The following named papers were submitted;

✓ HALIFAX TRADES AND LABOR COUNCIL

Read resolutions submitted by the Halifax Trades and Labor Council as follows,

WHEREAS the amount of direct relief given to families in this City is wholly inadequate,

RESOLVED that the Halifax District Trades and Labor Council protest the amount of direct relief given to married persons and families and request the authorities to increase the amount.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Halifax District Trades and Labor Council favor the formation of a central relief depot for the handling of groceries, commodities, etc., for direct relief for the families of the unemployed as we are of the opinion this would be the most economical system of dispensing relief. If such depot were established a staff would be formed for the administration of such depot from men in the ranks of the unemployed, familiar with the handling of groceries, etc. All goods being bought wholesale and disposed direct at lessened cost to the City.

RESOLVED that the Executive of the Halifax District Trades and Labor Council protest to the City Council the letting of City Work

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contemplated by contract especially sewer work as we maintain this work should be done by the City and the present rate of wages of .40¢ per hour be maintained.

Moved by Alderman Mitchell, seconded by Alderman Minshull that resolution No. 1 be referred to the Relief Committee, and resolution No. 2 to the Committee on Works.

Mr. P. J. Healy appeared on behalf of the Halifax Trades and Labor Council and addressed the Council relative to the two resolutions submitted, also on the question of payment to the Scotia Construction Company until men employed by them are paid wages at the proper scale due them. Motion passed.

BANK ACT

Read letter City Clerk, City of Winnipeg, submitting resolution to amend the Bank Act as follows.

Dear Sir:-

The City of Winnipeg, in common with other urban centres in the Dominion, is finding it increasingly difficult to meet the heavy burden of Unemployment Relief.

At the meeting of Council held on the 7th instant, the following motion was adopted, namely:-

"THAT the City Solicitor be instructed to
"memorialize the Dominion Government to so amend
"the Bank Act as to enable banks doing business in
"Canada to loan money to municipalities in cases
"of emergency such as widespread unemployment, for
"the purpose of constructing, repairing or purchasing
"or assisting in constructing, repairing or
"purchasing any public work or undertaking within
"the jurisdiction of the council of the municipality
"to perform or undertake, including all the lands

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"necessary for same or incidental thereto; to charge interest on all such loans at a rate not exceeding four per centum per annum; and to take security from the municipalities on the strength of such works or undertakings and any such lands as aforesaid in connection therewith".

"AND FURTHER THAT a copy of the resolution be sent to all the chief cities in Canada, with a request that they also memorialize the Dominion Government to the same effect".

In accordance with the instructions contained in this motion, a copy of same is being forwarded to all of the principal Cities in Canada, and it is respectfully requested that they also memorialize the Dominion Government along the lines laid down in the said motion.

Will you kindly bring this matter to the attention of your Council as soon as possible, and I shall esteem it a favor to be advised of the action taken by your Council in this matter.

You will remember that when arrangements were made with the City's bankers, this summer for a temporary loan pending a long term borrowing an amount of \$150,000.00 was included to arrange for the financing in part of the abutters' share of the extensive local improvements which have been carried on in the past three years.

It is now necessary that the money be borrowed and the following resolution is submitted:

WHEREAS by Section 571 of the City Charter it is enacted that whenever money is required to be borrowed to meet the amount of the deferred obligations of abutters for local improvements, the City may borrow from any bank or fund available, the amount required for such purpose and apply the same to the performance of such work and repay the money so borrowed from the monies collected from such abutting owners.

THEREFORE RESOLVED that the City Council, on the recommendation of the Committee of Finance, do approve of the City Treasurer arranging with the Royal Bank of Canada for a loan not exceeding the sum of \$150,000.00 on which interest will be payable at a rate not exceeding 5½% per annum.

