MOVED by Councillor Karsten, seconded by Councillor Nicoll, that the Harbour East Community Council approve the proposed amendments to the Planning Districts 14 and 17 (Shubenacadie Lakes) Land Use By-law, as shown on attachment A of the June 2, 2009 staff report. MOTION PUT AND PASSED.

8.2 <u>Case 01155 - Amendments to Planning Districts 14 & 17 Land Use</u> <u>By-Law: Pet Care Facilities</u>

A report dated June 5, 2009, on the above noted was before Community Council.

Mr. Mitch Dickey, Planner, presented the report to Community Council.

Following clarification by members of Council, Councillor McCluskey called for those wishing to speak either in favour of or in opposition to the proposal.

Ms. Joanne Pullin, kennel owner advised she did not consider herself a kennel and advised she was no longer considered a kennel. She advised it is a wooded piece of land and there is no concern with her animals affecting the surrounding neighbourhood. Dogs are more social by being in these facilities. Contributes to a well behaved dog. She advised she does not believe a commercial area is a suitable area for a dog business.

Mr. Steve Gibbon, stated he has no problem with a facility with a lot of land surrounding it. There are a lot of R-6 properties that do not have buffering. He requested community Council turn this down. He stated many areas do not have enough land for a kennel.

Mr. Don Stewart, Holland Road, stated he would like to keep his dogs in the community when he goes on trips and feels this should be allowed so this facility could continue. There is a large are and lots of buffering.

Councillor McCluskey call three times for any additional speakers. Hearing none, the following motion was placed.

MOVED by Councillor Karsten, seconded by Councillor Barkhouse, that the public hearing close. MOTION PUT AND PASSED.

Councillor Smith expressed concern that changing lot size is not going to help anyone with concerns. Need to change separation distances. Increase distance from homes.

Following discussion on lot sizes, the following motion was placed.

MOVED by Deputy Mayor Hendsbee, seconded by Deputy Mayor Hendsbee, that the minimum lot size be 80 thousand square feet. MOTION PUT AND PASSED.

MOVED by Councillor Karsten, seconded by Councillor Nicoll that the Harbour East Community Council approve the proposed amendments to the Land Use Bylaw for Planning Districts 14 and 17 (Shubenacadie Lakes) as set out in Attachment A of the June 5, with the amendment that lot sizes be set at a minimum of 80 thousand square feet. MOTION PUT AND PASSED.

MOVED by Deputy Mayor Hendsbee, seconded by Councillor Streatch, that the Marine Drive, Valley and Canal Community Council approve the proposed amendments to the Land Use By-law for Planning Districts 14 and 17 (Shubenacadie Lakes) as set out in Attachment A of the June 5, with the amendment lot sizes be set at a minimum of 80 thousand square feet. MOTION PUT AND PASSED.

8.3 Case 01268- Signage - Downtown Dartmouth Land Use By-Law
