## 9.1.2 <u>Tender 06-372 - Duke Street Outfall - Sewer Rehabilitation, Halifax</u>

A report dated September 6, 2006, on the above noted, was before Council.

## MOVED by Councillor Sloane, seconded by Councillor Murphy, that Council:

- 1. Approve an increase to the 2006/07 Capital Budget in the amount of \$600,000 for a new capital project, Duke Street Outfall Sewer Rehabilitation with funding from the Sewer Redevelopment Reserve Account Q104, as outlined in the Budget Implications section of the September 6, 2006 report.
- 2. Award Tender No. 06-372, Duke Street Outfall Sewer Rehabilitation to Brycon Construction Limited for materials and services listed at the unit prices quoted for a Tender Price of \$496,460 including net HST from the new capital account with funding authorized as per the Budget Implications section of the September 6, 2006 report.
- 3. Enter into the agreement attached to the September 6, 2006 report with the Armour Group Limited, and authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to execute the agreement.

## 9.1.4 <u>Temporary Borrowing Resolution & 2006 Fall Debenture</u>

A report dated September 5, 2006, on the above noted, was before Council.

## MOVED by Councillor Karsten, seconded by Councillor McCluskey, that:

- 1. Halifax Regional Council approve a Temporary Borrowing Resolution, based on the 2006/07 Capital Budget, as well as other changes approved during the year in the amount of \$43,724,404.
- 2. Halifax Regional Council approve a Temporary Borrowing Resolution in the

amount of \$10,862,382 for renewal of the expiring Temporary Borrowing Resolution 03/04-01.

3. The Mayor and Municipal Clerk be authorized to sign the Resolution for Pre-Approval of Debenture Issuance Subject to Interest Rate confirmation, not to exceed 6.5%, to enable the Halifax Regional Municipality to issue a 10 year debenture in the amount of \$10,150,000.

Mr. Andrew Whittemore, Acting Manager, Community Development, presented the report to Council.

MOVED by Councillor Snow, seconded by Councillor Martin, that Halifax Regional Council:

- 1. Initiate a Community Visioning Pilot Project, as set out in the August 30, 2006 report, for the communities of Musquodoboit Harbour, Fall River and Bedford-Mill Cove/Waterfront:
- 2. Approve performance measures generally outlined in the August 30, 2006 report as the basis of evaluating the pilot project.

Councillor Johns suggested Sackville be one of the areas looked at as part of the pilot project and placed the following motion.

MOVED by Councillor Johns, seconded by Councillor Hum, that the report be referred back to staff for consideration of Sackville as one of the areas to be considered as part of the pilot project. MOTION DEFEATED.

Mayor Kelly resumed the Chair.

Mr. Whittemore outlined the selection process, noting there was a need to represent rural, urban and suburban issues.

Following discussion, it was suggested staff provide information on the criteria and weighting measures used in choosing the three areas.

MOVED by Councillor Streatch, seconded by Councillor Sloane, that the question now be put. MOTION PUT AND PASSED.
