referred the letter of Mr W^r Gordon dated 22 April
have attended to the duties assigned to them and
beg to Report as follows.

That on the 25th June 1855
advertisements were issued by the Council for plans
and Specification for the proposed City Hospital and
on the 15th day of August in that year, a Set of
Plans and a Specification was received by the Committee
from Mr Gordon and by that Committee referred to the
City Council that on the 24th day of August the City
Council passed the following resolution

Resolved that the plans and Specifi-
cations now before the Council relative to the erection
of a City Hospital be referred to a Committee who
shall be empowered to send for Practical persons to
ascertain about what amount the Hospital can
be built for under the Plans. The Gentleman who
proposed the Plans be requested to attend with the
object of shewing the difference of expense of the Building
being made like the New Market instead of being
wholly faced with Granite; and ascertaining if the
Plans are such as it will be advisable for the Council
to adopt that said Committee do Report to this
Council.

finished by the first of December 1858, by this means
the Parties contracting will have the winter to
prepare their materials for the completion thereof,