WHEREAS the Estimates for the Gardens, Parks and Commons, have had to absorb certain extraordinary costs, as hereinafter set forth, in connection with the administration of the said "Gardens, Parks and Commons" for the Civic Year 1932-33,

AND WHEREAS the said Estimates now have insufficient funds to provide for the ordinary costs of the department for the balance of the said Civic Year.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, (under the provisions of Section 332A of the City Charter and pursuant to approval already given by the Governor-in-Council regarding the participation of the City in a scheme for Direct Relief) that the City do now borrow a sum not exceeding \$1500. from any Bank or available fund for the following purposes; namely,

- Item 1. To meet the cost of wages paid or to be paid to
- (a) foremen supervising the work or removing noxious weeds from public places.
 - (b) grading on Commons.
 - (c) tree pruning in City Streets, and
 - (d) all trucking costs in connection with the aforesaid items as well as trucking of ashes for paths in Gardens; by "direct relief" labourers not exceeding \$1300.
- Item 2. To meet the cost of labour and materials incidental to combatting the chinch bug menance in the Gardens, not exceeding \$200.

Of the money so borrowed an amount of

- (a) \$1300. shall be charged to the appropriation for administering "Direct Relief" and repaid when the general borrowing is made for that purpose, and,
- (b) \$200. shall be charged in the Civic Estimates for 1933-34 and repaid after, May 1st, 1933.

Dear Sir:-

I beg to report on Poll Tax collections for the quarter year ending October 31st, 1932 as per statement attached.

You will notice that we have a decrease in collections for the current year up to date. This is due chiefly to the fact that I have made no special effort as yet to collect the current taxes, but have applied the efforts of myself and staff to the collection of arrears. We will however, make a drive for the current year's taxes in the near future.

There is still a large amount of arrears uncollected. I find it increasingly difficult to collect arrears at the present time. The depression has created so much lack of employment, that I have had to place a very great number of accounts on file marked "Unemployed, - will pay when can". These accounts will be watched closely and as delinquents become able to pay, we will collect same. I feel that there is little also we can do in cases of this kind.

During the past twelve months Poll Tax Collections have increased some \$10,000.00 over the preceding period, and I have every reason to believe that in the coming year we will have a still larger increase.

✓ WATER EXTENSION, INGLIS STREET

Read report of the Committee on Works
and City Engineer re Inglis Street, water extension.

His Worship the Mayor.

Sir:-

I beg to report on the application of Mr. Hugh Grant for an extension of the water pipe on Inglis Street to supply a dwelling that he proposes to erect on the north-west corner of Greenwood and Inglis Street, that the pipe was extended this year from Robie Street westwardly to supply two new houses. West of these there are three houses on the north side of the street which obtain a supply of water from a connection on Robie Street. This water was supplied under an agreement made in 1921 between the City and E. A. Hartling and John A. McKenzie, under the terms of which a special rate of \$30.00 per annum was to be paid by each house taking water from the connection.

The agreement provides that after and when a main pipe is extended along Inglis Street in front of the houses erected or hereinafter erected, the applicants agree to sign whatever bond or agreement is required in connection with the said extension and shall take the water from the said extension and the City shall immediately disconnect the service pipe from the Robie Street main. The agreement also provides that the City may cancel it at any time on giving three months' notice in writing.

The estimated cost of the extension is \$2,100.00 the interest on which at 6% is \$126.00 per annum.

It is recommended that the extension be made when Mr. Grant's house is under construction and that the owners of the three houses now erected and obtaining water from Robie Street be notified that the agreement in 1921 will be cancelled and that they will have to sign a bond for a special rate fixed for Inglis Street and also that they will have to take the water from the new main on this street.

It is recommended that a special rate of \$30.00 be fixed for each of the four houses.

Sir:-

I beg to report on the application of Mr. Richard P. Ward for the extension of the water supply on Connaught Avenue, from Oakland Road southwardly, that he proposes to build a house on the east side of the Avenue between Oakland Road and Regina Terrace. Since his application was made another person has stated that he will build between the ward house and Oakland Road, if the water is laid.

The extension requires about forty-one feet (41') on Oakland Road and two hundred and sixty-six feet (266') on Connaught Avenue. The estimated cost of the work is \$14.00. The interest on this at 6% is \$84.00. I would recommend that the extension be made provided the applicants sign a bond guaranteeing the interest at 6% on the outlay, and that a special bond rate be fixed at \$84.00 per annum. If the second house goes up the amount payable by each will be \$42.00.
