- 8.1 <u>Case 01272: Rezoning of 1568 Prospect Road, Hatchet Lake</u>
 (First Reading Given on September 22, 2009)
- A report dated August 21, 2009 was before the Community Council.

Mr. Luc Ouellet, Planner, presented the report.

Mr. Ouellet responded to questions of clarification from members of Community Council as follows:

- The land use designation for this particular area does allow more leeway than the Timberlea area in regard to rezoning. Future commercial development has been contemplated along the main road such as local services and/or a marine service use which would typically service a larger area than the immediate local area.
- The closest commercial property would be 200 metres from the proposed site; the lot immediately adjacent to the proposed site was currently vacant;
- Map 1 of the staff report indicates the area of notification. As required by the HRM Charter, notification was sent to each property owner, advertisements were placed in the local newspaper and a sign was placed on the property.
- During the public information meeting, only one person expressed concern with the proposed rezoning.

The Chair thanked staff for the presentation.

Councillor Adams explained the rules and procedures for public hearings then opened the public hearing calling for speakers for or against the proposal.

Ms. Jane Little (applicant), Hatchet Lake, advised that the fundamental purpose of the proposed commercial business was to sell boats (parts/storage) and camp supplies. She noted that many residents and suppliers expressed interest in that type of business being located along the Prospect Road. Ms. Little explained that she was a long time resident of the area and looked forward to many more years as a resident and business owner.

In response to Councillor Lund, Ms. Little advised that no waste would be created onsite.

Mr. Ouellet explained that provincial regulations would have to be followed in regard to any waste oil.

The Chair gave the third call for speakers, hearing none; it was MOVED BY Councillor Lund, seconded by Councillor Rankin that the public hearing be closed. MOTION PUT AND PASSED.

Mr. Ouellet confirmed for Councillor Rankin that boat storage on site was a permitted use.

MOVED BY Councillor Rankin, seconded by Councillor Lund that the Western Region Community Council approve the rezoning of 1568 Prospect Road from RB-1 (Residential B-1) to the C-2 (General Business) Zone. MOTION PUT AND PASSED.
