## 1. INVOCATION

The Mayor called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. with the Invocation being led by Councillor Rankin.

## 2. SPECIAL COMMUNITY ANNOUNCEMENTS & ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Councillor Sloane announced that Saturday, May 15<sup>th</sup> will be HRM's open house for the greenhouse on Sackville Street. She indicated that names of the Public Gardens' geese will be announced 3 p.m. from the *name the geese* contest and reminded children ages 5 to 12 to put their votes in. She further noted that on May 15<sup>th</sup> there will be a community garden cleanup and barbecue at Warrington Park. As well, the graduation for NASCAD students will be May 15<sup>th</sup> at 2 p.m. Councillor Sloane congratulated the graduating students and acknowledged their talents.

Councillor Blumenthal advised that the Imagine Bloomfield Society will be hosting a Spring fair on Sunday, May 16<sup>th</sup> at the Bloomfield Centre. The Society will also be hosting their Annual General Meeting on Wednesday, May 19<sup>th</sup> in the Multipurpose Room of the Bloomfield Centre, new members are needed.

Councillor McCluskey noted that from July 29<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> will be the largest Dartmouth High School reunion. She commented that the School opened 50 years ago and reminded students that graduated from 1970 through to 1980 to register. She further provided best wishes to the paddlers going to Montreal this week for trials.

Councillor Hendsbee indicated that Saint Anne Church in Lake Echo will be organizing a door-to-door community food bank campaign on Saturday, May 15<sup>th</sup>. Donations can also be dropped off at the Lake Echo Community Centre after 6 p.m. on Sunday, May 16<sup>th</sup>.

Councillor Lund announced that on Saturday, May 15<sup>th</sup> the Saint Luke's United Church in Saint Margaret's Bay will be hosting a Spring garden, plant and bake sale. There will also a beach clean up day on May 15<sup>th</sup> at the Fox Point and Mill Cove beaches. As well, on May 15<sup>th</sup> the Stafford Memorial Elementary School will be hosting an enchanted forest fun fair with a special guest appearance from Scooby Doo. The Saint George's Church will host their annual lobster supper on May 15<sup>th</sup> at the Seabright Legion and the Arthritis Society is hosting a Spring fling on May 16<sup>th</sup> at the Saint Margaret's Centre.

Councillor Mosher provided a reminder to the Chain of Lake Trails Association of their May 12<sup>th</sup> meeting at the St. James Anglican Church. She further noted that, on Monday, May 17<sup>th</sup> the Choices IWK will be hosting a public meeting at the St. James Anglican Church and thanked the Church for providing assistance.

Councillor Dalrymple reminded residents that the Beaver Bank/Kinsac annual town hall

meeting will be held at 7 p.m. on May 13<sup>th</sup> at the Harold T. Barrett Jr. High School and commented that Mayor Kelly will be in attendance. He further advised that twelve volunteers have been selected for the new Beaver Bank/Kinsac Recreation Board, noting that the successful candidates were notified May 10<sup>th</sup> and thanked the applicants that had applied. HRM will be hosting a mixed slow pitch tournament at the Beaver Bank ball fields on June 11<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>. Residents interested in playing can contact him or the Beaver Bank Community Centre. All proceeds go towards the Community Centre rebuild. He commented that he looking to host a game between the local MLA's and HRM.

Councillor Watts advised that there will be a public meeting regarding the Larry O'Connell Park on May 12<sup>th</sup> at the Maritime Hall, Halifax Forum, concerning the development of a batting cage. Residents are welcome to attend and provide their opinions on the Park and its upgrades. She further noted there will be a public meeting on May 13<sup>th</sup> at the Maritime Hall, Halifax Forum regarding possible long term upgrades to Ardmore Park. There is presently a Peninsula Facility Review Study taking place, which includes focus groups and an online survey on HRM's website. She encouraged residents to provide their opinions regarding long term community recreation facilities on the Peninsula. The Brigadoon Camp, which supports children with chronic illnesses, is hosting a fundraiser on May 15<sup>th</sup> at the Westin Hotel. Further details are available on the Brigadoon Camp's website.

Councillor Hum announced that the Condo Owners of Nova Scotia will hold their Annual General Meeting on May 20<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m. at the St. Peter's Anglican Church, Bedford Highway. She welcomed all condo owners and future condo owners to attend.

