If my recommendations are accepted I feel that with the increased efficiency and better feeling among the staff that more work could be accomplished and with a little re-organization I could dispense with the services of one cr two clerks.

J.R.Clancy, Sub-Collector has tendered his resignation to take effect March 31st, and I do not consider 1⁺ necessary to fill this position.

By adopting my recommendations you would not be placing any further burden on the ratepayers as the 1928-29 Estimates would be less than last year by some \$2,000.00
