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#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

The Chair called the meeting to order at 4:56 p.m. in the Media Room, City Hall without a quorum present.

#### 5. **NEW BUSINESS**

#### 5.1 HRM Cultural Plan

The Chair introduced Ms. Holly Richardson, Community Developer, HRM Recreation, Tourism and Culture.

Ms. Richardson addressed the Committee and gave an overview of the process involved with the development of an HRM Cultural Plan. In her remarks, she advised that two or three years ago, the idea of a cultural policy was started as a smaller initiative, however, recently it has become apparent that a broader cultural plan is required, and needs to address more than the arts and heritage. She explained that this past February, Council approved terms of reference for establishing the Cultural Advisory Committee. She briefly reviewed the role of the Committee, the key objectives, and pointed out that they expect to present a policy direction to Council this September. With regard to the Committee composition, she pointed out that they are trying to seek a diverse range of people to sit on the Committee, and in terms of involving the Community and Race Relations Advisory Committee, there may be an opportunity to have a member sit on the Cultural Advisory Committee. Ms. Richardson advised that if this does not happen, she would like to come back and provide updates as a way of keeping the Community and Race Relations Advisory Committee involved in the process.

The Chair thanked Ms. Richardson for her presentation. Ms. Richardson responded to questions and engaged in a discussion with Committee member concerning the Cultural Advisory Committee's work plan.

At 6:10 p.m. Mr. Khokar retired from the meeting.

In response to a question from the Chair, Ms. Richardson advised that her research has found that, across Canada, many municipalities have established cultural advisory committees. She indicated that she could provide this information to the Committee by CD. She noted that Australia and the United Kingdom also have interesting plans as well.

Councillor Hendsbee advised that when this issue came before Council, he raised a concern that there may be some crossover between the Cultural Advisory Committee and the Community and Race Relations Advisory Committee. He pointed out that once the Cultural Advisory Committee has a draft policy prepared, it should be brought before the Community and Race Relations Advisory Committee for its input, prior to going to Council.
