunderstandings. From the information I have received I fear that the City Council has taken action respecting the Hospital under an erroneous impression of the views of the Government and Legislature.

The Council, I am informed, are under the impression that when they have taken over the Hospital, the Provincial character of the Institution will continue, and the Government will pay the greater part of the cost of maintenance. A reference to the official report of the discussion which took place in the House of Assembly on the 20th of April will show that this is a mistake. There are now a number of patients in the Hospital chargeable to the Province. The Government will of course agree to pay a fair sum for these for the present. But we can give no assurance that such an arrangement will be permanent, or continue for any length of time. On the contrary there is every reason to believe that a Provincial Hospital under Government control would be established at an early day. The City built the Hospital for City purposes, and subsequently the property was taken into the partnership formed between the Province and City. The partnership being dissolved, and the City claiming that the Hospital should go back to it, the Government and Legislature have agreed to this, leaving matters of account to be settled by the arbitration. The City is free to do as it pleases with the Hospital, the Government are free to do as they please with respect to the establishment of a Provincial Hospital. It was never contemplated by the Legislature that the City should manage and control a Provincial Hospital. The belief was that the City Council, after full consideration would not wish to maintain an Hospital at the cost of the City, and therefore the building would remain in the hands of the Government. But the possibility that the City would take the building was considered and the general sense of the House was that in that case the Province would have to provide a Provincial Hospital.

While I am of opinion that the best interests of both City and Province would be promoted by the Government controlling the Institution. I do not for a moment question the City Council's right to take the building. But it is important that the expressed views of the Government and Legislature with respect to the establishing of a Provincial Hospital should be clearly before your Council, so that there may be no room for misunderstanding hereafter.

1 Pursuant to the provisions of Section 22 of Chapter 5 of the Acts of 1886 it is agreed that the Province of Nova Scotia accept the control and management of the Provincial and City Hospital notwithstanding anything in the said Act.

2 The question of the sums if any which the City of Halifax should contribute to the maintenance of the said Hospital is reserved for further negotiation and agreement in the meantime it is agreed that for the year ending June 30th 1887 the Hospital shall be conducted by the Government as a Provincial Institution and that the sick poor of the City of Halifax shall be received into the Hospital on the same terms as those of other parties of the Province.

3 The revenues derived from the Murdoch Bequest so called shall accrue to the Province for the year ending on the date aforesaid free from any claim of the City of Halifax but the claim of the City if any as respects the principal sum of such Bequest shall not be prejudiced by this agreement nor shall any claim of either party against the other as respects the said Hospital be effected by this agreement.

The accompanying letter from Fredk. J. Marriott Esq. Secretary to the Halifax Graving Dock Company dated 3rd November together with the proposed plans and specification of the dock having been referred to this Board for examination they have the honour to report as follows:

The Secretary states in his letter that the plans have been approved by the Admiralty but there is no signature of any Admiralty Official upon them signifying such approval which in the opinion of the Board ought to have been appended.

The specification submitted is only general in character being neither full nor complete.

From clause 2 it appears that there must be one or more other specifications embodied in the contracts entered into between the Company and Messrs S. Pearson & Son the Contractors. These contracts and specifications the Board think ought to have been submitted with the plans in order more fully to explain them and the character of the work.

For the above reasons and for others which will presently be given the Board cannot recommend that the City Council approve of the plans and specification now submitted by the Company until certain alterations be made in both, some of which are deemed to be necessary in order to conform with the terms of the Agreement with the City while others appear to be advisable in order to render the dock a more convenient structure for the Mercantile Marine.

It is recommended that the following be added to clause 1 after the word "jetties" viz "and also every other work matter or thing that may be needed to build and complete the dock and every detail or appurtenance thereof or thereto that may be required to render the structure fit in all respects and ready for the reception of vessels".

Also to clause 2 after "1886" add "After the same have been submitted to and received the approval of the City Council of Halifax. The Council reserving the right to amend

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December 21st amend alter or add to any of the clauses or terms thereof that they may deem advisable, but only so far as respects the character and equality of the work and materials employed in its construction."

Also at the end of the specification add the following clause viz: "It is also clearly understood and agreed upon between the parties hereto that all the terms, provisos and conditions contained in the agreement between the City of Halifax and the Halifax Graving Dock Company, Limited, dated 5th October 1885 are to be respected and strictly adhered to and that the said agreement is to be considered as forming part of this specification."

Also to clause 9 page 4 after the word "attached" add "all to be in accordance with designs to be hereafter submitted and approved of in accordance with the agreement between the Company and the City".

Also at the end of the specification add the following clause, viz: It is also clearly understood and agreed upon between the parties hereto that all the terms provisos and conditions contained in the agreement between the City of Halifax and the Halifax Graving Dock Company, Limited, dated 5th October 1885 are to be respected and strictly adhered to and that the said agreement is to be considered as forming part of this specification."

On reference to clause 8, and to the plans it will be seen that it is proposed to construct "the floor, side-walls and entrance to the dock of cement concrete." This the Board regard as a violation of the agreement entered into with the City as it was clearly understood at the time the agreement was drawn up that the structure was to be faced with granite, the terms of the agreement being as follows viz: "The said dock to be a permanent structure of stone and concrete first class and complete in every respect. The approaches thereto, floor altars and coping to be of granite" which in the opinion of the Board means a granite faced structure.

In the first set of plans submitted by the Company the entrance to the dock was shown to be 80 feet in width and the width across the body of the dock at the bottom was 58 feet and these were the dimensions specified in the agreement as required by the City. They have however been greatly enlarged the width of the entrance now being made 89 feet 3 inches and the bottom width of the dock 70 feet.

These enormous dimensions have presumably been required by the Admiralty and in the view of the Board their effect is to render the structure less convenient for commercial purposes than it otherwise might have been as fewer altars are admissible and easy access to any portion of the dock cannot be so well obtained.

While the Board have no desire to embarrass the Company by altering any of the leading dimensions required by the Imperial Government they would suggest that more and better means of access be provided to the bottom of the dock in order to make it as convenient as practicable under the circumstances. They therefore recommend that a flight of steps be placed at the side of each

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December 21st

of the timber slides shown on the plan on either side of the dock at about 140 feet from the entrance also that four additional timber slides with steps attached be constructed, two on either side of the dock and at about equal distances apart.

Under clause 9 it will be seen that the minimum thickness provided for the sidewalls where the excavations are in solid rock is specified to be only two feet, this the Board think should be increased to three feet at the least in order that the work may be of ample solidity and strength.

It is also noted that the specification makes no provision whatever for back and under drainage. This is a matter which requires the most careful consideration as not only does the stability and durability of the work depend upon it but the utmost circumspection is requisite in order to prevent the leakage of water into the dock which in winter time especially would cause serious inconvenience and greatly retard work on shipping with in the dock.

The bottom of the dock is shown on the plans as being constructed level transversely, this is regarded as objectionable on account of not affording proper facility for the water to flow off into the side channels provided for that purpose, it is therefore recommended that the bottom of the structure be either crowned or depressed, proper provision being made in the latter case to carry off the water through suitable drains to be constructed for that purpose.
