

(Info: Under the proposal, the rebate to low income families would be increased considerably from its current amount. A revised rebate could function similarly to the GST Credit. The rebate amount would increase to \$1,000 per family (from \$750) plus \$100 for each child or equivalent dependent (to a maximum \$300). This rebate means that roughly 60% of low income individuals will pay less under tax reform.)
