They would also bring to the notice of the Council that two important services have been left unaccounted for, the sum asked by Commissioners of Poor Asylum being £1285, and your Committee have reduced in estimate £1000 the same as granted in 1855.

The Fire Department has applied for £200 to build a Tank in the vicinity of the House W. & S. Black's which has not been included in the Estimate.

The Commissioners of the Poor Asylum  
beg to present to His Worship the Mayor and the  
City Council the enclosed List of City Paupers  
admitted and discharged from the Asylum for  
the past Year ending the 30<sup>th</sup>. Nov. last with a  
Bill for the Maintenance of the same, amounting  
to £1461.4.6 Your Worship will also take notice  
that the list and account for the previous Year  
(amounting to £1255.13.0) was also handed. Your  
Worship upon which the Commissioners are —  
informed that one thousand pounds only was  
assessed the City and of which sum they have  
only received Five Hundred pounds as yet.

Your Worship will therefore see the necessity  
for assessing the City for such a sum as will  
cover those claims the expenses of the establishment  
having increased considerably the past two years  
in consequence of the great rise in provisions.

The Commissioners have also to remark that  
there are a large Number of Paupers in the House  
who have been residing in Halifax from 1 to  
40 Years but not having paid taxes come under  
the head of transient and are not included in  
the account against the City.

Six pounds fourteen shillings and nine pence of which appears to have been contracted during the summer of 1854 and which Your Committee think ought to have been settled by the Committee of that year before going out of office.

Your Committee will have remaining about £140.00 a sum sufficient to provide for a substantial repair of Common, and also the enclosing a triangular piece of Land West of the Pond near St. Andrews Croft, which your Committee believe will meet the approbation of the Council, and prove satisfactory to the citizens.

Your Committee have at their disposal Five Hundred loads of Compost deposited on the Common Two Hundred and fifty loads of which they propose to use in manuring that piece of land above mentioned which they intend sowing down with Oats, Clover and grass and the remaining 150 loads, they recommend to be used in top dressing a portion of the land already cultivated.

Your Committee beg to state to the Council that their efforts to further improve the Common will be utterly useless, unless the Ordinance passed in 1853, relative to the despatching of cattle Sheep &c on the Common and which expired in May 1853 are again enforced.
