Mr. David Dwyer addressed Community Council regarding an as of right development proposed in the area and expressed concern with the effects the development may have on the area watershed. He suggested the proposed plan be reviewed by the Watershed Advisory Board for the area. In response, Mr. Angus Schaffenburg, Planner, advised that there is not legal ability to require that the proposal for the development is brought before the Watershed Advisory Board, noting the Department of Environment is involved when development takes place near or on watercourses.
