For more than thirty years I have been an honest ticket payer and I therefore feel deeply annoyed at the treatment and injustice I have received, and trust that the matter will be brought to the ears of the matter will be brought to the ears of the people and that wisdom may be given to them. It would be a simple matter to stop at yone who would be negligent in payment, but bonest people should not be made to suffer for those that have no sense or honesty. By adding the two overdrafts if is found that they aggregate \$5,894, on which the town is paying six per cent, interest, while the uncollected rates added together amount to \$4,708. In addition to this there is a sum of \$1,960 overdue on sewerage, instalments, which should be on deposit to the oredit of the sewerage sinking fund and earning interest for that purpose. From this it will be seen that the condition of affairs is largedly due to uncollected rates, and the committee, realizing that collections on this year's rates will be materially retarded, under the above circumstances would recommend more urgent measures than have herefore been

ces would recommend more urgent measures than have heretofore been practiced, as it is quite evident that letters issued by the town clerk have not had the desired effect.

The committee recommended that the services of the policemen be detailed for a fixed time each day for the express purpose, of making collection of water, sewerage and general taxes, subject to the instruction of the town clerk, or as the council may direct.
