views with alarm and apprehension the disability this City and Province are laboring under due to the inefficient, unsatisfactory and palpably unfair service, or lack of service, furnished this City and Province by the so-called "Trans-Canada Air Service", a service that is not Trans-Canada inasmuch as its eastern terminus is in New Brunswick, thus excluding the Province of Nova Scotia and the Port of Halifax from the advantages of the service it purports to render, and so breaking not only the spirit but the letter of the Act of Confederation.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Council views with increased alarm the partial discontinuance of the service hitherto rendered between Halifax and its sister City of Saint John, and the very material increase in charges made for the totally inadequate service now rendered between these points.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this . Council, on behalf of the citizens of Halifax, places itself definitely on record as being not only dissatisfied but highly indignant with an alleged "Trans-Canada " Air Service that terminates before reaching the boundaries of Nova Scotia, and this Council would respectfully urge the Government of Canada to remove this injustice with a minimum of delay.

- (2) That such persons qualifying as Mayor or Alderman shall continue to maintain such qualification or equivalent qualification in respect of his assessment and the amount of taxes for which he is liable and shall be required in any year ensuing the year which commences his term of office to maintain his eligibility as a voter.
- (3) In the event of such person ceasing to have the qualification hereinbefore enumerated or equivalent qualification, the Mæyor or the Meputy Mayor, if the Mayor is the person concerned shall, upon receipt of a report in writing from the Commissioner of Finance and Accounts and the Assessor that such person has ceased to have the required qualification or equivalent qualification, shall declare that the seat held by such person to be vacant, and shall report to the Council at the first meeting following such declaration, and the Council shall forthwith proceed to hold an election to fill such vacancy.
