9.3.1 Presentation - HRM Economic Strategy - Betty MacDonald

Councillor Uteck gave Notice of Motion of her intention to, at the next meeting of Peninsula Community Council to be held on November 7, 2005, introduce for consideration the following motion:

Whereas Halifax Regional Council initiated a municipal planning strategy amendment process on August 9, 2005, to establish policies and regulations aimed at controlling development and subdivision on water lots infilled along either side of the Northwest Arm.

Whereas there have been a great number of community concerns expressed that further infilling will occur on the Northwest Arm before proper land use policies and regulations are in place.

Whereas staff will be introducing municipal planning strategy and land use by-law amendments to Halifax Regional Council on or before January 17, 2006.

Peninsula Community Council therefore urges that the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans Canada request his staff not to issue any further authorization for the infilling of water lots on the Northwest Arm in the period leading up to January 17, 2006.

14. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Alan Ruffman, Halifax

Mr. Ruffman addressed Community Council expressing concern regarding the speed of traffic on University Avenue in light of the number of students in the area. He requested that HRM review traffic on University Avenue from South Park Street to the Dalhousie University with a view to having a second stop sign at Le Marchant Street. Mr. Ruffman went on to suggest that the sidewalks from the Medical School to the Killam Library be widened and wheelchair accesses be improved.

Mr. Ruffman went on to express concern regarding stop signs and crosswalks in the area of the university.

Councillor Fougere indicated that HRM and Dalhousie University are working together to determine the requirements with regard to traffic and pedestrians.

Hugh Pullen, Halifax

Mr. Pullen requested further details regarding the Economic Strategy.

Councillor Fougere responded that the Economic Strategy would be presented to Council on October 18, 2005 at which time further details would be available.

Graham Hicks, Halifax

Mr. Hicks noted that bus tours are often taken to the end of Union Street in order that they may view the Bedford Basin. He noted that for the last number of years the bush and grass has not been cut and has impaired the view of the Bedford Basin from that vantage point. Mr. Hick suggested that HRM correct this situation. Councillor Murphy agreed to look into this matter and follow up with Mr. Hicks.

Referring to the Harbour Solutions occurring at the corner of Upper Water and Barrington Streets. Mr. Hicks suggested that additional directional signage for pedestrians be erected.

The Chair indicated that this suggestion will be forwarded to Harbour Solutions staff.
