9.1 <u>Case 00721 - Rezone Remaining Starr Property Lands, Downtown</u> <u>Dartmouth</u>

C A report from Mr. Paul Dunphy, Director of Planning and Development Services, dated September 30, 2004, on the above noted was before Council.

Ms. Hanita Koblents, Planner, with the aid of overheads, presented the staff report.

In response to Councillor Karsten, Ms. Koblents advised the proposed rezoning supports and advances Policy B9.

Councillor McInroy called for those wishing to speak either in favour of or opposition to the

proposed rezoning.

Mr. Doug English, Lombardy Lane, speaking on behalf of the Canal Commission, spoke in favour of the rezoning stating this is a positive step and will help assist them in efforts to restore and preserve the key canal features on the site. He noted there is very little green space left in Dartmouth and the rezoning would provide a level of protection.

A resident of Dartmouth spoke in favour of the rezoning stating this is a step in the right direction.

A resident of Pleasant Street spoke in support of the rezoning stating there is more need for park space in Dartmouth.

Mr. Alan Billard, Roseway, Dartmouth, spoke in support of the rezoning and outlined the conceptual site development plan proposed by the Shubenacadie Canal Commission.

Mr. Tim Olive, Downtown Dartmouth Business Commission, encouraged Council to approve the rezoning.

Councillor McInroy called three times for any additional speakers. Hearing none, the following motion was placed.

MOVED by Councillor McCluskey, seconded by Councillor Smith, that the public hearing close. MOTION PUT AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

MOVED by Councillor Younger, seconded by Councillor McCluskey, that Harbour East Community Council approve the rezoning of remaining lands of the former Starr Manufacturing Ltd., in Downtown Dartmouth, from Downtown Business (DB) to Park and Open Spaces (PK). MOTION PUT AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.
