- 9.1 <u>CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER</u>
- 9.1.1 Financial Policy Respecting Interest on Bridge Financing for Capital Projects
- A report dated May 10, 2005 on the above noted was before Council.

MOVED by Councillor McCluskey, seconded by Councillor Wile, that:

- 1. Commencing in the 2005-06 fiscal year that interest be charged for the bridge financing of those Capital Projects that are of benefit to a specific identifiable group or area and which are either partially or fully funded by local improvement charges including those levied as an area rate.
- 2. Commending in the 2005-06 fiscal year that interest be charged for the bridge financing of Capital Projects that are cost shared and that external cost sharing partners be billed their proportionate share of bridge financing costs. Where interest is not deemed an eligible cost shared expense under the program then the interest cost shall be recovered through local improvement charges where levied.
- 3. The interest rate to be applied to these capital projects be the actual HRM Short Term Investment Rate.

Councillor Fougere noted Attachment 1 of the staff report contains a table which is missing the numbers for the minimum tax payable. The Councillor submitted a new table for the information of Council. The Councillor noted that residents can now apply for both a tax rebate and tax referral.

Councillor Fougere stated she would like to amend the motion on the floor to reflect that the table presented at this meeting replace the current table in Attachment 1 as the basis for how HRM issues the tax rebate program.

MOVED by Councillor Fougere, seconded by Councillor Walker, that the issue be referred back to staff to be amended to reflect the appropriate changes.

Mr. Anstey noted the Administrative Order does not reflect the table currently but if Council so wishes the Administrative Order can be redrafted to reflect what is being requested.

Councillor Walker stated there is a risk regarding the possibility of contaminants from the proposed facility to HRM due to the close proximity to the Pockwock water supply. The Councillor noted Pockwock provides drinking water to a large number of HRM residents and placed the following motion:

MOVED by Councillor Walker, seconded by Councillor Rankin, that HRM ask for a full hydrogeological technical assessment study of underground water. Further, HRM have intervener status at the environmental assessment. _MOTION PUT AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

MOVED by Councillor Johns, seconded by Councillor Meade, that East Hants be

requested, as a courtesy, to advise HRM staff as they move forward with the development of the business park. MOTION PUT AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

TAKE NOTICE that the next regular meeting of Halifax Regional Council scheduled for May 24, 2005 I intend to introduce the following motion to amend By-Law N-200 Respecting Noise as follows:

Amending Schedule A, Part 2 by adding the following:

"(14). Notwithstanding any other section of this by-law, the maintenance or other repair of commercial vehicles outdoors, or in a building which is not fully enclosed in such a way as to prevent the escape of noise, shall be prohibited as per the hours listed under Item C of the Prohibited Times section of this by-law, if said operation is within 250 feet of a residential

property".

12.2 <u>Councillor Mead - First Reading Administrative Order #33, Respecting</u> <u>Open Air Burning - Communities of Bayside, Brookside and Lower</u> <u>Prospect</u>

TAKE NOTICE that at the next regular meeting of Halifax Regional Council, to be held on May 24, 2205, I propose to move an amendment to Administrative Order Number 33, Respecting Open Air Burning to include the following Fire Protection Districts in which a burning permit is not required, providing all requirements that are outlined in Section 13 of the By-law O-103 are met: Bayside, Brookside and Lower Prospect. These three communities were inadvertently left out of the May 3, 2005 Notice of Motion

2.3 Councillor Hendsbee - First Reading By-Law O-108, Amendment to By-Law O-103, Respecting Open Air Burning

TAKE NOTICE that at the next regular meeting of the Halifax Regional Council to be held on May 24, 2005, I intend to move First Reading to amend the Open Air Burning By-law O-103 Section 3 Subsection (b) Section (i) pertaining to the application of the By-law to permit the issuance of municipal burning permits during the provincial fire season at the discretion of the local fire chiefs when safe climate conditions warrant it to do so. Further, the By-law be amended to allow for more local municipal involvement and control over the issuance of provincial burning permits.