Councillor Wile advised that the students of Halifax West High School are presenting their annual musical, the production of A Chorus Line. The production runs May 27<sup>th</sup> to May 29<sup>th</sup>. She encouraged all residents to attend and support the students.

Councillor Barkhouse indicated that the second annual Seaside Harvest Festival will be held in October. She noted that the Festival is in the planning stages and provided an invitation to residents interested in getting involved with the planning of the Festival to contact her via phone or email.

Councillor Uteck encouraged residents when they go to the annual plant sales to be cautious and ask merchants where the plants came from and reminded residents that there has been an infestation of European Fire Ants within HRM.

Councillor Smith announced that there will be a public information meeting at the Dartmouth High School on May 12<sup>th</sup> regarding a development proposal for five additional apartments to 185 Windmill Road.

Councillor Blumenthal submitted a petition containing 707 signatures on behalf of the Seaview Park Committee, requesting that a fenced in area be erected at Seaview Park as soon as possible to serve all of HRM. He indicated that most of the signatures were collected at Seaview Park and that 809 signatures had been collected; however, 102 were ruined due to unforeseen "water shed".

Councillor Sloane indicated that she has been speaking with staff regarding the area of Barrington Street from the ramp at Cogswell Street to Spring Garden. Heritage Gas will be commencing work there shortly and staff have advised that the roads will be paved once the work is completed.

**11.1.3 Tender 10-226 - South Street (South Park Street to Robie Street) Resurfacing and Sidewalk Renewal**

**MOVED by Councillor Uteck, seconded by Councillor Sloane, that Halifax Regional Council award Tender No. 10-226, South Street (South Park Street to Robie Street) - West Region to Ocean Contractors Limited for a Total Tender Price of \$588,511.01 (net HST included) with funding from Capital Account Nos. CKU01084 - Sidewalk Renewals and CZU01082 - Resurfacing Program as outlined in the Budget Implications section of the April 21, 2010 staff report.**

**11.1.4 Larry Uteck Boulevard / Highway 102 Interchange Environmental Assessment**

**MOVED by Councillor Hum, seconded by Councillor Outhit, that Halifax Regional Council approve the reimbursement of \$101,932.38 (net HST included) to Clayton Developments Limited for the Larry Uteck Blvd./Highway 102 Interchange Environmental Assessment study with funding from Capital Account No. CTU00971, Larry Uteck Blvd./Highway 102 Interchange as outlined in the Budget Implications section of the April 26, 2010 staff report.**

Councillor McCluskey asked how much construction costs for the interchange have increased since the Capital Cost Contribution on this project was approved in 2003. Mr. Peter Duncan, Manager, Infrastructure Planning Office, Infrastructure and Asset

Management, responded that the Capital Costs Contributions paid by developers would be based on current construction costs.

**11.1.5 Community Facility Lease Agreement (FLA) - Spryfield Lions Rink and Recreation Society**

**MOVED by Councillor Mosher, seconded by Councillor Walker, that Halifax Regional Council authorize the Mayor and the Municipal Clerk to enter into a Facility Lease Agreement with the Spryfield Lions Rink and Recreation Society as per the key terms and conditions set out in Table 1 of the April 21, 2010 staff report.**

Councillor Mosher thanked the Spryfield Lions Club for their hard work and efforts operating the rink. The Club has operated the rink since 1972. She indicated that she and Councillor Adam are working with the Society and commented that Councillor Adams' father and other original Lions had been instrumental in getting the rink up and running. She further thanked the new Spryfield Lions Rink and Recreation Society for their hard work and efforts towards the operation of the rink and asked for Council's support.

**11.1.6 Proposed Amendment to Administrative Order 45, Respecting Private Road Maintenance - Road Maintenance Fee for River Bend Road and River Court Home Owners Association  
Motion - Councillor Dalrymple - Approve Admin. Order 45**

- A memo from Linda D. Wood, Lawyer for River Bend Road Association, dated May 11, 2010 was before Council.

