# enter into a development agreement to allow for a golf course on a 218 acre parcel of land located in East Petpeswick

- A report from Keith Boutilier, Chair of the Marine Drive, Valley and Canal Community Council dated November 2, 1999 on the above noted was before Community Council.
- A staff report dated October 19, 1999 from Donna Davis-Lohnes, on the above noted, was before Community Council.

Mr. Jim Donovan, Planner, with the aid of overheads, presented the staff report advising staff is recommending approval of the application.

### **Speakers in Favour**

**Mr. Rob Barker**, East Petpeswick, spoke in favour of the application stating this development will have a positive effect in the spinoff it will generate.

**Ms. Janet Baker**, East Petpeswick, stated she was in favour of the development as the development would provide economic growth for the Eastern Shore.

**Ms. Pauline Milson**, Seaside Tourism, spoke in favour of the project.

**Mr. James Hughes,** East Petpeswick, noted there is high unemployment in the area and feels this development will help in providing employment opportunities.

**Mr. Michael Concannon,** East Petpeswick Road, stated this will provide a tourist attraction to the area. He further noted the environmental aspects will have to be addressed so as to not harm the environment.

**Mr. David Dwyer,** West Petpeswick, stated he was in favour of the project but there is a concern that Mr. Baker has proceeded prior to a development agreement being approved which may set a precedent for future development on the Eastern Shore. He stated there was also concern expressed with high sedimentation and runoff during the winter months.

**Mr. Bill Dooks, MLA,** spoke in favour of the application noting there is still time to look at the environmental issues. Mr. Dooks advised the Department of the Environment will be diligent in their tracking of this development.

**Mr. Peter McLean,** East Petpeswick Road, spoke in favour of the project and commended the developer on the proposed development. He advised that the runoff from property is

clear without any traces of sedimentation.

**Ms. Betty Ann Gaetz,** West Petpeswick, stated she did not see a problem with runoff as this is closely watched by the Department of Environment.

Mr. Blake Bayers, spoke in favour of the development stating it is a positive for the community.

**Mr. Frank Buchanan,** East Petpeswick, feels it is a good idea for Petpeswick and a welcome development.

**Ms. Mabel Clements**, stated she feels it is a wonderful idea for this area.

## **Speakers in Opposition**

**Mr. Stan VanDyke**, East Petpeswick, expressed concern with environmental concerns specifically, water drawn down and the drainage of fertilizer.

**Ms. Veronica McNeil,** East Petpeswick Road, expressed concern with runoff as the property will drain downhill towards properties that are on wells.

MOVED by Councillors Streatch and Colwell that the Public Hearing close. MOTION PUT AND PASSED.

#### **Decision of Council**

**MOVED by Councillors Colwell and Streatch that:** 

- 1. Marine Drive, Valley and Canal Community Council approve the development agreement attached as Appendix "A" to the staff report dated October 19, 1999, to permit a golf course on lands located in East Petpeswick.
- 2. Marine Drive, Valley and Canal Community Council require the agreement be signed within 120 days, or any extension thereof granted by Council on the request of the applicant, from the date of final approval by Council and any other bodies as necessary, whichever approval is later, including applicable appeal periods, otherwise this approval will be void and obligations arising hereunder shall be at an end.
