Councillor McCluskey served a petition on behalf of the residents from Manor Park regarding the lack of lighting in Brownlow Park. The Councillor requested the petition be forwarded to staff for a response as soon as possible.

#### 9.3 Presentations

## 9.3.1 HRM Economic Strategy

Mr. Fred Morely presented the HRM Economic Strategy to Community Council advising this Strategy is meant to focus on all areas of HRM and is centred on the people of the community.

In response to a question by Councillor Younger as to what difference this would make in everyday life if it is implemented, Mr. Morely stated that if it is implemented and once it begins to work it will show up in opportunities which can be identified such as employment which would keep people in HRM. It would mean more growth in the community which would also provide better employment opportunities.

Councillor McCluskey asked how would HRM get all communities involved, noting that in order to make this work people have to buy into and believe in the Strategy. The Councillor stated that the youth are being missed and as a result are falling by the wayside. Mr. Morely stated ten percent of the population and twenty percent of the work force are students. He stated ways have to be found to retain their energy and expertise in the community. A method has to be found to bring more enthusiasm and energy and to make sure they have opportunities in HRM for jobs and careers once they leave school and enter the work force.

Councillor Kent stated the key to this working is to provide more jobs for the average person to enable residents to stay here and support their families. She stated there has to be responsible planning through the Regional Plan enabling the building of communities where we can work, live and play. There is a need to create jobs that are achievable locally. Mr. Morely advised the Strategy recognizes HRM cannot stand still but has to keep moving. He stated it is about having growth that values history and culture etc.

Councillor Smith asked how HRM would know that it had succeeded and if the success will

be being benchmarked. Mr. Morely advised there are a series of outcome measures in the Strategy and if targets are achieved then HRM is having success. He advised there will be an implementation group which will draw on people who want to see the community grow and make things happen. He advised the Strategy is aiming for smart and sustainable growth which means growth that respects values and preserves those values on a go forward basis as well as recognizing the integration between urban and rural.

At this time Community Council provided an opportunity for any member of the public to provide input.

Mr. Reg Jones, Dartmouth expressed concern that people are moving from smaller communities into the urban areas. He stated there needs to be a strategy to move people into rural areas so they are not on the highways but in the communities.

Councillor Smith thanked Mr. Morley for his presentation.
