11.5 Property Matter - Re-development, Former Sackville Heights Elementary School

- Retention of the former Sackville Heights Elementary School site by HRM for re-development as a community center, conditional upon approval of an area rate in accordance with HRM's Interim Area Rate Guidelines.
- 2. A new capital project in the amount of \$264,000 funding up to a maximum of \$200,000 to be secured through a 10-year debenture re-paid through an area rate; other funding available is outlined in the Budget Implications of the June 27, 2002 Private and Confidential staff report; and, if the area rate is not approved, the asset will be sold to re-pay the debenture.
- 3. Release of the June 27, 2002 report to the public.

11.6 <u>Legal Matter - Settlement of Claim</u>

MOVED by Councillor Blumenthal, seconded by Councillor Hetherington, that Halifax Regional Council settle this claim brought by the Plaintiff, as set out in the September 17, 2002 Private and Confidential staff report, in the amount of \$14,000 as settlement in full upon obtaining a full release from the Plaintiff from any further claims arising out of the accident which occurred on September 9, 1997. MOTION PUT AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

11.7 Councillor Cunningham - Traffic Situation School Street, Dartmouth

Councillor Cunningham noted that speeding and short-cutting has become a problem on School Street since the realignment of Nantucket Avenue and the approach to the Macdonald Bridge. There have been many traffic problems in that area since the realignment and even though signals have been installed there are still complaints from the residents regarding the problem.

MOVED by Councillor Cunningham, seconded by Councillor Blumenthal that Traffic Services in conjunction with Police Services provide a report on this situation providing an assessment of the concerns by the residents. MOTION PUT AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.
