9.1 CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER

9.1.1 <u>Tender 03-057, Eight (8) New Mobile Water Supply Apparatus</u>

• A report prepared for Mr. George McLellan, Chief Administrative Officer, dated June 13, 2003, on the above noted, was before Council.

MOVED by Councillor Streatch, seconded by Councillor Colwell, that Council authorize the award to Tender #03-057 for the purchase of eight (8) Mobile Water Supply Apparatus including Optional Equipment to Superior Emergency Vehicles at a cost of \$2,059,118.10 (net HST incl) with funding from Capital Account CVJ00223, Apparatus Replacement, as outlined in the Budget Implications section of the report dated June 13, 2003. 9.1.2 <u>Tender 2003M644, Lease of Twelve (12) Station Wagons</u>

MOVED by Councillor Hetherington, seconded by Councillor Sarto, that Regional Council authorize the award of Tender 2003M644 to MacPhee Leasing for a three (3) year lease of Twelve (12) Station Wagons at a cost of \$152,496.00 plus Net H.S.T for a total cost of \$162,299.97 with funding provided as outlined in the Budget Implications section of the report dated June 10, 2003. MOVED by Councillor Cunningham, seconded by Councillor Smith, that Halifax Regional Council authorize staff to set a date of July 15, 2003, for a public hearing for consideration of HRM Administrative Order SC-30 concerning the closure of an undeveloped portion of Basil Avenue Right-of-Way, known as Parcel BA-2, which currently forms part of the former Mary Lawson School Site, as shown on Attachment "A" of the staff report dated June 9, 2003, based on the terms and conditions outlined in the report. 9.1.4 <u>First Reading By-Law T-124 &T-125, Amendments to By-Law T-108, Respecting Taxi and Limousine Licensing</u>

MOVED by Councillor Adams, seconded by Councillor Walker, that Regional Council give First Reading to By-Law T-124 and T-125 attached as Appendices "A" and "B" to the supplementary staff report dated June 19, 2003 and direct the Municipal Clerk to arrange for a public hearing to be advertised to consider the said By-Law for Second Reading.

Without a vote being taken on the motion, the following motion was placed.

MOVED by Councillor Sloane, seconded by Councillor Cunningham, that the fare from Downtown to Spring Garden Road, as outlined in Schedule 3, be changed to \$7.00 Canadian.

Councillor Adams advised the rates were set by the Port Authority, not the Taxi and Limousine Committee.

Councillor Hetherington suggested everyone be treated the same when using a cab within city limits, all trips be metered. The Councillor agreed that flat rates should be used to destinations such as Peggy's Cove and the airport as they are special destinations.

MOTION DEFEATED.

MOVED by Councillor Blumenthal, seconded by Councillor that Schedule 3 rates be amended to remove the set rate from Downtown or Spring Garden Road.

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Councillor Adams encouraged Council to leave the rates as outlined, stating fixed rates protect everyone, drivers and passengers, as tourists may not know the distance between locations and a cab driver may take a longer route resulting in a higher fare.

Entering into a ten (10) year lease with East Port Properties for space located at 81 IIsley Avenue, Dartmouth, with final terms to be negotiated by staff based on details in Appendix "A" to the June 19, 2003 Private and Confidential staff report, and pending written approval from the Minister of Service Nova Scotia and Municipal Relations as required under Section 88(4) of the Municipal Government Act.

An increase of \$28,000 to Capital Project CB200374, Corporate Records Storage Consolidation, resulting in a total budget of \$178,000, with funding of \$178,000 to be provided from the Service Improvement Reserve Q310, as detailed in the Budget Implications of the June 19, 2003 Private and Confidential staff report.
- 3. That the 2003/04 Operating Withdrawal Budget for the Service Improvement Reserve Q310 be increased by \$40,000, to cover short term incremental operating costs associated with consolidation, as detailed in the Budget Implications of the June 19, 2003 Private and Confidential staff report.

Commitment of an additional \$76,000 as an Operating Withdrawal in 2004/05 from the Service Improvement Reserve Q310, to cover short term incremental operation costs associated with consolidation, as detailed in the Budget Implications of the June 19, 2003 Private and Confidential staff report.
