no parking on both sides of the street could be erected so that cleaning may be done. Mr. Connell, Engineering Department, reported that he would look into the matter.

Question Alderman Meagher Re: Flea Market - Hunter Street

Alderman Meagher referred to complaints he received from residents of Hunter Street regarding the weekly Sunday Flea Market and their parking problems. Alderman Meagher requested that the Traffic Engineer be asked to look at the street to see what can be done and also to send out cards to the residents so they may make their wishes known.

Question Alderman Meagher Re: Concrete Work - Ward 4

Alderman Meagher referred to concrete work and tender calls for Oxford Street, Quinpool Road, Pacific Street, and Windsor Street, and asked when he may expect this work to be completed.

Mr. Connell, Engineering Department, responded to the question and will report further.

Question Alderman Hamshaw Re: Shoulder - Bedford Highway

Alderman Hamshaw referred to the shoulder on the Bedford Highway between Tremont Drive and Torrington Drive and its condition and asked whose responsibility this repair would be.

Question His Worship the Mayor Re: Cleaning - Coronet Brook

His Worship requested information on when the brook along Coronet would be cleaned out, since this will be the new run-off from Chain Lake.

ADDED ITEMS

Family Units Public Housing

A staff report dated September 23,1980, was submitted.

MOVED by Alderman Downey, seconded by Alderman Wooden that Council approve the setting of the date of October 22,1980 for a public hearing to consider the approval of a contract development agreement for the proposed project. Motion passed.

The City Clerk advised that the suggested date was satisfactory.

Award of Tender 80-93 - Concrete Sidewalk Along Williams Lake Road

A staff report dated September 22,1980, was submitted.

MOVED by Alderman Wooden, seconded by Alderman Clarke that Tender # 80-93 for projects, materials, or services listed for Williams's Lake Road - Lyons to Herring Cove Road be awarded to Standard Paving Maritime Limited for the unit price quoted; project funds being authorized from Account CA020. Motion passed.

Tender 80-147 - Furnace Oil

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A confidential staff report dated September 25,1980 was submitted.

MOVED by Alderman Moore, seconded by Alderman Maley that City Council accept the offer of Imperial Oil immediately.

Motion passed.

Street Closures - SET DATE FOR PUBLIC HEARING

Alderman Shannon requested that two public hearing dates be set to consider these street closures; one to consider the street closure between Artz Street and North Street; and another for street closure between Artz Street and Gerrish Street.

MOVED by Alderman Shannon, seconded by Alderman Downey, that the date of October 22,1980 be set for public hearings to consider street closures a) Artz Street and North and b) Artz Street and Gerrish. Motion passed.

Landmarks Commission

This matter was added at the request of Alderman Shannon.

Alderman Shannon referred to the appointments cf the Landmarks Commission and advised they had run out.

Alderman Shannon suggested, rather than reappointing members under the old Ordinance, Part III of the Municipal Development Plan, Part 6.2 where it had been agreed to set up a committee to amend the Ordinance and bring it in line with the new Heritage Legislation, staff bring in a report on setting up this Committee and its responsibilities, and further, that the new Council take it as a matter of urgency and make appointments to this Committee.

MOVED by Alderman Shannon, seconded by Alderman Meagher that staff be requested to prepare a report on Section 3, Part 6.2 of the Municipal Development Plan dealing with this matter and bring it back to Council as quickly as possible.

Motion passed.

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Engineering Study - Thomas Building

This item was placed on the agenda at the request of Alderman Shannon.

Alderman Shannon referred to a confidential staff report dated August, 1979 regarding 1883-85 Granville Street, known as the Thomas Building. It is the only building of its kind in the City with the particular front. At that time, it was recommended in part that a study be done. Alderman Shannon stated the building is privately owned and the owner is willing to co-operate, but unable to bear the entire cost of such a study.

MOVED by Alderman Shannon, seconded by Alderman
Maley that an amount up to \$3,000 be allocated, at the
City Manager's discretion, be spent from funds set aside for
Heritage buildings under the Municipal Development Plan,
and that the City go ahead with the study.

Motion passed.

Non-Union Salaries

 $\,$ This matter was added to the agenda at the request of Alderman Shannon.

MOVED by Alderman Shannon, seconded by Alderman Downey that the 1980 rates payable to non-union employees of the City of Halifax, be further increased by 2%.

Motion passed.

Burnt-Out Building - Hartlen Avenue

This item was added to the agenda at the request of Alderman Wooden.

Alderman Wooden advised that this building had been on fire about three weeks ago and is still standing, although the top floor is completely blackened. Alderman Wooden referred to the monies put into this area by the City and residents in the form of paving, sodding, landscaping during the past year. Alderman Wooden also advised that this building is opened almost every night dispite staff's efforts to keep it closed.

Alderman Wooden requested that staff look into this matter immediately, and check with the Fire Department tomorrow regarding today's results in this regard.

Alderman Wooden invited all members of Council to attend the Dedication of the Rhonda Graves-Steven Oakley Park on Tuesday, September 30,1980 at 4:00 p.m.