**MOVED by Councillor Dalrymple, seconded by Councillor Hendsbee, that Halifax Regional Council:**

- 1. Approve an annual uniform charge of not more than \$350.00 per property to be applied against all properties accessed from River Bend Road and/or River Court, private roads located in the community of Enfield, as depicted in the map shown in Appendix A of the staff report dated April 19, 2010, effective with the 2010/11 fiscal year for the purpose of funding the road**

**maintenance activities of the River Bend Road and River Court Home Owners Association.**

- 2. Approve Administrative Order 45, Respecting Private Road Maintenance, by adding Schedule 5, respecting a uniform charge for the River Bend Road and River Court Home Owners Association, as shown in Appendix B of the April 19, 2010 staff report.**
- 3. Subject to the approval of Schedule 5 of Administrative Order 45, authorize the Mayor and Municipal Clerk to sign on behalf of HRM, the Management and Operating Agreement between HRM and the Association included as Appendix "C" of the April 19, 2010 staff report.**

Councillor Dalrymple noted that two public meetings have taken place that were well attended with many questions being answered. There has also been several emails from residents that have also been answered. He indicated that the questions raised in the May 11, 2010 memo from Ms. Linda D. Wood, Lawyer for River Bend Road Association, were similar to the questions raised during the public hearing and have been answered by staff. He commented that all policies and procedures have been followed to take over the maintenance fees on a private road, as well, the Association has obtained all of the necessary voting requirements.

**11.1.10 2010 / 2011 Advance Capital Budget Approval - Second Submission**

- A staff report dated April 29, 2010 was before Council.

**MOVED by Deputy Mayor Johns, seconded by Councillor Outhit, that Halifax Regional Council approve \$16,400,000 of additional advanced funding of the Proposed 2010/2011 Capital Budget; as outlined in the Budget Implications section of this report.**

Councillor Uteck expressed concern that approval of Advanced Capital Submissions not preclude decisions Council may have to make during the upcoming 2010/2011 Budget debate.

During a brief discussion, Councillor Uteck requested staff provide a status update with respect to the projects outlined in Attachment B of the staff report dated April 29, 2010, to assist Council in identifying what projects have been started.

Councillor McCluskey commented that the status update should identify where each of the projects are located.

**11.1.11 Reinstatement of District 3 Capital Area Rate**

- A email dated April 28, 2010 from Ms. Marlene Selig of Lawrencetown to Mayor Peter Kelly and an email from Mark Lewis dated April 21, 2010 re: District 3 area rate to fund Porter's Lake Community Centre, was before Council.
- A staff report dated May 5, 2010 was before Council.

**MOVED by Councillor Hendsbee, seconded by Councillor Streach, that Halifax Regional Council:**

- 1. Commencing with the 2010-11 fiscal year, reinstate the District 3 Capital Area Rate of \$0.024 per \$100 of taxable assessment to be applied to the Residential, Resource, Commercial and Business Occupancy assessment within the Rural Tax Area of District 3 as the boundaries for that District existed prior to the District Boundary Review in 2004.**
- 2. The term for the Area Rate will be for a period of not more than 10 years, unless Council approves other projects to be funded from the District 3 Capital Area Rate prior to the end of the term.**
- 3. Increase the 2010/11 Operating Budget by \$600,000 for the construction of the Porters Lake Community Centre with funding provided from the District 3 Capital Area Rate.**

Councillor Hendsbee provided follow up from Council's previous motion of January 26, 2010, noting that a public meeting was held in the community of Porters Lake. He indicated that staff had met with the architects and planners to discuss the possibility of a re-configuration of the Community Centre. as well as, a possible expansion. Staff were able to achieve a two metre adjustment to the size of the building. The additional cost is to accommodate the adjustment to the building.

**MOVED by Councillor Streach, seconded by Councillor Hendsbee, that Halifax Regional Council:**

- 1. Approve the withdrawal of \$191,800 from Q107 Parkland Reserve;**
- 2. Increase the budget of Capital Account CPX 01149, Park Land Acquisition in the amount of \$191,800; and**
- 3. Authorize the Mayor and Municipal Clerk to enter into Agreement of Purchase and Sale for the subject properties for the purpose of constructing a public boat launch at Lake Charlotte, Nova Scotia, as per the terms and Conditions of the report dated April 19, 2010, with funding as per the budget implications section of the April 19, 2010 section of the report; and**
- 4. Not release the April 19, 2010 Private and Confidential report until the transaction has been completed.**

Councillor Streach thanked HRM staff for their hard work on bringing this matter together. He commented that Lake Charlotte is one of the largest freshwater lakes within HRM's boundaries and will be well used by many residents. He further thanked the Province of Nova Scotia for assisting with funding, as well as, the three residents who have granted HRM access to a portion of their personal lands to access the Lake.
