1. CALL TO ORDER

The Chair called the meeting to order at 3:04 p.m. in Halifax Hall.

The Chair welcomed Mr. Thomas Dawson, noting that Regional Council recently appointed him to the Committee.

- 6.3.1 Heritage Trust of Nova Scotia an Introduction and Overview of Heritage Trust for members of Heritage Advisory Committee

Mr. Peter Delefes, President of Heritage Trust addressed the Committee and introduced Mr. Phil Pacey, advising that he was also a member of Heritage Trust and he sat on their Committee which deals specifically with the HRM.

Mr. Delefes advised that he would welcome an opportunity to meet the Committee members in an informal session to engage in a discussion of ideas and to hear the Committee's view on how heritage can be preserved in the City. He then went on to provide background information on the history of the Heritage Trust, noting that it was a 50 year old organization, founded in 1959, and is a not for profit, volunteer provincial

organization covering the area from Yarmouth to Sydney. He reviewed the work that the Trust does, such as workshops and lectures to educate the public about the importance of heritage.

Mr. Delefes noted the unique collection of historical buildings in Halifax, and suggested that it was not only good from a tourism perspective but economically it was good for the City and will help in the revitalization of the downtown. In concluding his remarks, Mr. Delefes advised that he was very respectful of the Committee and he encouraged members to do whatever they can to help preserve heritage buildings. He suggested that there has been a great deal of pressure from the development community to alter land use in the downtown and expressed concern over this and the amount of facadism going on and he encouraged the Committee to address these concerns.

Mr. Pacey addressed the Committee and advised that the Heritage Property Act gives the Committee certain powers and he encouraged the members to think about the principle of *value added* in ways such as putting its own stamp on reports to Council, visiting the sites under discussion, and reading extra documentation. Mr. Pacey also encouraged the Committee to support increasing funds to HRM 's heritage division in order to help expedite matters noting, for example, that there are 10 proposed Heritage Conservation Districts but only one has been approved so far. Mr. Pacey also suggested that getting more buildings registered and getting more incentive money are other ways of providing *value added*.

Mr. Pacey circulated copies of a document regarding the Morris Project and noted that Heritage Trust and other concerned partners were working together to preserve the building. He explained that it order to save the building they were required to move it from its original location. Nova Scotia Power agreed to allow the building to be temporarily situated on their property but the deadline to move it from their property is next Wednesday and they have yet to find a permanent location. Mr. Pacey indicated that in addition to finding a permanent site they will need funding assistance for the move.

Mr. Delefes and Mr. Pacey responded to questions, and were thanked by the Chair for their presentation.
