That the first sentence of Policy SU-28 be amended to read "HRM shall confirm the objectives of the Integrated Solid Waste *Resource* Strategy, and it shall review the Strategy outcomes every 10 years unless changes to program components, such as capacity or regulations, require a review be conducted in the interim; and (Following the motion being put on the floor, Councillor Hendsbee had suggested, and it was agreed, to insert the word 'resource' between 'waste' and 'strategy')
- 7. That the second sentence of Policy SU-30 be amended to read "As an integral component of the Integrated Solid Waste Resource System, HRM may consider utilizing the effluent treatment facility for treatment of offsite HRM organics leachate."

Councillor Hendsbee advised that he had nine additional properties he wanted to include with amendment #2, and they are owned by Nova Scotia Trust. The Mayor advised that they would have to come forward as a separate amendment.

Councillor Johns advised that Council has not had an opportunity to discuss in further detail the proposed amendments and that he was concerned, in particular with #7 and he asked for clarification of whether this was directly about the Upper Sackville Leachate Treatment Plant, and Mr. Austin French, Manager, Planning indicated that it was. Councillor Johns added that he felt this item was a significant change from what went out the public and that the public should have an opportunity to comment.

The Mayor advised that this would also have to come forward as a separate amendment. He suggested and, **it was agreed**, that Council would deal with only the six amendments.

Councillor Rankin referred to item 6 and advised that he believed it should be changed to have a review every 5 years instead of every 10 years. He questioned if this could be a friendly amendment, and the Mayor indicated that should Council wish to have this changed, it should be brought forward as a motion.

MOVED by Councillor Rankin, seconded by Councillor Adams that item 6 be revised to recommend the Integrated Solid Waste Resource Strategy be reviewed every 5 years, instead of every 10 years.

Councillor Mason advised that it appears that Council does not feel they have enough information at this time to deal with the matter, therefore, he was prepared to bring forward a motion of referral for a staff report, and have it come back to a session of Committee of the Whole.

MOVED by Councillor Mason, seconded by Councillor Adams that Regional Council refer the staff report dated February 11, 2014 dealing with RP +5 to Committee of the Whole and direct staff to prepare a report for Committee of the Whole's consideration dealing with the following items:

- 1. The implications of re-designating the Purcell's Cove Backlands from Urban Reserve to Urban Settlement or Rural Commuter and, in particular, the below considerations to be taken into account:
 - a) Will water and sewer services come to this area in time for it to be developed at the end of 2026 and, if not, is the urban reserve still viable?
 - b) Are current and planned water system investments in the area too small in capacity to support Urban format development in the future?
 - c) What is the developable lot capacity for lands under rural commuter in this area? What are the implications for traffic and other services if the lands develop under the rural commuter?

- 2. What provisions exist or could be included to allow one time small scale (1-3 lot) subdivisions in the Open Space and Natural Resource, Urban Reserve & Rural Commuter designations?
- 3. The implications of re-designating the Cole Harbour/Westphal Urban Reserve lands near Highway 7 and Ross Road to Urban Settlement.
- 4. The implications of applying the CDD Zone to certain sites on the Eastern Shore; if not the entire defined Eastern Region.
- 5. Within Fall River, identify areas with current ground water quantity or quality issues or on-site sewer issues that may be considered for inclusion in the service boundary along with a mechanism to allow the timely extension of sewer or water services to those areas.
- 6. The implications of grandfathering the proposed Seven Lakes Development under the 2006 Regional Plan open space conservation planning bylaws,
- 7. Amendment 7 from item 8.2 of the amendments package presented to Council on February 25, 2014.

And to report back to Regional Council by the end of June 2014.

Councillor Hendsbee advised that he had further questions he wanted clarified and asked if he should raise them now so that they are part of the motion to be debated.

The Municipal Solicitor advised that staff is unable look at individual items of concern of Councillors and that such concerns should be brought up today, and agreed upon by Council as a whole to be considered in Councillor Mason's motion.

Councillor Hendsbee advised that he wanted to include the letter dated February 19, 2014 from WSP Canada Inc., noting that the issues outlined in the letter are relevant to all rural areas in HRM.

MOVED by Councillor Johns, seconded by Councillor Walker that the motion be amended to include that the staff report consider the implications of the removal of parcels PID's # 00500967 and 0048694 of Schedule J of the Regional Plan and to extend the serviceable boundary to align with the existing water boundary on each.

Councillor Mason referred to Councillor John's motion and suggested that his concerns were contained within the staff report and, therefore, would be going to Committee of the Whole and would be open for discussion at that time.

In reference to Councillor Mason's comment, Councillor Johns advised that if this was the understanding of Council and the Municipal Solicitor then he would withdraw his motion.

The Municipal Solicitor indicated agreement, and reminded Council that the Rules of Procedure state that if a matter has already been considered at Committee of the Whole and failed to pass a vote, then it would require two-thirds majority for the matter to come forward again.

Councillor Johns advised that he would withdraw his motion.

The Mayor advised that with Councillor John's withdrawal of his amendment to the motion, the motion of referral is now before Council for consideration.

A discussion ensued as to whether the timeline for the staff report was sufficient for staff to gather all required information. In response, Ms. Jane Fraser, Director, Planning and Infrastructure explained that there were some items that staff would be able to address in a report due back in June, but there were other items that staff could not address by that time.

Councillor Johns referred to item 7 of the motion to refer and advised that he wanted this withdrawn because he felt it was a last minute change to the draft Plan, and that it is very significant, and should have public engagement before any change is considered.

MOVED by Councillor Johns, seconded by Councillor Whitman that item 7 from the motion of referral be removed.

In regard to item 7, Councillor Craig advised that he had brought this matter up, simply to get clarification of the intent of SU-30 and SU-31 from staff. He suggested that whether Councillors agree or disagree with the item, it would be appropriate to deal with it at Committee of the Whole, where it would be clarified.
