- 6.1.1 Letter from Heritage Trust dated June 17, 2011.

A letter dated June 17, 2011 from Mr. Phil Pacey, Chair HRM Committee, Heritage Trust of Nova Scotia was submitted.

The Chair advised that if the Committee decided it wanted to hear Mr. Pacey's presentation, then it could be added as an agenda item for the next meeting or whenever it is convenient for Heritage Trust.

A brief discussion ensued and there was general consensus to receive a presentation by Heritage Trust.

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MOVED by Mr. Hanniford, seconded by Mr. Archibald that Heritage Trust be provided an opportunity to present to the Committee, at a time convenient to the Trust. MOTION PUT AND PASSED.

- 7.1 Staff:
- 7.1.1 Case H00357: Application to consider 5381 Spring Garden Road, Halifax, as a Municipally Registered Heritage Property

A staff report dated May 24, 2011 was submitted.

The Chair referred to the staff report and advised that it was submitted in response to the Committee's request to gather information with the goal of assessing the building to see if it warrants registration of heritage property.

The Chair explained that this issue has been a topic of the Committee's for some time, and came about a result of the approval of the new library and discussion about the plans for the old library. He added that, currently, he was not aware of any future plans for the old library, and that it may be helpful for Regional Council if the Committee could provide some guidance with regard to the heritage value of the property.

Mr. Peter Bigelow, Manager, Real Property Planning, addressed the Committee and explained that at yesterday's Regional Council session, a motion was passed giving staff direction on how to proceed with the Memorial Library, and Council requested that staff inform this committee about the content of the recommendation. Mr. Bigelow read the recommendation as follows:

That Halifax Regional Council:

- 1. Direct staff to explore in more detail municipal objectives and options related to the Halifax Memorial Library site.
- 2. Request that staff report back to Council through the Standing Committee on Community Planning and Economic Development.

Mr. Bigelow noted that Regional Council does not have a definitive plan for the library but ultimately it will be a decision of Council as to what happens to the property. He pointed out that there are some caveats with the property, the main one being a

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conversion clause which states the use of the property is very specific, i.e. it is to be used either as a Park or Library and, if not, then it will no longer belong to the City.

Mr. Bigelow advised that because it will not be a public library after July 2014, staff brought forward a public process to determine the highest and best use of the property.

A brief discussion ensued and there was general consensus that the evaluation process the Committee would go through would provide information on the aspects of the building that are significant from a heritage and historical perspective, and that the registration of the property can sit parallel or separate to what eventually happens to the building.

Mr. Bill Plaskett, Heritage Planner, provided a presentation on the Halifax Main Branch Library as outlined in the staff report, and responded to questions.

The Committee reviewed and evaluated the property according to the Evaluation Criteria for the Registration of Heritage Buildings, and scored it as follows:
