#### 7. REPORTS

#### 7.1 TAXI & LIMOUSINE ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT

A staff report dated March 10, 2011 was before the Committee.

Ms. Cathy Mellett, Municipal Clerk, presented the March 10, 2011 report to the Committee.

At the request of the Committee, Ms. Mellett clarified that the draft Terms of Reference included in the report maintains the current Committee membership.

MOVED by Councillor Watts, seconded by Councillor Harvey, that the Transportation Standing Committee recommend to Regional Council that:

- 1. Administrative Order Number Thirty-eight Respecting the Creation of the Taxi and Limousine Advisory Committee, be repealed; and
- 2. Council direct staff of Community Projects, HRP to constitute a Taxi & Limousine/Staff, Industry Liaison Group, as outlined in the Proposed Terms of Reference in Attachment C of this report, the purpose of which is to facilitate a positive, productive working relationship between HRM Bylaw Services and the Taxi and Limousine Industry and related stakeholder and to focus on service to the "common client", the Taxi & Limousine users in HRM.

Ms. Mellett responded to questions of clarification at this time.

#### 7.2 NON-ACCEPTED/PRIVATE ROADS AND KEEFE ROAD, DISTRICRT 17

A staff report dated February 11, 2011 was before the Committee.

Mr. David Hubley, Manager, Design & Construction Services, presented the report to the Committee.

MOVED by Councillor Hum, seconded by Councillor Hendsbee, that the Transportation Standing Committee recommend that Regional Council:

- 1. Approve Option No. 5 as outlined in the Discussion section of the February 11, 2011 report;
- 2. Direct staff to review and present to Council a possible funding plan for capital improvements to non-accepted roads for future Capital Budget Programs;
- Continue to apply the Private Road Takeover Policy and recognize that any capital improvements for private roads be initiated through this policy only; and
- 4. Direct staff to review the service equity relationship in more detail relative to maintenance activities, and report back to Council with a resolution at a later date.

At the request of Councillor Hum, Kirby Grant, Solicitor, clarified that there are safety issues for residents associated with many of these private roads that require upgrading and maintenance. She noted that just because HRM provides some maintenance on these roads does not mean that HRM accepts responsibility for the roads.

At the request of members, Mr. Hubley advised that there are approximately 89 private and non-accepted roads that have been identified by staff.

Members requested that staff provide clarification and further information on the following issues:

- Provide a list of all non-accepted / private roads identified by staff;
- Comment on the need for a narrower standard for country lanes from 66 feet to 55 feet, and the need for design standards for these lanes;
- Comment on the possibility of residents forming Private Road Associations if they don't want to comply with Municipal standards;
- Further comment on any liability the municipality may face with respect to the status of, and maintenance provided to, the non-accepted / private roads;
- How to distinguish between private and non-accepted roads;
- To identify cost estimates for 5/10/20 years of taking over these roads.

Councillor Blumenthal asked legal staff to look into ownership of the private lane between Agricola and Isleville Streets.

Councillor Barkhouse asked staff to check if there are any private or non-accepted roads in District 8.

Without the question being called on the previous motion, the following motion was placed:

Councillor Watts asked that staff look into the process of how residents will be consulted on this matter.
